**Chapter 1 Introduction**

## Chapter 1 Introduction

E-ASR is used to collect answers to pre-designed questionnaires. These answers are then merged with a report template and a standard report is generated. The merging process allows the user to insert different responses and paragraphs into the report depending upon how a question is answered.

The program comes with questionnaires and report templates for the following:

- ASTM E1527-21 Phase I Environmental Site Assessment
- ASTM E1902-19 Phase II Environmental Site Assessment

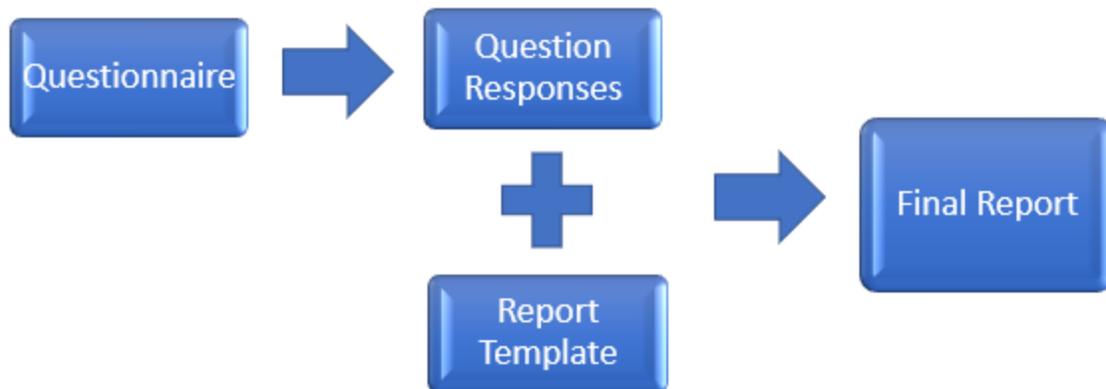
## 1.1 Features

Some of the features of E-ASR are:

- Reports can be generated to follow any standard, including ASTM and CSA.
- Reports can be used for Phase I ESAs, Phase II ESAs, Environmental Compliance, Transaction Screening, etc.
- In addition to your answers to the questionnaire, photos (ex. site, aerial, historic) and third-party reports (ex. EDR, EPA, NPRI) can also be integrated into the final report.
- The data can be collected on a tabloids, laptops, or desktops.
- A blank paper form to collect the data for a questionnaire can be created with the press of a button.
- The answers to questions are tracked, and a list of unanswered questions can be displayed at any time.
- Report templates are created and edited in Microsoft Word.
- There can be an unlimited number of questionnaires.
- Questionnaires can contain an unlimited number of questions.
- Questions can contain sub-questions and be branched based upon the answer to the question.
- The program comes with numerous predefined question types and additional custom question types can be created.
- Text macros can be created and used to rapidly enter common text answers; such as, asbestos materials, drainage, site descriptions, storage tank contents, etc.
- Merged report can be immediately opened in Word.
- Microsoft Access database management system.
- Master project database tracks projects over a network.
- Supports either stand-alone or network licensing.
- Users are assigned a username, password, and privilege level.
- Different privilege levels allow for control of who can edit questionnaires.
- Questionnaires, macros, and projects can be imported from Pocket ESA.

## 1.2 Methodology and Data Flow

E-ASR has been designed to minimize the amount of time required to generate a standard report and to maximize the flexibility of the final report. To accomplish this, the process has been divided into four steps. The first two steps only need to be performed once for each type of questionnaire and report. The last two steps are performed for each report.



### 1 Create a Report Template

The first step is to create a report template using Microsoft Word. This template is later merged with the specific responses to create a final report. The template is a generic form of the final report and contains keywords where the specific responses to the questionnaire are to be merged into the report. These keywords are highlighted in the report template using a unique style created for the E-ASR+ program.

The responses to be merged into the report are not necessarily the direct answers to the questions, but are the text responses associated with the answer. For example, if the answer to the question “Are there any ACMs suspected?” is “No” the text merged into the final report is not necessarily “No” but could be a paragraph of text that has been associated with this answer; such as, “There are no asbestos containing materials suspected on the subject property.” These associations are defined as part of the questionnaire and are entered during the creation of the questionnaire.

### 2 Create a Questionnaire

The next step is to create a questionnaire that is used to collect the response data for a report. Typically, the questionnaire will adhere to a national standard such as the CSA or ASTM standards. However, abbreviated questionnaires may be created and used in some situations.

Questionnaires are divided into sections and subsections which can contain any number of questions. For every question a question type is selected. The question type determines the format of the question and allowable answers that are used to collect the data. There are numerous question types that can be selected and additional question types can be created. After the question type has been selected and the question entered, the text associated with each allowable answer is entered. This is the text that will actually be merged into the final report.

When the questionnaire is created it is associated with a report template that is used to create the merged report. Each question is associated with a keyword from the report template. These keywords are used as placeholders in the final report for the text associated with the question response. Depending upon the length of the report and number of questions, these first two steps can be very labor intensive. But after they have been completed, the resulting questionnaires can be used to generate thousands of reports.

### **3 Enter Questionnaire Responses**

After the questionnaire has been created, it can be used to collect the responses for a report. The response data is collected by answering each of the questions in the questionnaire. The form used and allowable answers for the question are specified when the questionnaire is created. All of the data is automatically saved as it is entered. After the data has been collected it is merged with the report template to create a final report. Prior to merging the data with the report template, the answers can be modified and edited.

### **4 Merge Questionnaire Responses with the Report Template**

The final step is to create a report by merging the questionnaire responses with the report template. During the merging process the keywords in the report template are replaced by the text associated with each of the answers to the questions. After the survey data has been merged a final report will be created in Microsoft Word format. This report can then be edited in Word to include additional information.

## 1.3 Installation

To get E-ASR up and running, the program first needs to be installed on your computer. The program can be downloaded from GAEA's website. There are two types of installation, single user and network user. The installation section below will explain how to perform both types of installations.

### 1.3.1 Single User Installation

#### Installation

**When installing the program you must be logged in as an administrator.**

The following steps occur during the installation:

- The application is installed on your computer
- Files for the databases and data store are copied to your computer
- Shortcuts are placed on your Start menu and desktop

After the application has been installed, there are a few more steps before it is ready for use. The datastore needs to be setup, a default basemap selected, and example projects can be imported. All these steps are accomplished by running E-ASR for the first time. The program can be started using the icon on your desktop or the E-ASR application menu on the Start menu.

#### First-Run and Program Setup

**The first time that the program is run you must be logged in as an administrator so that the directories can be created.**

When the program is started for the first time a setup wizard will run that guides you through the steps below.

1. Selection of a single user or network user installation.
2. Select the industry that you will be using to register the software. The price, features, and settings in the application will change depending on the industry selected.
3. After the above information is specified the databases and data store will be setup.
4. The next step is to specify a default basemap for the application.
5. And the last step is to import any demo projects to help learn the application faster.

After the above steps are completed, the application will start initially in demo mode. You can use the application in demo mode for up to 20 times before you need to [register](#) it.

#### Directory Permissions

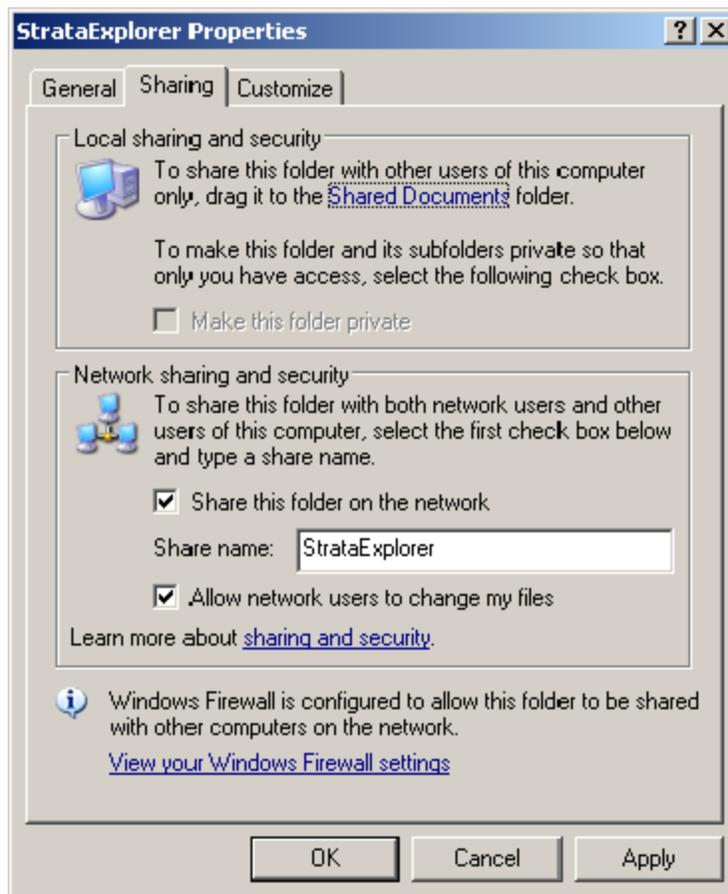
The data for the application is stored in the database and data store directories. The location of these directories will depend on the operating system and is defaulted to the common application data directory. **All of the users must have full read and write access to these directories. When possible the installation program will try to set the permissions of these directories properly.**

For administrative users this will not be a problem; however, limited users may need to be given permission to read and write to these directories. The location and method of setting the permissions will vary with the type of Windows operating system as described below.

#### Windows XP Home

The default directory where the database and datastore directories are located for Windows XP is "c:\Documents and Settings\All Users\Application Data\AutoReporting2". Typically non-administrative (limited) users may only have read access to this directory. To change the permissions on this directory to grant limited users full control follow the steps below.

1. Log in as an administrator
2. In Windows Explorer browse to the directory "c:\Documents and Settings\All Users\Application Data" and highlight the folder "AutoReporting2".
3. Right click on the AutoReporting2 folder and select "Sharing and Security" from the popup menu, the form below will be displayed.
4. On the Sharing tab check the boxes for "Share this folder on the network" and "Allow network users to change my files".

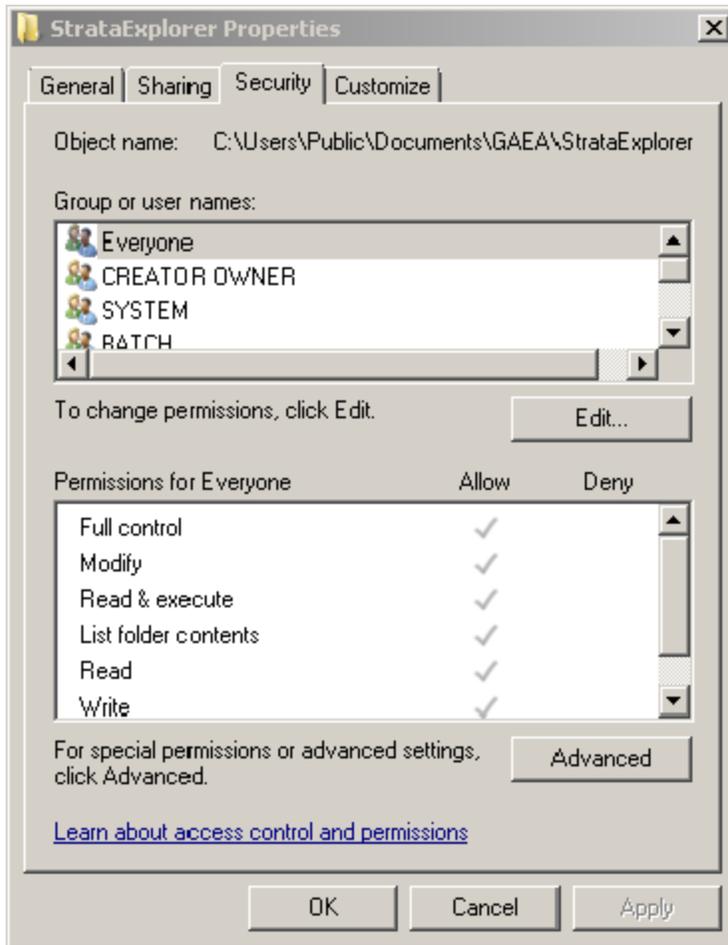


### Windows Vista and XP Professional

The default location for the database and data store files in Windows Vista is "c:\Users\Public\Application Data\AutoReporting2". Typically non-administrative (limited) users only have read access to this directory. To change the permissions on this directory to grant limited users full control follow the steps below.

1. Log in as an administrator

2. In Windows Explorer browse to the directory "c:\Users\Public\Application Data" and highlight the folder "AutoReporting2".
3. Right click on the AutoReporting2 folder and select "Properties" from the popup menu, the form below will be displayed.
4. On the Security tab make sure that the group "Everyone" has "Full Control" permissions.



### Windows 8 and above

The default location for the database and data store files is "c:\ProgramData\GAEA\AutoReporting2". Typically non-administrative (limited) users may only have read access to this directory. To change the permissions on this directory to grant limited users full control follow the steps below.

5. Log in as an administrator
6. In Windows Explorer browse to the directory "c:\ProgramData" and highlight the folder "AutoReporting2".
7. Right click on the AutoReporting2 folder and select "Properties" from the popup menu, the form below will be displayed.
8. On the Security tab make sure that the group "Everyone" has "Full Control" permissions.

### 1.3.2 Network Installation

The installation of the network version of the application on the server and client computers is described in the section [Network License Management](#)<sup>[214]</sup>.

## 1.4 Registration

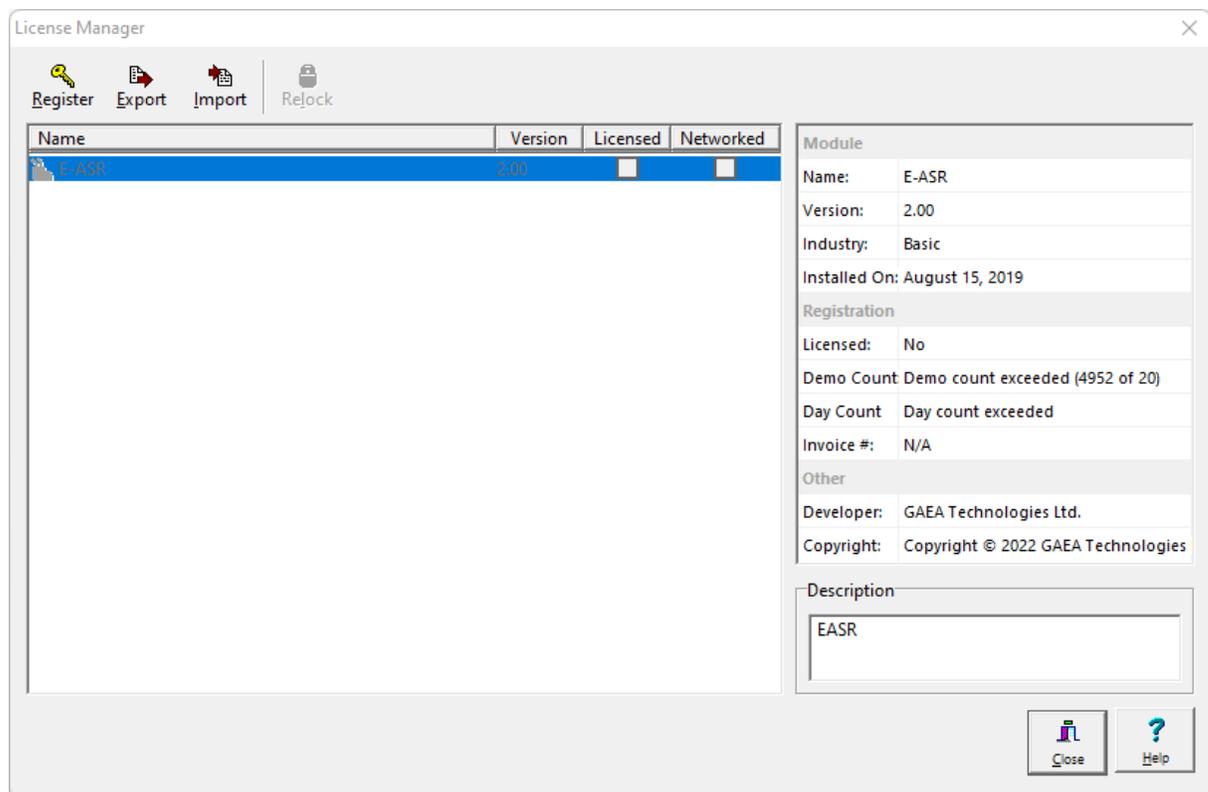
E-ASR can be licensed on individual computers, a network, or a combination of both. When licensed on a network the licensing is based on concurrent usage, where the number of concurrent users must be less than or equal to the maximum number of users licensed. When the application it will run in demo mode until it is licensed.

The method for licensing will depend upon whether it is a single user or network installation. The registration sections below discuss how to license E-ASR and how to transfer the registration if necessary.

### 1.4.1 Single User Registration

To license E-ASR, a registration code must be entered. The registration code is based on the serial number. This serial number is unique for each computer.

The serial number can be obtained by running the program and selecting the [Tools > Manage Licenses](#). The License Manager form will be displayed with a table that shows the current licensing. To get detailed information click on the program in the table. The detailed information will be displayed to the right.



#### 1.4.1.1 Manual Entry of Registration Codes

To manually obtain the serial number and enter the registration code for E-ASR, select it in the License Manager table and then click on the Register button on the toolbar at the top of the Manage Licenses form. The Register form will then be displayed showing the unique serial number of the module.

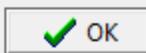

To obtain the registration code enter the invoice number you received when purchasing the software and contact GAEA with the unique serial number. GAEA can be contacted either by clicking on the Obtain Registration button or by emailing us at [codes@gaeatech.com](mailto:codes@gaeatech.com). When the Obtain Registration button is used an email form will be displayed where you can enter your contact information and email it directly to GAEA.

After you receive the registration code from GAEA you can enter it on the Register form and then save it by clicking on the Store Code button.

#### 1.4.1.2 File Entry of Registration Codes

The serial number can be exported to a file and emailed to GAEA. After the file has been processed a registration file will be emailed back from GAEA. This registration file can then be imported and the registration code saved. To export the serial number file, select E-ASR on the License Manager form and then click on the Export button on the toolbar of the form. The Export Serial Number form will be displayed where you can enter the invoice number and your contact details. After you enter the information you can either email the file directly to GAEA by clicking on the Email button or save it to your disk and email it yourself by clicking on the Save button.

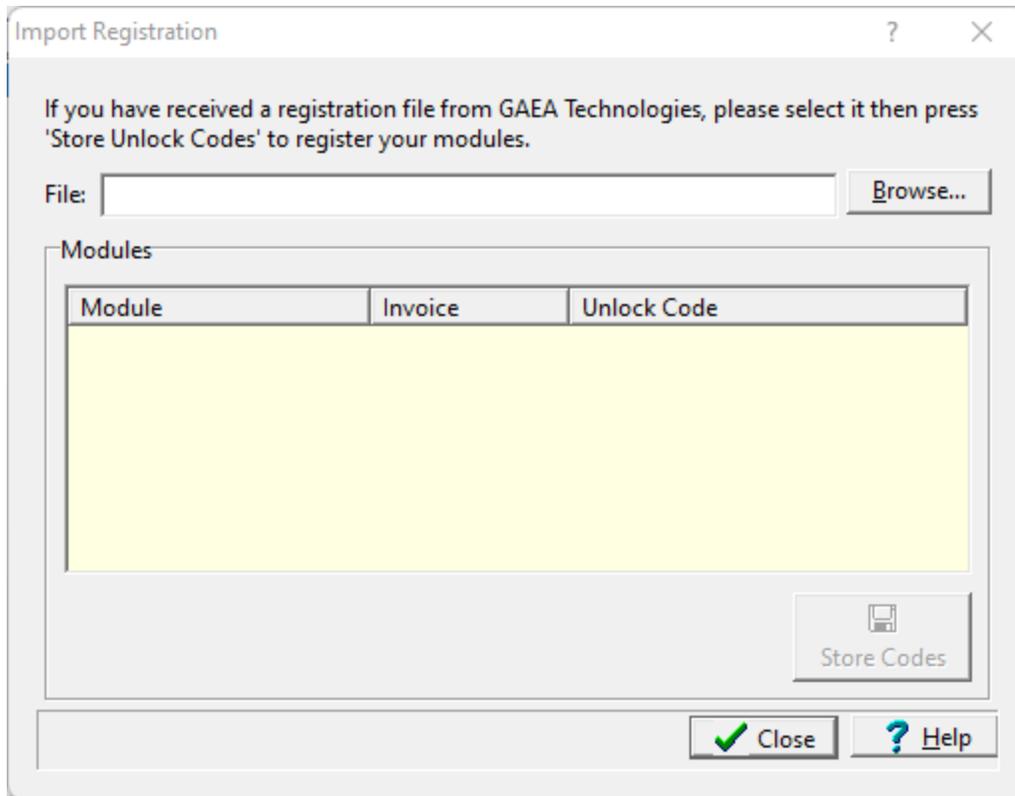

After the file has been received and processed by GAEA you will receive a registration file back by email. When you receive this file save it to your hard drive. To import the file click on the Import button on the License Manager form and the Import Registration Code form will be displayed. Select the file you saved using the Open button on the form and the registration codes will be imported and saved by the program.



## 1.4.2 Network Registration

Prior to using the application on the client computers, the application should be registered on the server. The registration on the server is handled through the Network Monitor program and is described in the section on [Using the Network License Manager](#)<sup>217</sup>.

## 1.4.3 Transferring the Registration

If you need to transfer the license for a single user installation from one computer to another, follow the steps below.

### On the licensed computer

- select the Manage Licenses menu item from the Tools menu
- select the module that you wish to transfer the license on the License Manager form
- either click on the Relock button on the toolbar at the top of the form or select Relock from the popup menu

In order to transfer the registration of the E-ASR module to a different computer, you must first relock it. Relocking a module reverts it to an unregistered state.

This process generates a relock code that you need to send to GAEA Technologies to confirm your eligibility for a new unlock code.

## 1.5 Using the Application

### Login

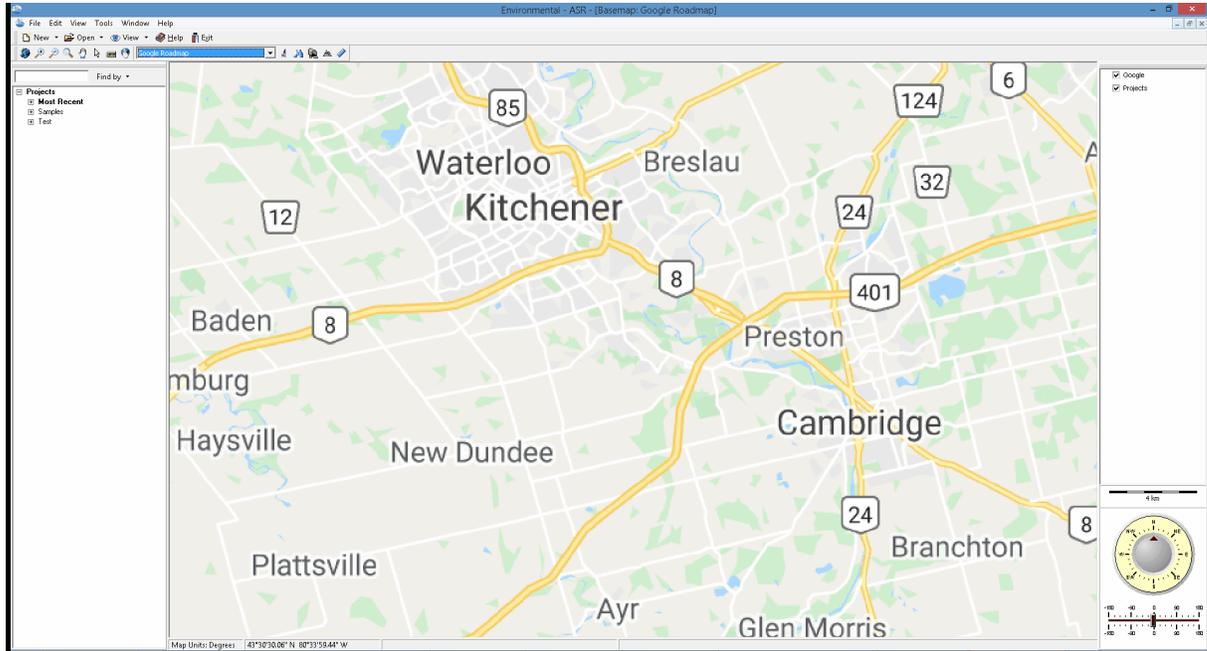
All users must login to the application. When users are setup in the application they are assigned a username, password, and user type (privilege). Different privilege levels are used to control access to functions of the program and data. The different user types are administrator, power user, limited user, and guest. For more information on setting up users see [User Administration](#)<sup>[223]</sup>.



To have the application remember your user name and password, check remember credentials. The next time the application is started you will not need to enter your login credentials. If you are using the network to login, the Network Settings button can be used to change the network properties.

### Initial Display

The initial display will consist of a Geographical Information System (GIS) or a list of projects depending on your settings in Preferences. The GIS shows your existing projects and any GIS data. To the left of the GIS the sidebar usually shows a list of your projects. And to the right of the GIS the sidebar usually shows a list of layers, scale, and an index map. At the top of the display there are also toolbars and menus for controlling and using the program. These are described briefly below and in detail in the chapters throughout this manual.



## Menus

The main menu appears at the top of the screen and is composed of several submenus for Files, Tools, and Help. Depending upon what is open at the time, an Edit submenu may also be present. The File submenu is used to create, open, and delete projects, questionnaires, and report templates; import and export data; and set program preferences. Several types of tools are included in the Tools submenu for the geodatabase, projects, macors, question types, and managing the program licenses.

In this User's Guide menu items and paths have been abbreviated to make it easier to understand. All menu items are shown in *blue italics* and start with the uppermost menu then an arrow to the next menu or menu item. For example, the Project menu item of the Open submenu of the File menu is abbreviated as *File > Open > Project*.

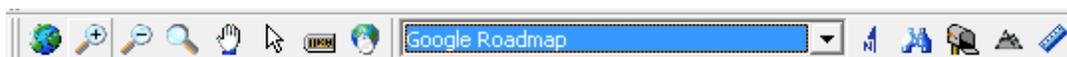
A popup menu can also be displayed by clicking the right mouse button, the menu items in the popup menu will vary depending on what is being displayed and where on the screen the mouse is clicked. In this manual menu items that can be obtained from the popup menu are shown as *Popup > menu item*.

## Toolbars

Initially two toolbars will be displayed, a Main toolbar and a GIS toolbar.



The Main toolbar is used to create, open, and close projects, questionnaires, and report templates. If a project is open you can also create and open report responses and reports. In addition it can be used to display different views, the help guide and exit the program.



The GIS toolbar is used to access various features and functionality of the GIS. This toolbar is described in the [GIS section](#)<sup>[27]</sup>.

## Sidebars

The sidebars can be on the left, right, or both sides and contain the contents described below.

## Projects

The projects region has a Find Project toolbar and a list of projects. You can locate a project in the list using the Find toolbar by entering the project name and pressing the Find button. The project will then be highlighted in the project list and be zoomed to in the GIS. You can also zoom to a project in the project list by selecting the *Popup > Locate* after the project has been highlighted in the list.

To open a project using the Project List, highlight the project and then select *Popup > Open* or double-click on it in the sidebar. If no project is selected, the Open Project form will be displayed. This form lists the projects and lets you select one to open.

For a detailed description of how to create and use projects see the section below and [Chapter 3](#)<sup>[117]</sup>.

## Layers

The layers region lists the layers in the GIS. These layers can be turned on and off by checking and unchecking the box beside the layer. The order of the layers in the sidebar controls the order in which they are displayed in the GIS, with the layers at the top being drawn on the layers at the bottom.

## Scale Bar

The scale bar displays the current scale of the GIS or project shown in the GIS window.

## North Direction

The compass on the bottom right shows the current direction for North. When the application is started this is at the top of the screen. To change the direction slide the bar to the left or right below the compass. Sliding to the left will rotate the GIS windows to the West, sliding to the right will rotate to the East. Double-click on the slider to adjust the display so that North is at the top of the screen again.

## 1.5.1 Geographic Information System

The Geographical Information System (GIS) is used to organize, find, and select projects. The application can also be used with no GIS, in this case a list of projects is displayed instead. When the GIS is being displayed it obtains its geographical data from a Web Map Service.

The display of the GIS and default Web Map Service is specified in the [Preferences](#)<sup>[47]</sup>.

### 1.5.1.1 Web Map Services

Web map services use a standard protocol to serve georeferenced map images over the Internet. This protocol was developed and published by the Open Geospatial Consortium. Several web map services are available within the application and more are being added with each update.

#### 1.5.1.1.1 Selecting Web Map Services

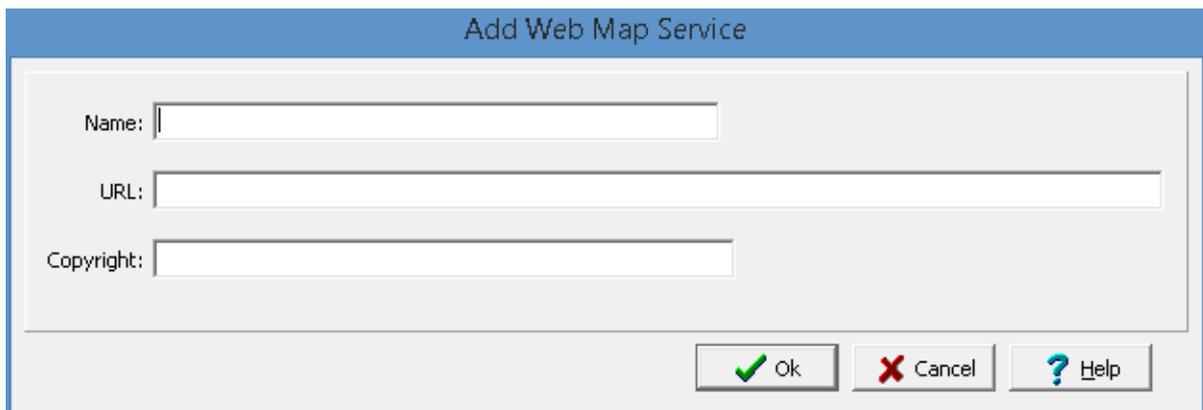


The web map service displayed for the GIS can either be selected from the GIS toolbar or in [File > Preferences](#). If it is selected in Preferences it will be the default web map service and will be shown every time the application is started. When it is selected from the GIS toolbar it will be effective only until it is changed again or the application is closed. New web map services are being added all the time. If you would like to have a web map service added that is not in the list please contact us.

Before displaying the web map service the application checks to see if there is an Internet connection. If there is no connection a list of projects will be displayed.

#### 1.5.1.1.2 Adding a Web Map Service

Additional custom web map services (WMS) can be added to the application by selecting [Tools > GIS > Add Web Map Service](#). The form below will then be displayed. A custom web map service can be used to add user subscribed services such as First Base Solutions ( a Canadian based service for high resolution orthoimagery).

The following information can be specified on this form:

**Name:** This is the name of the custom WMS. It will be displayed when selecting a WMS from the GIS toolbar.

**URL:** This is the URL for the custom WMS. The URL is usually specified by the service provider.

**Copyright:** This the copyright for the custom WMS. It will be displayed on the status bar at the bottom of the screen.

### 1.5.1.2 Using the GIS

The display of the GIS can be controlled using the GIS toolbar and compass control as described in the sections below. The use of the GIS to create and locate projects is described in the Chapter 3.

#### 1.5.1.2.1 GIS Toolbar



The GIS toolbar can be used to adjust the basemap display; find, identify and select features. The controls on this toolbar depend on whether the basemap is a static basemap or web map service.

#### Full Extent



The Full Extent button will display the full extent of the GIS or project

#### Zoom In



The Zoom In button is used to zoom in to a smaller scale on the GIS.

#### Zoom-out



The Zoom Out button is used to zoom out to a larger scale on the GIS.

#### Dynamic Zoom



The Dynamic Zoom button can be used to zoom in and out using the mouse.

#### To zoom in

1. Click on the View/Zoom mode menu item.
2. Within the Map area choose a rectangular area to which you would like to zoom in.
3. Move the mouse pointer to the top left corner of the area and press the left mouse button.
4. Move the mouse pointer to the bottom right corner of the area and release the left mouse button.

#### To zoom out

1. Click on the View/Zoom mode menu item.
2. Within the Map area decide how large should be the area containing the currently visible extent and wh

3. Move the mouse pointer to the bottom right corner of this area and press the left mouse button.
4. Move the mouse pointer to the top left corner of this area and release the left mouse button.

### Drag



The Drag button is used to move the visible area on the screen. To move the visible area click on the screen and while holding the mouse button down move the cursor in the desired direction to see that area displayed.

### Select Feature



The Select Feature button can be used to select a feature on the map. To select a feature click on the button and then click on the feature on the map. The attributes of the selected feature will then be displayed as shown below.

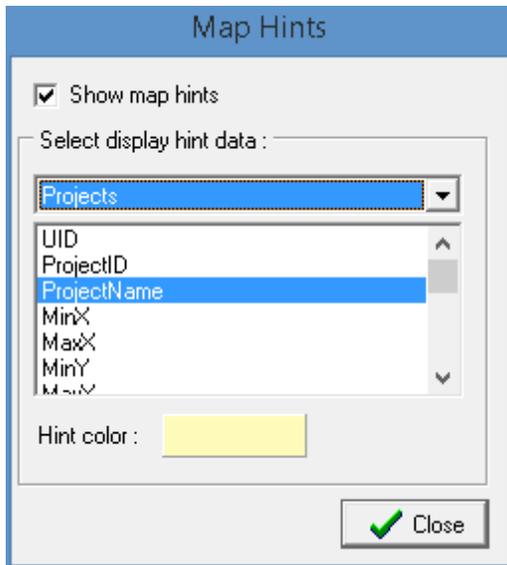

### Display Hints



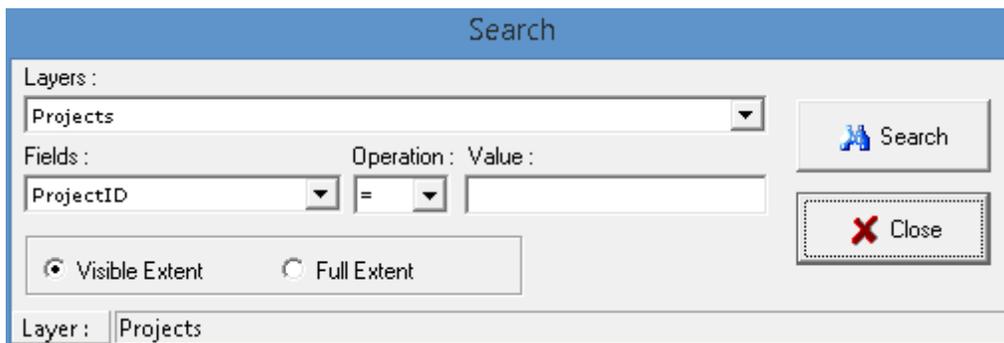
The Display Hints button can be used to select the layer and field used for hints. These hints can optionally be displayed when the mouse is over a feature on the map. For example, when the mouse is over a project the hint could display the project name. When the button is pressed the Map Hint Properties form below will be displayed. This form can be used to specify whether hints are shown, the hint color, layer and field to use for the hint.



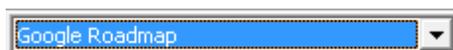
## Search



The Search button can be used to search for features on the map that meet a specified criteria. When this button is pressed the Search form below will be displayed. This form can be used to specify the layer, field, and search criteria. When the Search button on this form is pressed any features that meet this criteria will be momentarily highlighted.



## Web Map Service



This drop down list can be used to select the current web map service being displayed.

## North Arrow



The North arrow on the GIS can be turned on and off using the North Arrow button. The color of this arrow is specified in [Preferences](#) <sup>47</sup>.

### Find Address



Addresses can be located on the GIS by clicking on the Find Address button. The form below will be displayed and can be used to find addresses by street address, latitude and longitude, or UTM coordinated.

### Find Address at a Point



The address of a point on the GIS can be displayed using the find address at a point button. After this button is clicked, click on the point on the GIS and the address will be displayed.

### Find Elevation at a Point



The elevation of a point on the GIS can be displayed using the find elevation at a point button. After this button is clicked, click on the point on the GIS and the elevation will be displayed.

### Measure Distance



Distances can be measured on the GIS using the Measure tool on the GIS toolbar. When this tool is selected the Ruler control below will be displayed. The distance units can be set using the drop down list on the right. To measure a distance click on the first point and then click on the second. To hide the Ruler control click on the Measure tool again.

### Street View



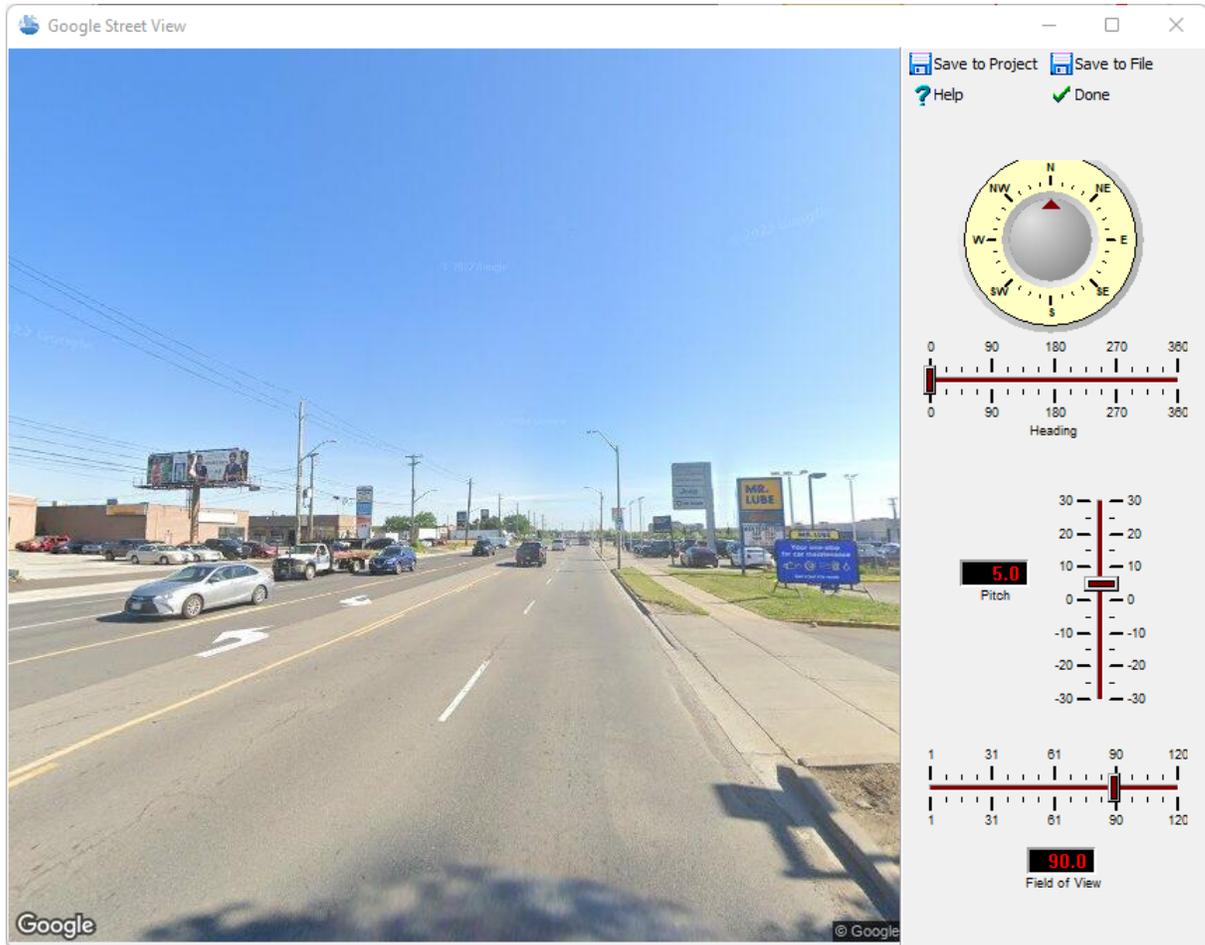
A street view for a point on the GIS can be obtained by clicking on the down arrow of the Street View button and selected either Google or Bing. Then click on the point on the map to display the street view in the Street View form. Additional street views can be displayed by closing the form and clicking on other points on the map. The street view form for Google and Bing are explained in the sections below.

### Save Image



This is used to save the map image either to the project or to a file. When saving to the project, the document name and version are specified. The images in a project can later be used in project views. When saving to a file the file name is specified.

The street view form for Google is shown below. The Google street view image is 640 x 640 pixels.



The following can be specified on this form:

**Heading:** This is the heading from North of the image. When the heading is changed the image will be refreshed.

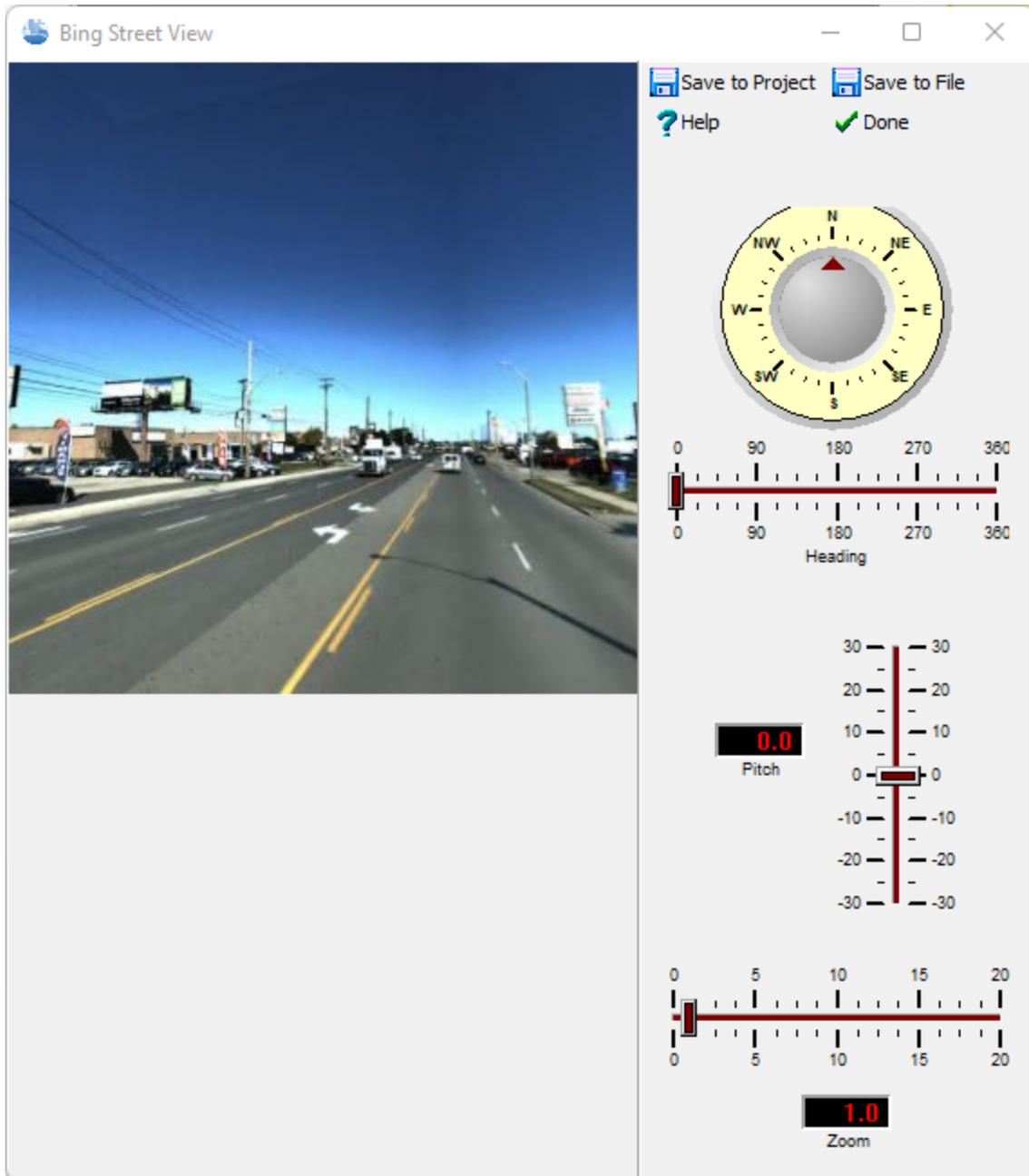
**Pitch:** This is the vertical pitch on the image. Positive values are up and negative values are down. When the pitch is changed the image will be refreshed.

**Field of View:** This is the field of view of the image, similar to the zoom. When the field of view is changed the image will be refreshed.

**Save to Project:** This is used to save the image in the project. This option is only available when a project is opened. When this button is clicked on the name of the Document (Image) and Version can be specified. The images in a project can be later used in project views.

**Save to File:** This is used to save the image to a JPEG file. When this button is clicked the file name can be specified.

The street view form for Bing is shown. The Bing street view is 350 x 350 pixels.



The following can be specified on this form:

**Heading:** This is the heading from North of the image. When the heading is changed the image will be refreshed.

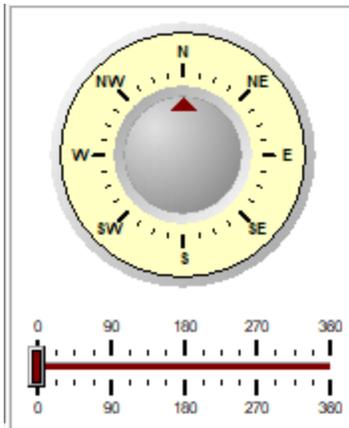
**Pitch:** This is the vertical pitch on the image. Positive values are up and negative values are down. When the pitch is changed the image will be refreshed.

**Zoom:** This is the zoom of the image. When the zoom is changed the image will be refreshed.

**Save to Project:** This is used to save the image in the project. This option is only available when a project is opened. When this button is clicked on the name of the Document (Image) and Version can be specified. The images in a project can be later used in project views.

**Save to File:** This is used to save the image to a JPEG file. When this button is clicked the file name can be specified.

#### 1.5.1.2.2 Compass Control



The compass on the bottom right shows the current direction for North. When the application is started this is at the top of the screen. To change the direction (heading) slide the bar to the left or right below the compass.

#### 1.5.1.3 Spatial Queries

Spatial queries can be used to find projects that meet specified criteria.

##### 1.5.1.3.1 Querying Projects

Spatial queries can be used to select projects based on their location and other selection parameters. To spatially query projects, select [Tools > GIS > Spatial Queries > Projects](#). The Query Area form below will be displayed.

This form is used to specify whether the query will be based on a Selected Region or the Full Extent of the map.

If the query is based on a Selected Region, the region needs to be selected after the Ok button is pressed. To select the region, click the mouse button at one corner of the region and then move the mouse to the opposite region while holding down the button. After the region has been specified or the Full Extent selected the Query Projects form will be displayed.

This form is used to specify the selection queries to be used to select the projects. More than one query can be used for the query, the queries to be used are shown on the left side of the form. For a project to be selected it must meet all of the queries.

To select additional queries use the Select Query combobox on the form. These queries can be based on areal extent, client ID, client, project name, project ID, date created, or status. When an additional query is selected, the parameters for the query can be specified beneath the combobox. After the parameters of the query have been specified the query can be added to the list by pressing the Add Query button. After a query has been added to the list it can be removed by selecting it on the list and pressing the Remove Query button.

To conduct the query, press the Perform Query button at the top of the form. The results of the query will be display on a Results tab. This tab will list the projects that meet the query.

A project from the list can be opened by selecting and then pressing the Open button. In addition, the list can be exported to an Excel file by pressing the Export button.

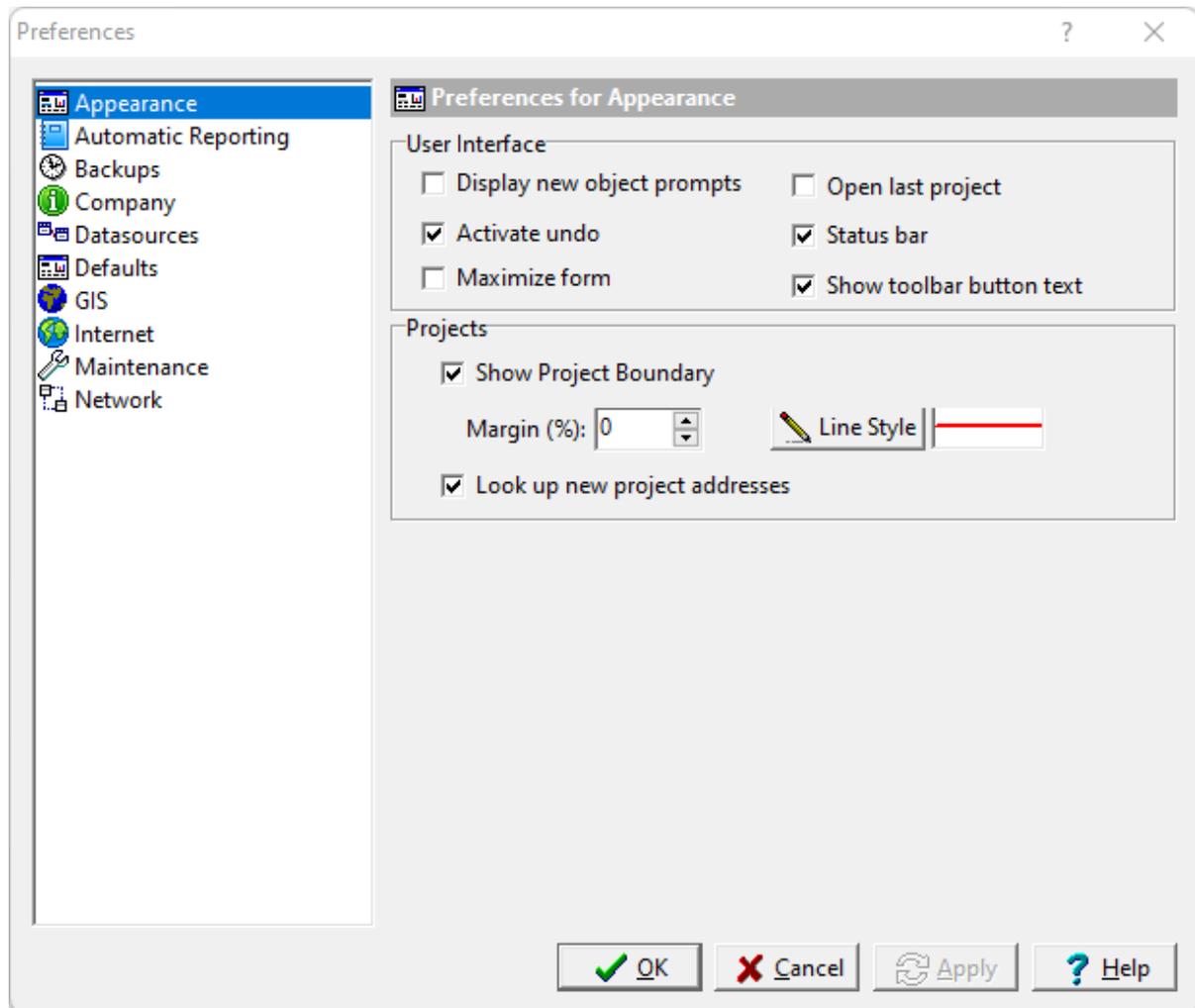

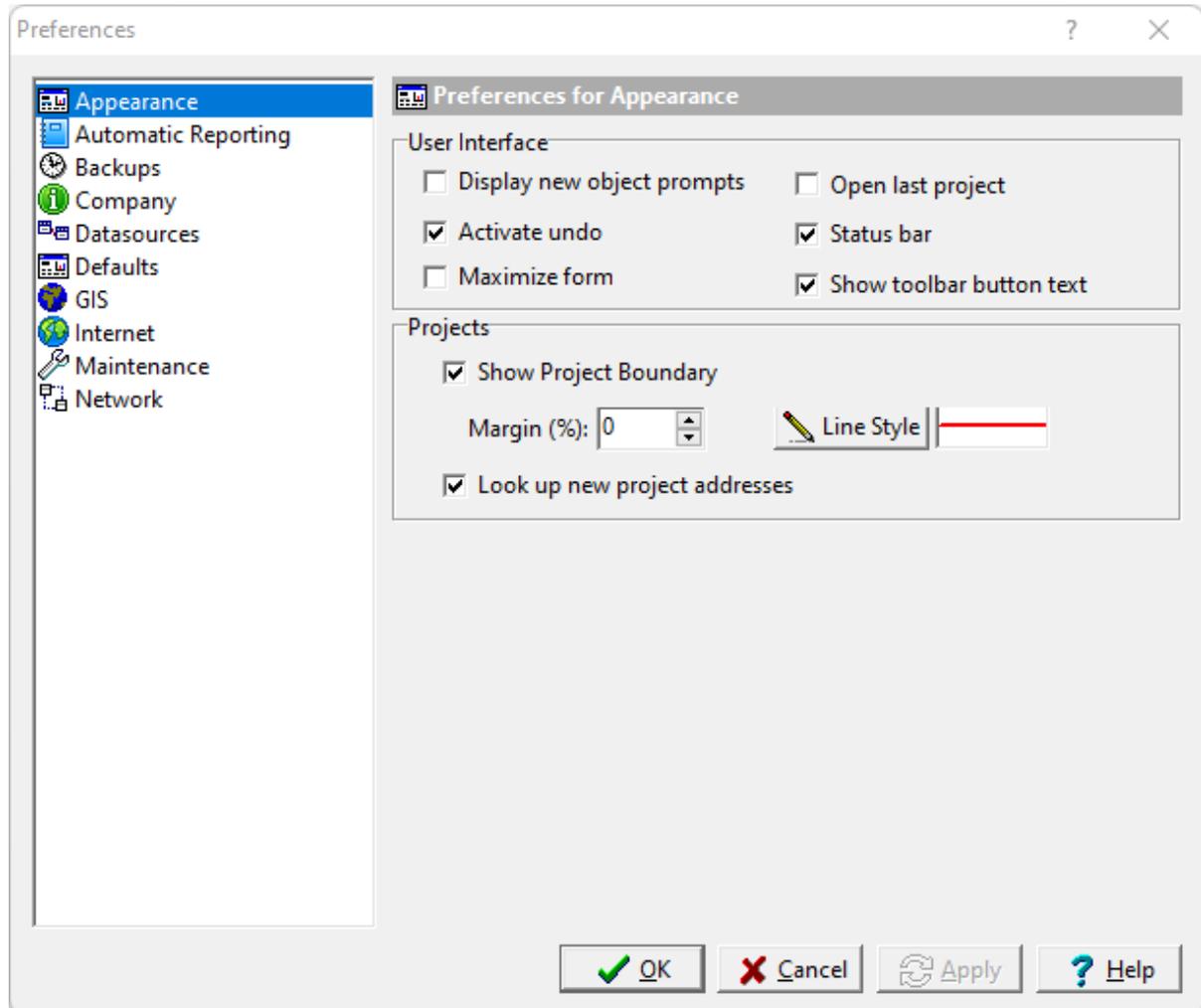

## 1.6 Preferences

To set the program preferences no project can be open. Select *File > Preferences*. The Preferences form will be displayed. This form has a list of preference categories on the left side and the details of the selected category are displayed on the right. Each of the categories are described in the sections below.



## 1.6.1 Appearances



The following can be edited in the Appearances category:

### User Interface

**Display new object prompts:** Check this box to display prompts for new objects.

**Open last project:** Check this box to open the last opened project when the program is started.

**Activate undo:** Check this box to activate the undo feature so that some operations can be undone.

**Status bar:** Check this box to display a status bar on the main form.

**Maximize form:** Check this box to maximize some forms when they are displayed.

**Show toolbar button text:** Check this to show the text on buttons.

### Projects

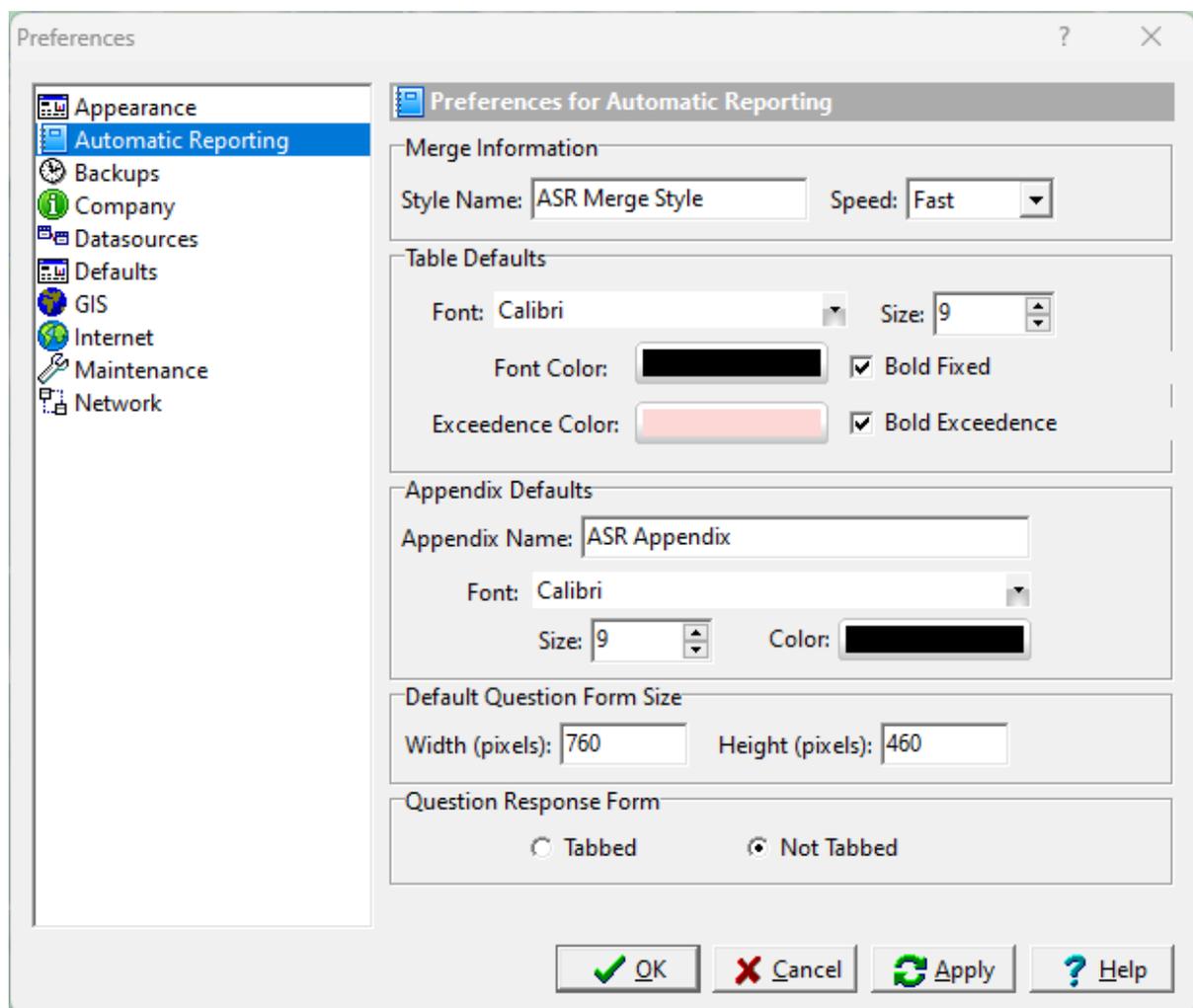
**Show Project Boundary:** Check this box to show the project boundary when a project is opened.

**Margin:** This is used to specify the margin between the project display and the project boundary as a percentage of the display width. The larger the margin the larger the area outside of the project boundary will be displayed.

**Line Style:** Click this button to change the line style, width, and color of the boundary line.

**Look up new project addresses:** Check this box to look up the project address when a new project is created using the GIS.

## 1.6.2 Automated Reporting



The following can be edited in the Automated Reporting category:

### Merge Information

**Style Name:** This is the name of the style in Word to use for the merging process.

**Speed:** This is used to select the speed of the merge from fast to slow. Merging uses the Windows clipboard and if done too fast may miss some substitutions. If a fast merge misses some substitutions try setting it to average or slow.

### Table Defaults

**Font:** This is the font name to use for text in tables.

**Font Size:** This the font size to use for text in tables.

**Font Color:** This the font color to use for text in tables.

**Bold Fixed:** Check this to use bold fonts in fixed rows and columns in the tables.

**Exceedence Color:** This the color to use for the background of cells with exceedences. The exceedence is determined by setting a [criteria column or row in the table definition](#)<sup>[89]</sup> of the question form.

**Bold Exceedence:** Check this to use bold fonts for exceedences.

### Appendix Defaults

**Appendix Name:** This is the keyword name for the questionnaire appendix in the report template. If this keyword is found in the report template the questionnaire results (without merging) will be inserted.

**Font:** This is the font name to use for text in the questionnaire output.

**Font Size:** This the font size to use for text in the questionnaire output.

**Font Color:** This the font color to use for text in the questionnaire output.

### Default Question Form Size

**Width:** This is the default width for the question forms.

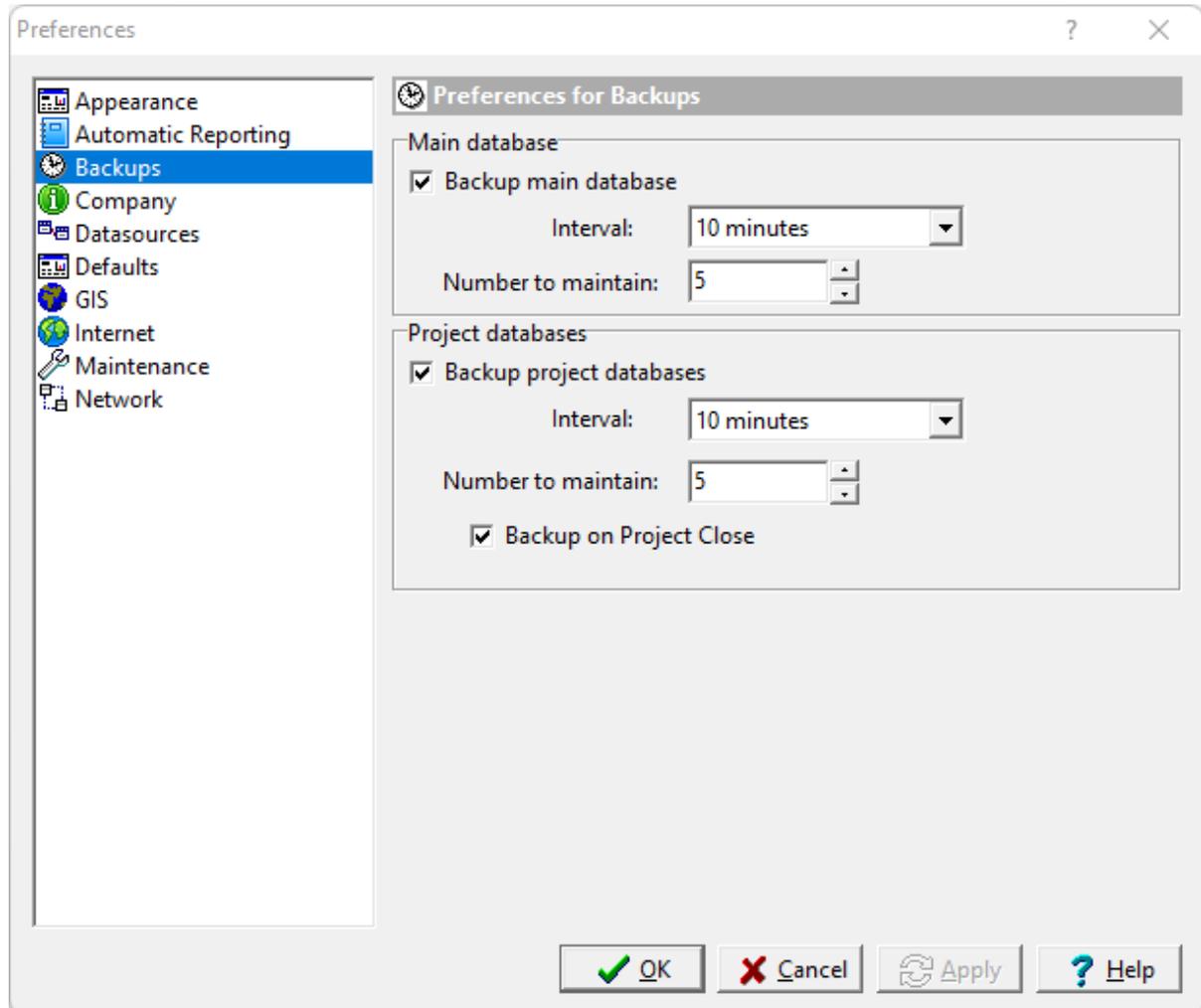
**Height:** This is the default height for the question forms.

### Question Response Form

**Tabbed:** Check this to show the [Question Response form](#)<sup>[188]</sup> with two tabs, one for the response and one for the report preview.

**Not Tabbed:** Check this to show the Question Response form with the response on the left and the report preview on the right.

## 1.6.3 Backups



The following can be edited in the Backups category:

### Main Database

**Back Up:** If this checkbox is checked then the main databases will be backed up at regular intervals. If this checkbox is not selected then the main databases will not be backed up.

**Interval:** This is used to select the interval to use when backing up the main databases.

**Number to maintain:** This is the number of backups to maintain, older backups will be deleted.

### Project Databases

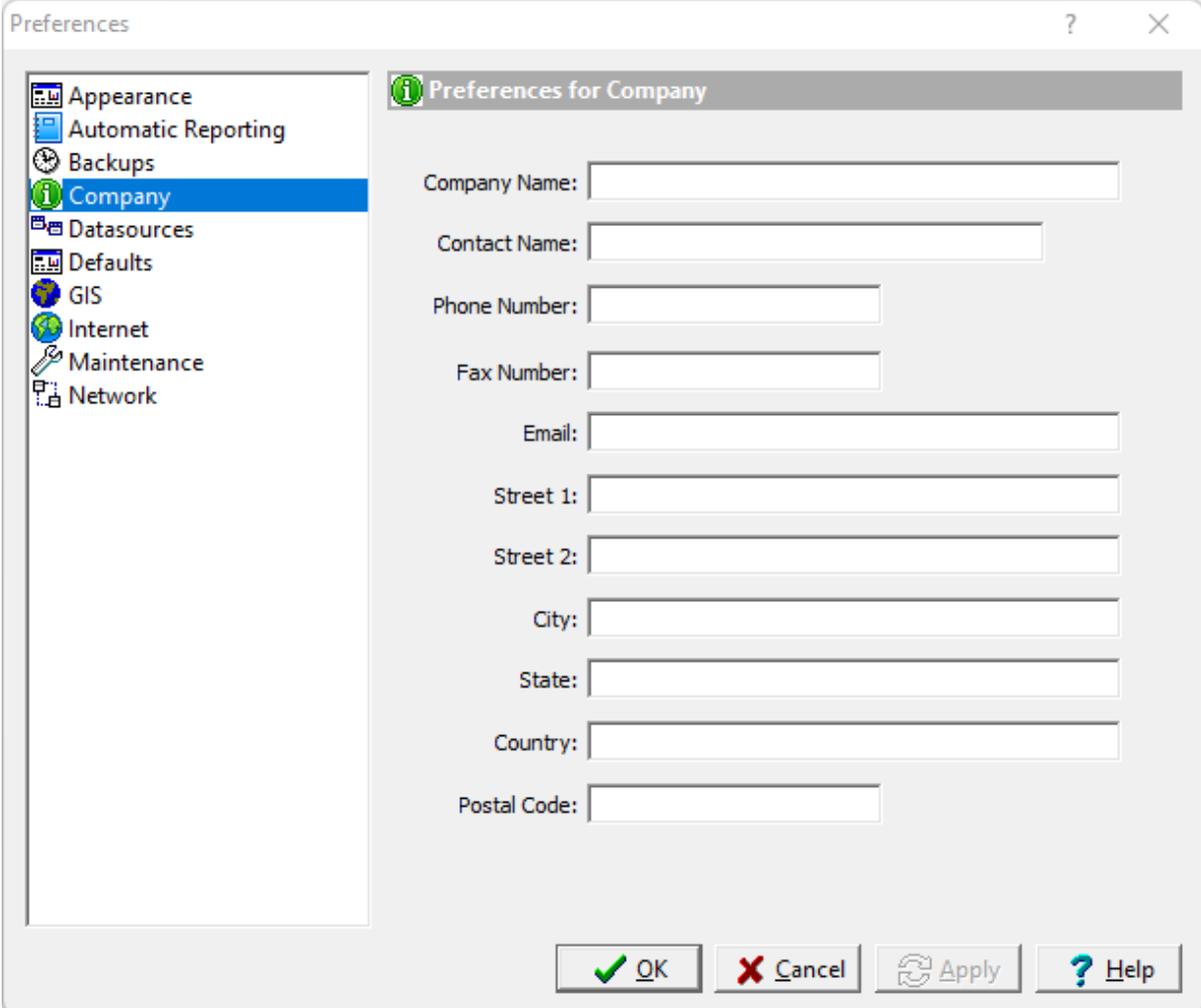
**Back Up:** If this checkbox is checked then the currently open project will be backed up at regular intervals. If this checkbox is not selected then the currently open project will not be backed up.

**Interval:** This is used to select the interval to use when backing up the project database.

**Number to maintain:** This is the number of backups to maintain, older backups will be deleted.

**Backup on Project Close:** Check this to create a backup of the project when it is closed.

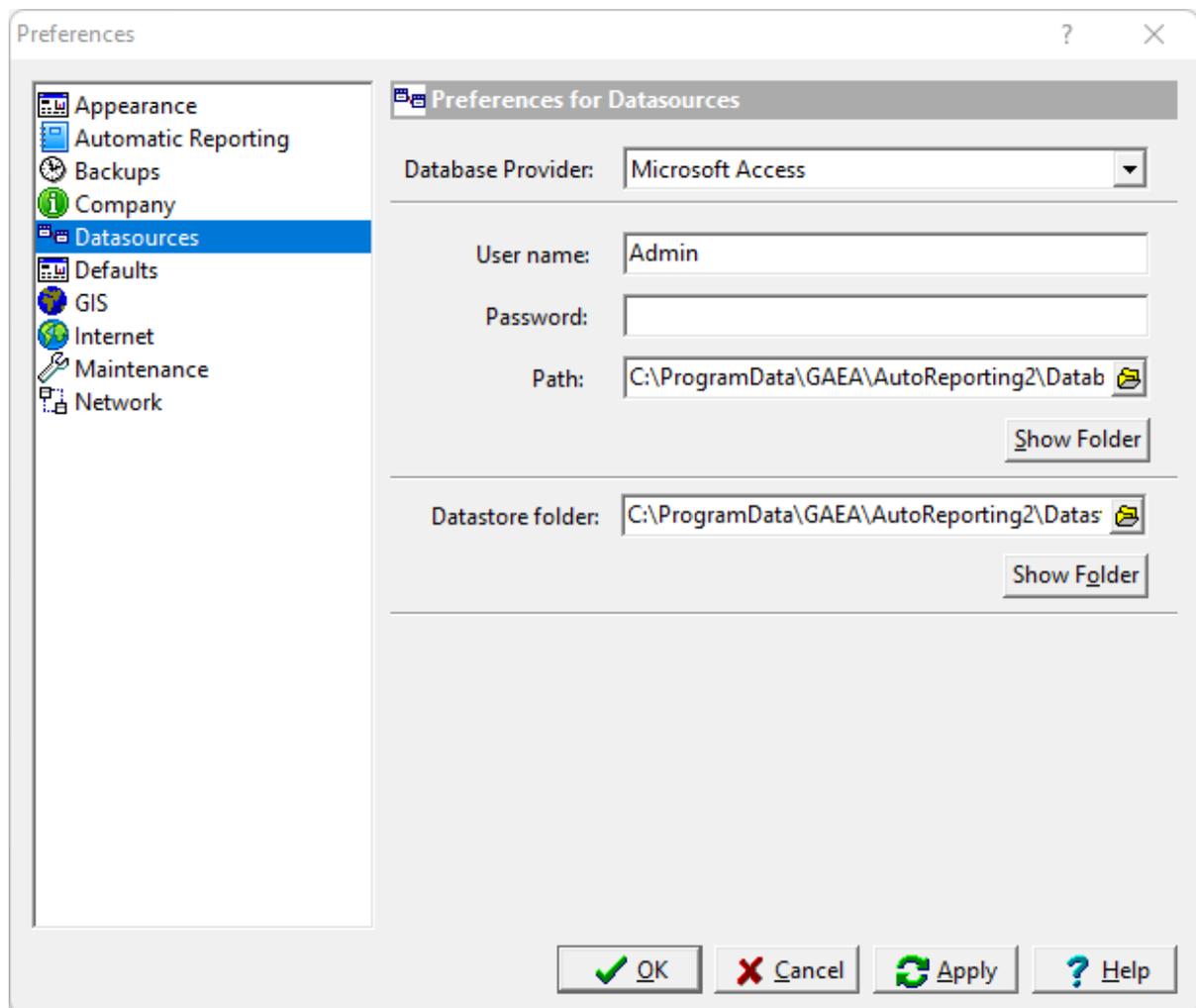

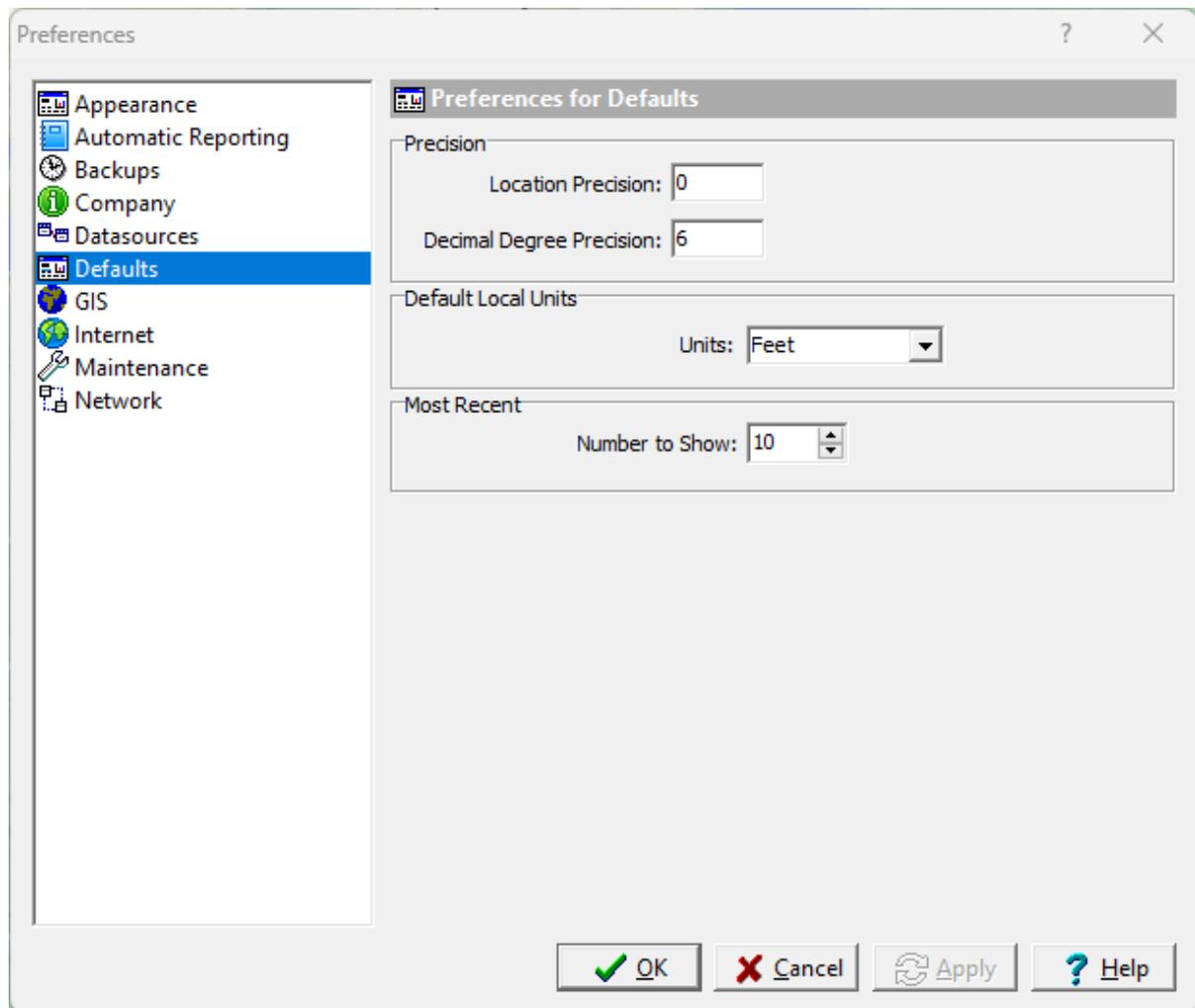

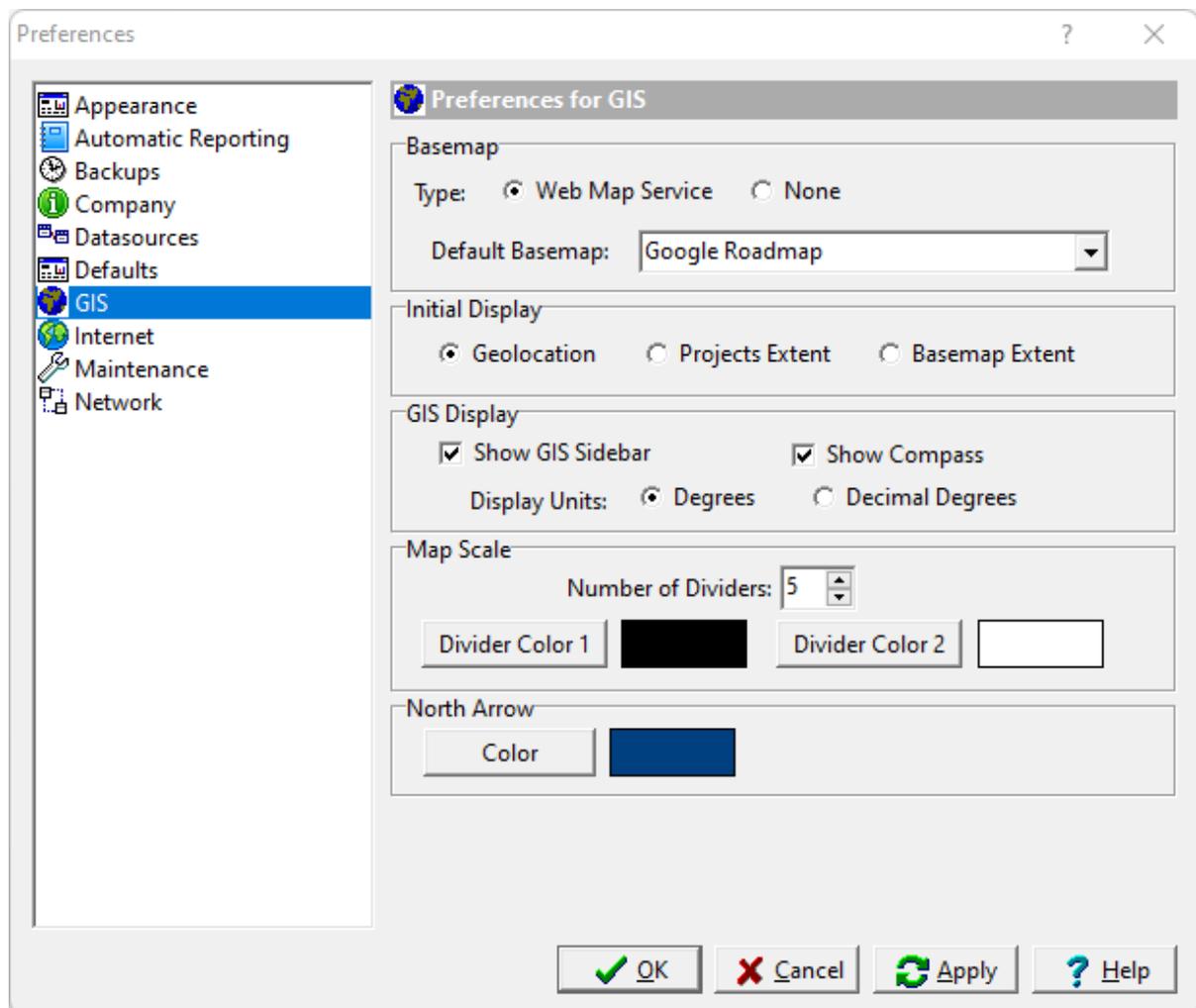

## 1.6.7 GIS

This is used to select the initial display when the application is started. It can either show an area around where you are located, an area showing the extent of all of your projects, or a previously set basemap extent.

**Show GIS Sidebar:** Check to show the GIS sidebar.

**Show Compass:** Check to show the GIS compass.

**Display Units:** This is used to select the units for the current cursor location shown in the status bar at the bottom of the display.

### Map Scale

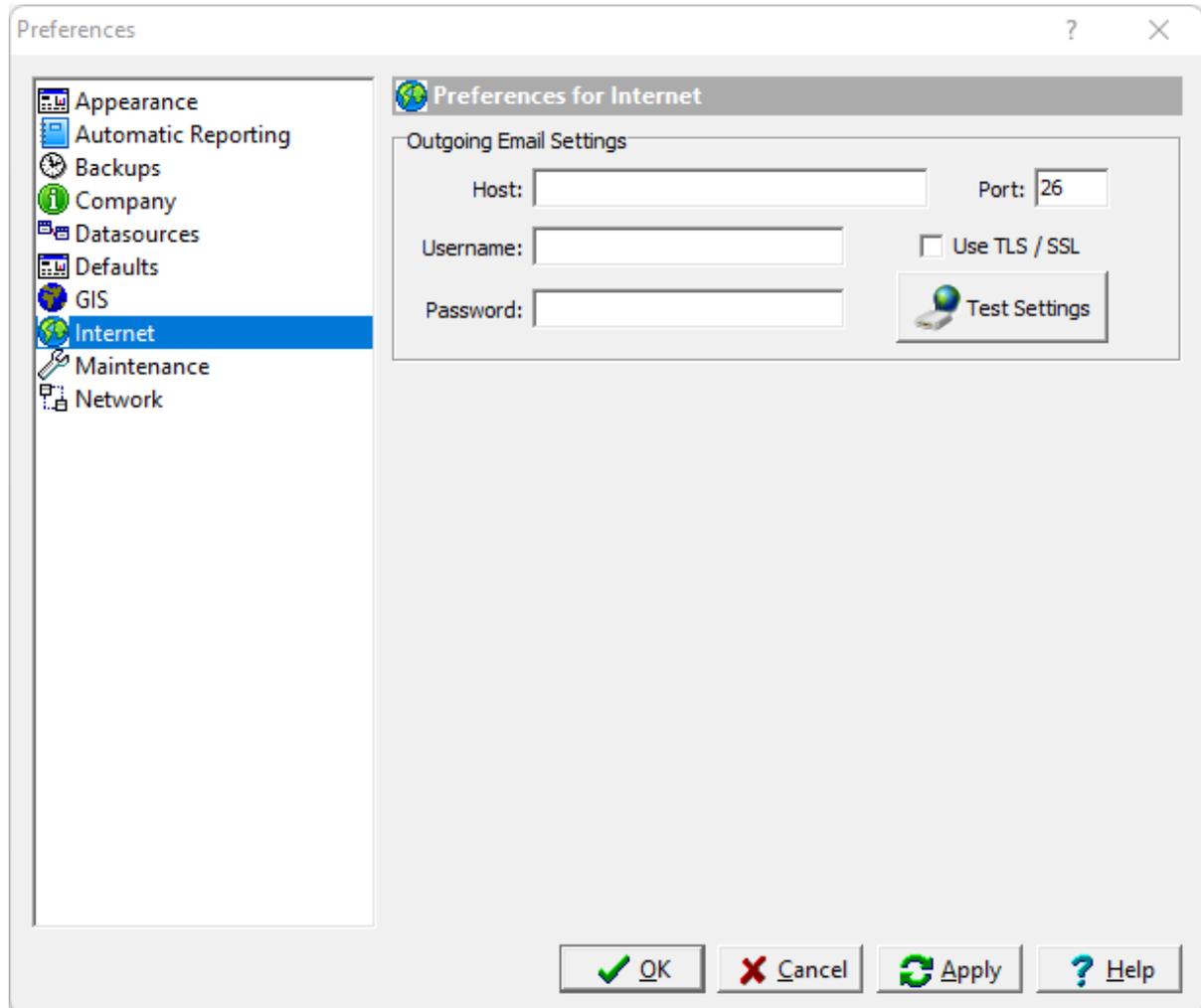

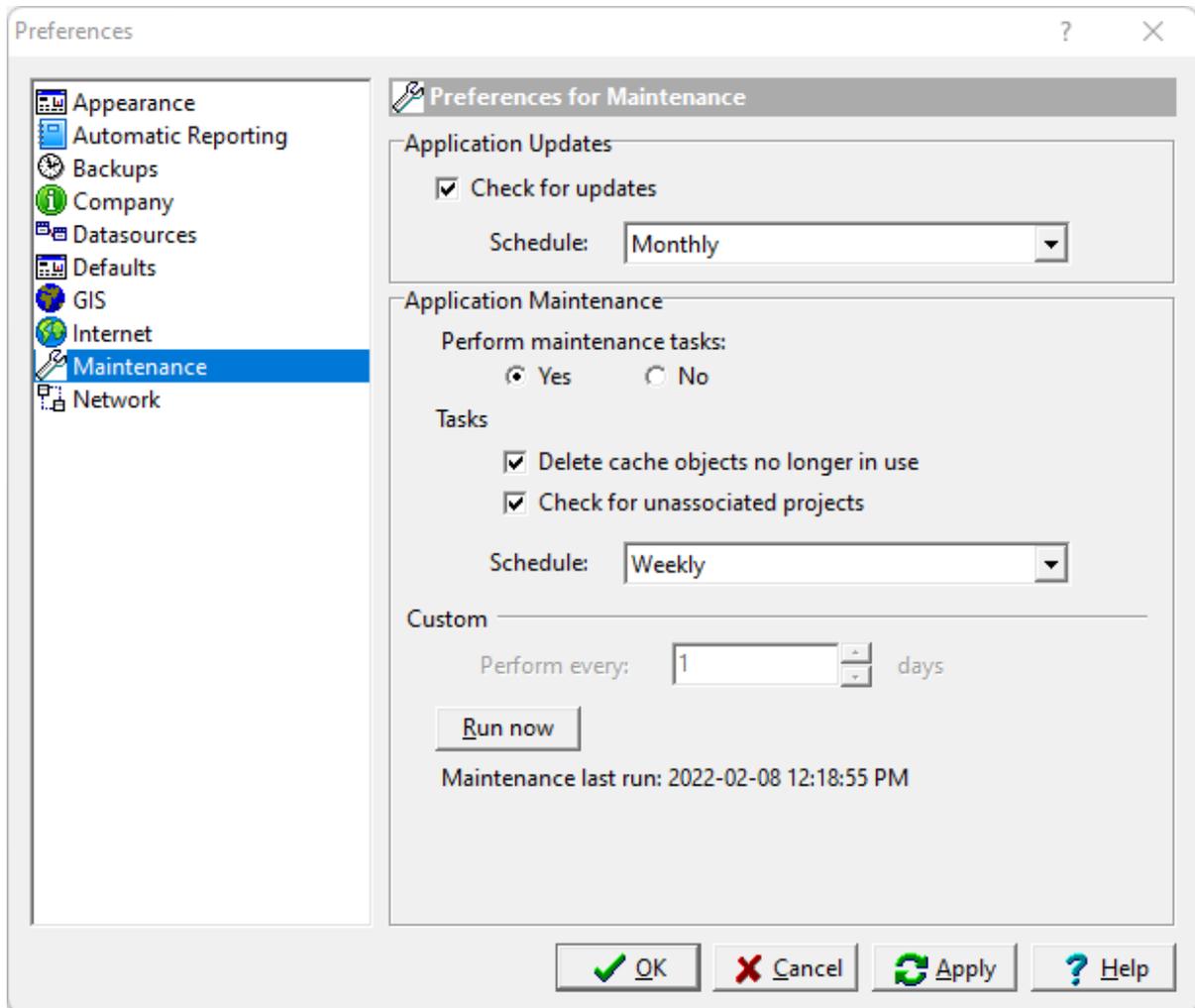

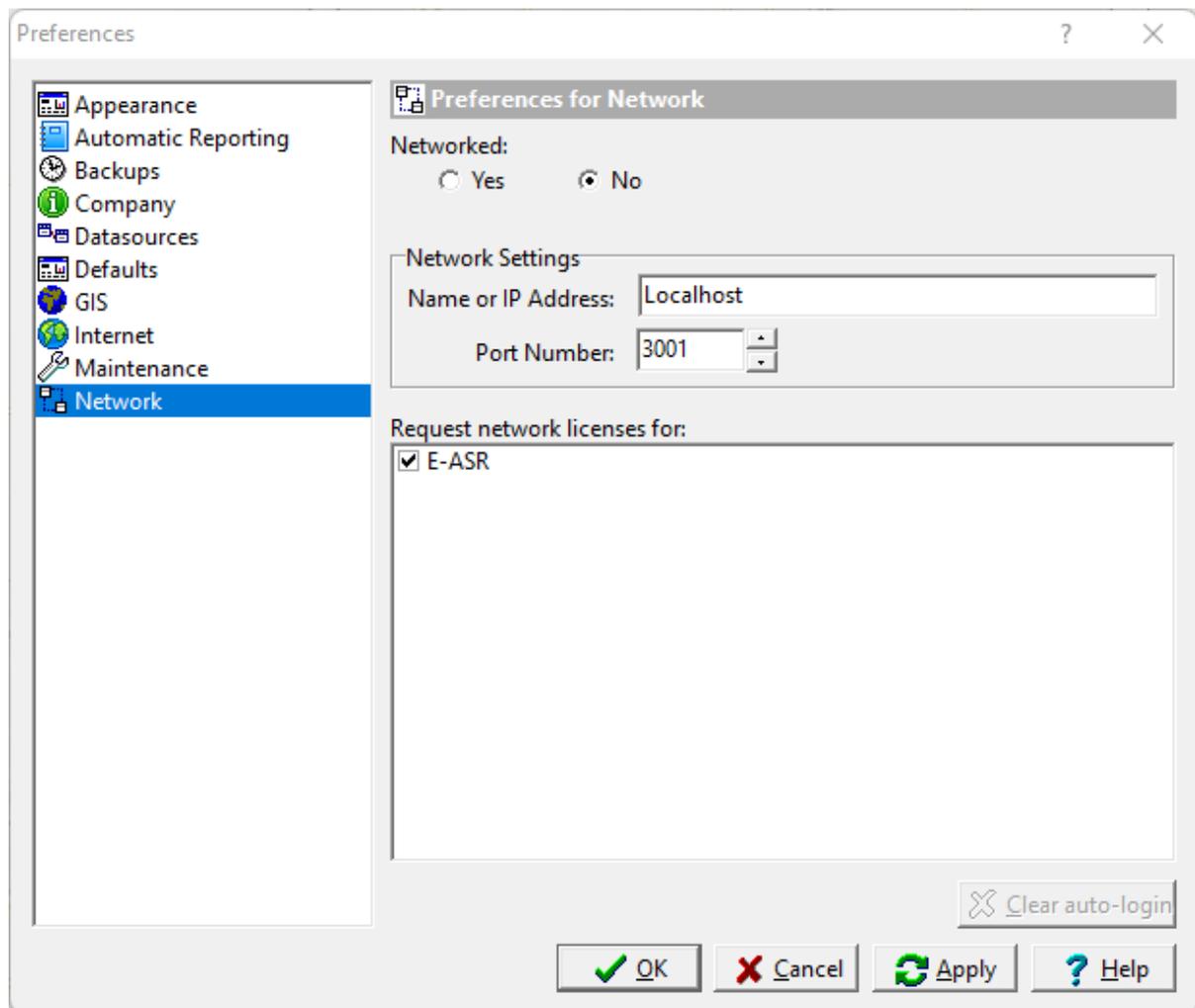

## 1.6.10 Network License



The following can be edited in the Network License category (these features should not be changed without consulting your database administrator):

**Networked:** This is used to indicate whether the program and licensing is running from a central database and server.

### Network Settings

**Name or IP Address:** This is the name or IP address of the server. If the program is not networked it will be "localhost".

**Port Number:** This is the port number for the server. If the program is not networked it will be disabled. It should be set to 3001.

**Request network licenses for:** This is the program and modules to request licenses from the server.

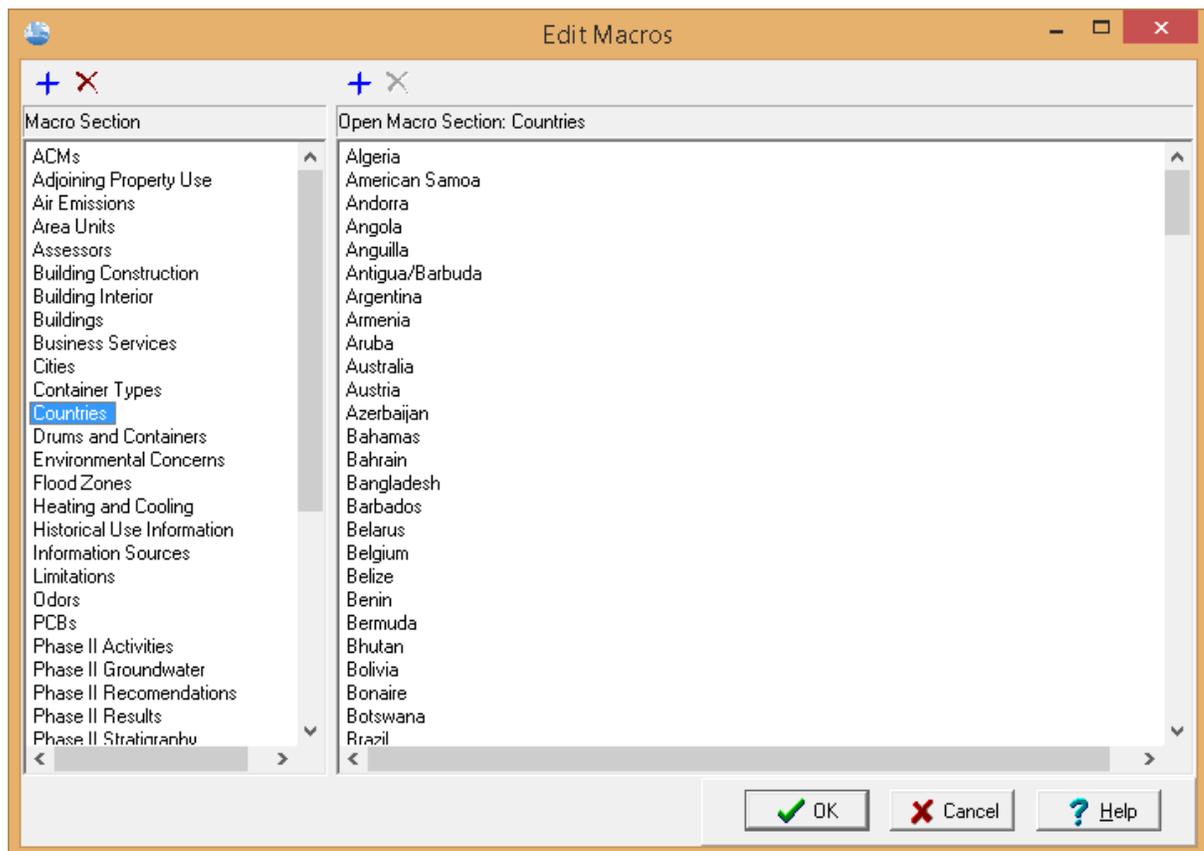
**Clear auto-login:** Click this button to clear the auto-login file. The next time you login you will be required to enter a username and password.

## 1.7 Macros

During the data collection process for report responses some of the text being entered will be repetitive or best selected from a list of text. In order to reduce the time required to enter repetitive text, text macros can be used. Text macros are composed of lines of text (up to 255 characters) that can be selected and inserted for responses. To make it easier to select the text, the macros are divided into sections.

### 1.7.1 Editing Macros

To add or edit a text macro select *Tools > Macros > Edit* and the Edit Macros form will be displayed



The text macros are divided into sections to make it easier to organize and select the text. Sections are displayed on the left side of the form and the text for the selected section is displayed on the right side.

#### Sections

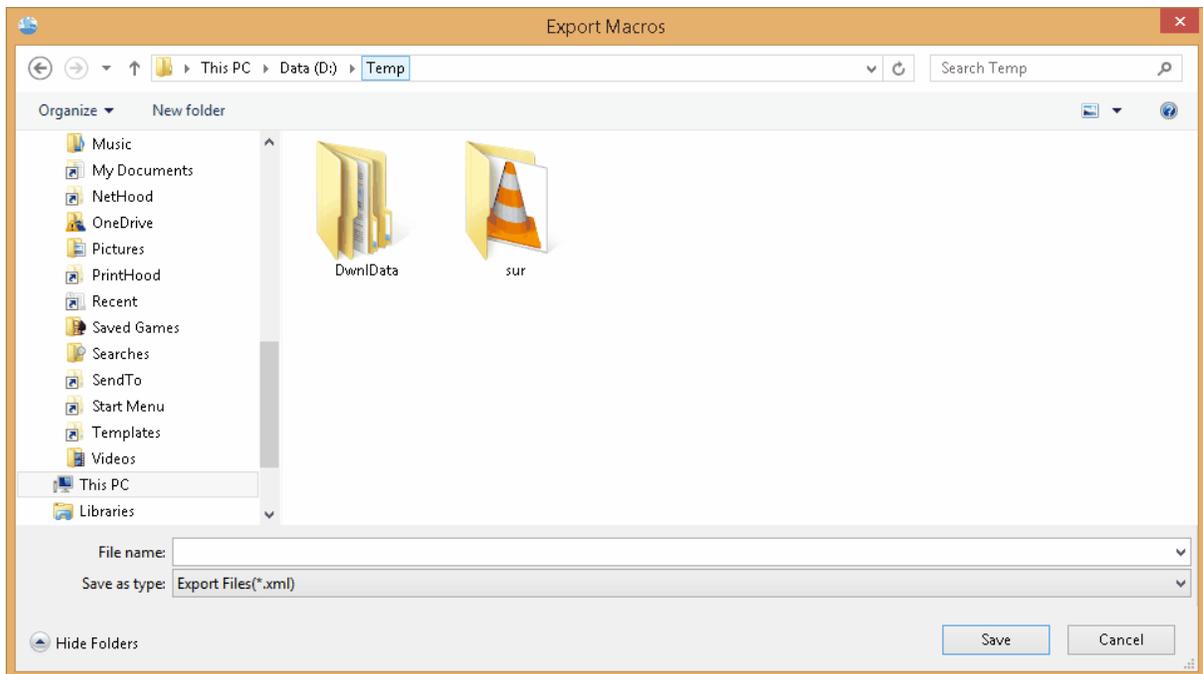
- To add a new section click on the Add button above the sections and then enter the name of the section.
- To delete a section select the section and then click on the Delete button above the section.
- To open an existing section click on the section. The text macros for that section will then be displayed on the right part of the form.
- To rename a section select the section and then double click on the name.

## Text Macros

- To add a new text macro to a section, make sure that the section is open and then click on the Add button above the text macros. Then enter the text for the macro.
- To delete a text macro from a section, make sure that the section is open . Then select the text to be deleted and then click on the Delete button above the text macros.
- To change the text for a text macro select the text and then double click on the text.

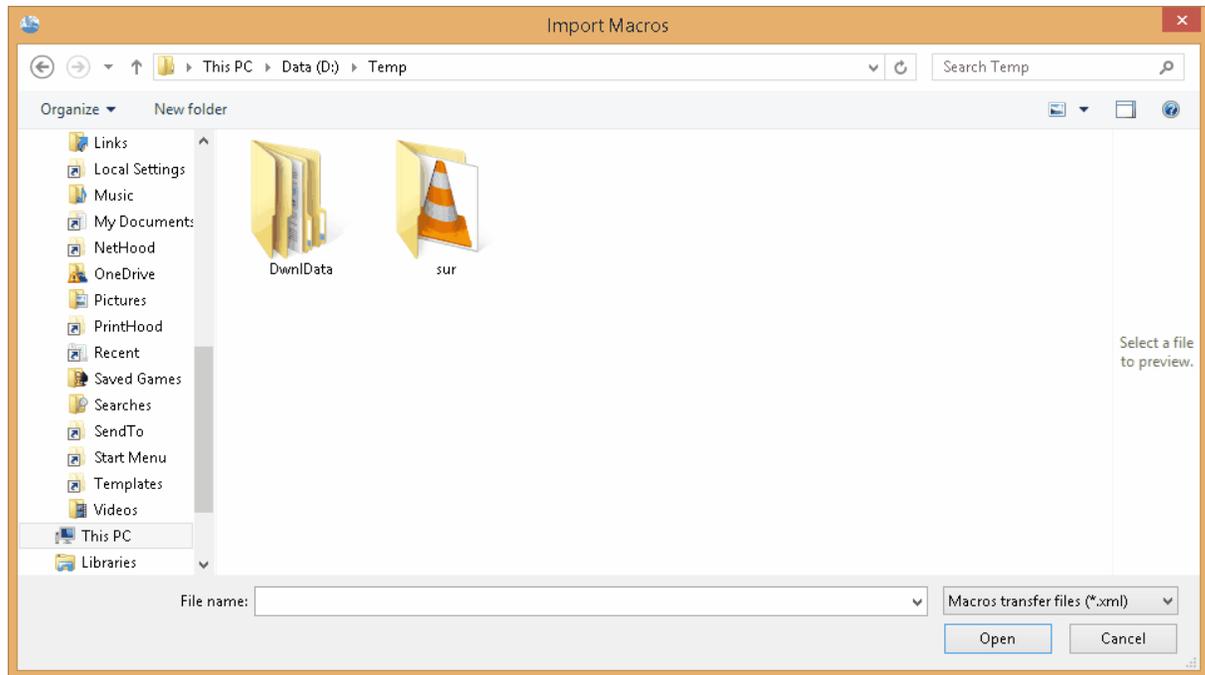
### 1.7.2 Exporting Macros

Test macros can be exported to an XML exchange file that can be imported on to other computers running E-ASR by selecting [Tools > Macros > Export](#). The Export Macro form will be displayed and can be used to specify the export file.



### 1.7.3 Importing Macros

Text macros previously exported to an XML exchange file can be imported by selecting [Tools > Macros > Import](#). The Import Macros form will be displayed and can be used to select the XML exchange file.



#### 1.7.4 Importing Pocket ESA Macros

Macros that have been exported from Pocket ESA can be imported by selecting *File > Import > Pocket ESA Macros*. The Import Pocket ESA Macros form will be displayed and the macro file with the extension ".mcb" can be selected.

## 1.8 Help and Support

GAEA Technologies strives to make this application easy to use and learn. Several tools and features are provided to assist the user to learn the program and when necessary get technical support. These features can be found in the Help menu of the main menu and are described below.

### 1.8.1 Help System

In addition to the User's Guide in PDF format, context sensitive help can be found within the application. The help system can be displayed by either selecting [Help > Contents](#) or clicking on the Help button on a form. When the Help button on a form is used, the help displayed will be specific to that specific form.

**Chapter 2 Report Templates**

## Chapter 2 Report Templates

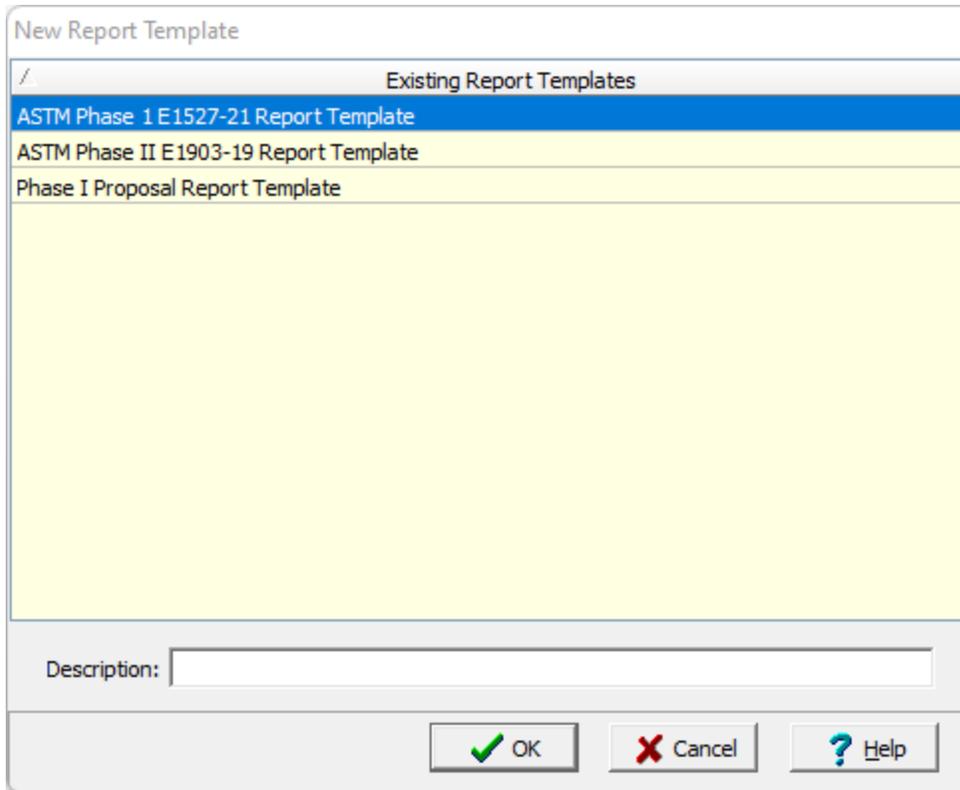
Prior to creating a questionnaire a report template using Microsoft Word should be created. This report template is later merged with the specific responses of a questionnaire to create a final report. The report template is a generic form of the final report and contains keywords where the specific answers to the questionnaire are to be merged into the report. These keywords are highlighted in the report template using a unique style created for the program.

The answers to be merged into the report are not necessarily the direct answers to the questions, but are the text responses associated with the answer. For example, if the answer to the question “Are there any ACMs suspected?” is “No” the text merged into the final report is not necessarily “No” but could be a paragraph of text that has been associated with this response; such as, “There are no asbestos containing materials suspected on the subject property.” This response can be further edited prior to being merged. These associations are defined as part of the questionnaire and are entered during the creation of the questionnaire.

The easiest method to create a report template is to edit a copy of an existing report in Word. This edited report template can then be [imported](#)<sup>66</sup> as described below. In addition, a new blank report template can be [created](#)<sup>67</sup> as described below.

## 2.1 Creating a Report Template

To create a new blank report template select *File > New > Report Template* when no project is open. The New Report Template form will be displayed showing the current report templates.

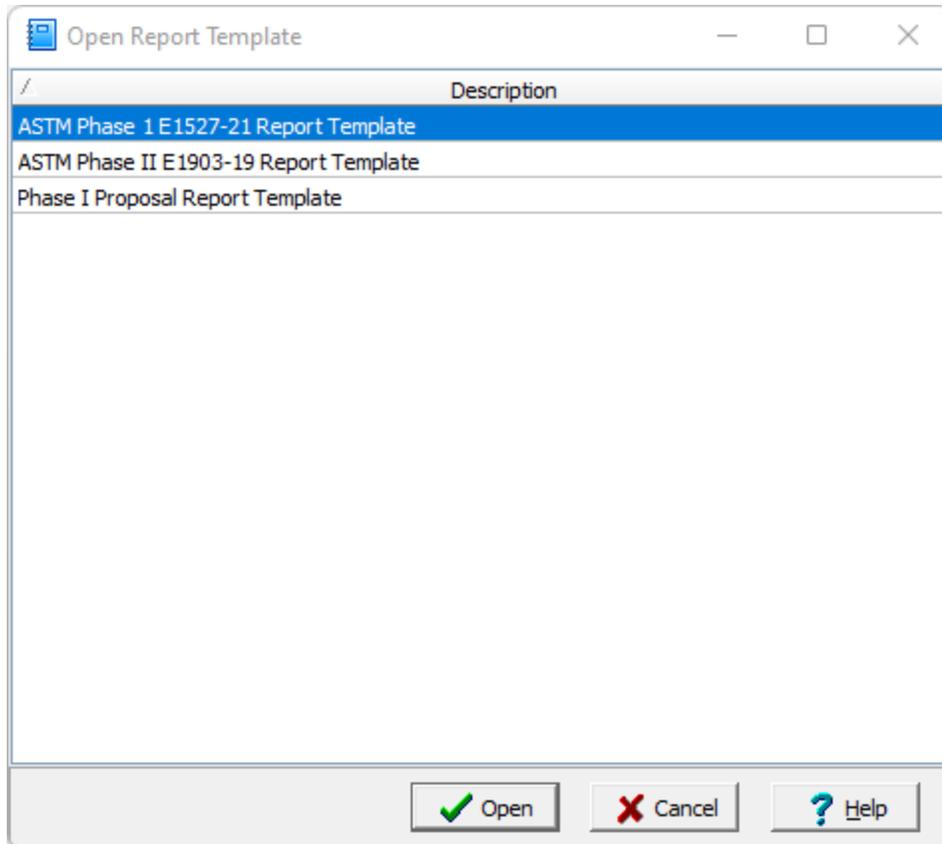

## 2.2 Opening a Report Template

A report template can be opened when no project is open by selecting *File > Open > Report Template*. The Open Report Template form will be displayed.



Select the report template to open and then press Ok to open it in Microsoft Word.

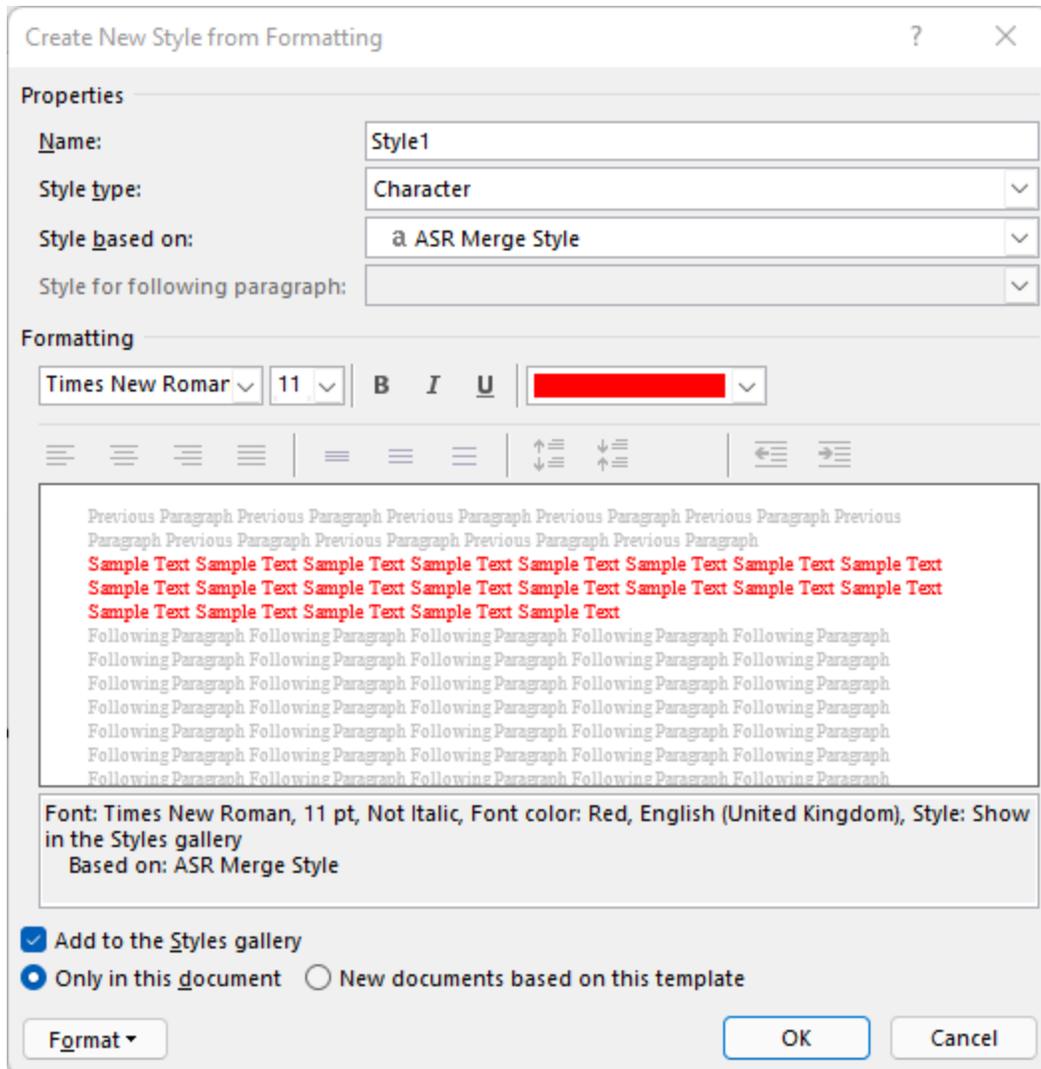
## 2.3 Editing a Report Template

A style for the E-ASR keywords can be added to the report template and used to highlight the keywords. These keywords should replace the text in the report that will change for each questionnaire response. Proper placement of the keywords and the text to be substituted requires planning and some trial and error experience. Before editing a report template it is recommended that the example report templates included with the program be reviewed.

### 2.3.1 Adding a Style to a Word Document

The name of the style used to highlight the keywords in the report template is specified in [Preferences](#)<sup>41</sup>. The name of the style specified in E-ASR must exactly match the name used in the report template. Before entering the keywords in the report template the style should be added to the Word Document if it does not already exist. There are two types of styles in Word, paragraph and character. The E-ASR style must be a character style.

To add the E-ASR character style to the report template, open the report template in Word and then select the Create a Style from the Style bar. Enter the name of the style as “E-ASR” or whatever name was specified in the preferences. In the Style type box select Character then change any other format options desired such as font style and color. To make it easier to recognize the keywords in the report template it is recommended that the style have a different color and font.

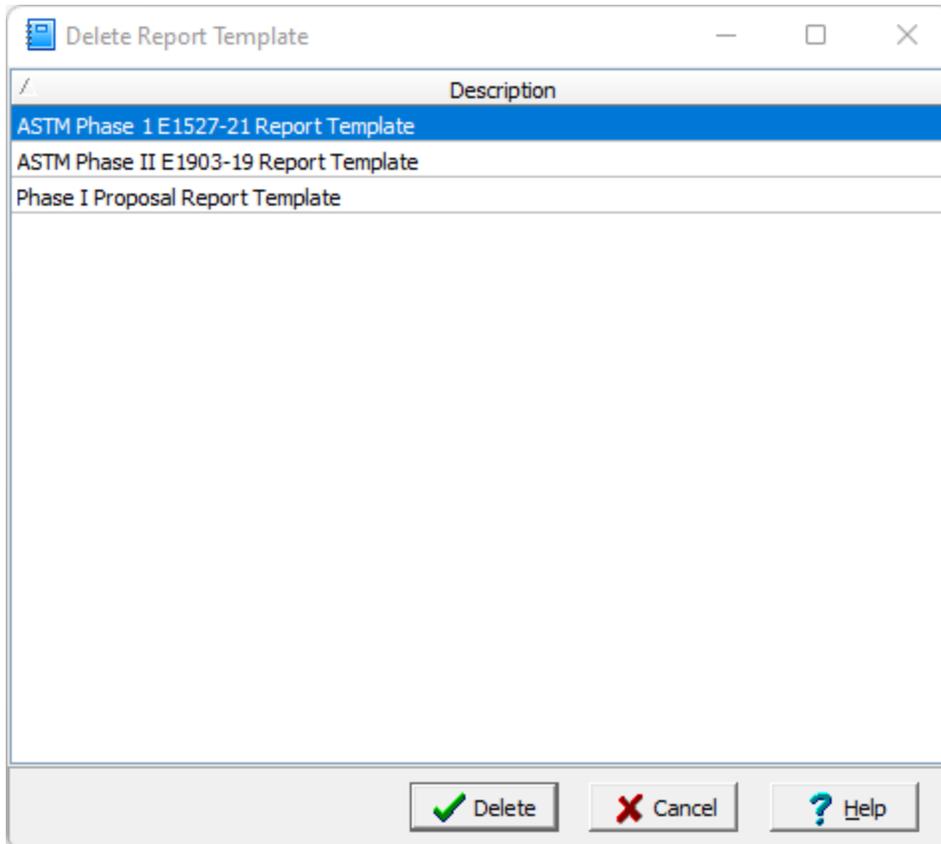


### 2.3.2 Using Styles in a Word Document

After the E-ASR style has been added to the report template, it can be used to highlight the keywords. To change the style of a keyword select the keyword and then either select the E-ASR style from the Style bar.

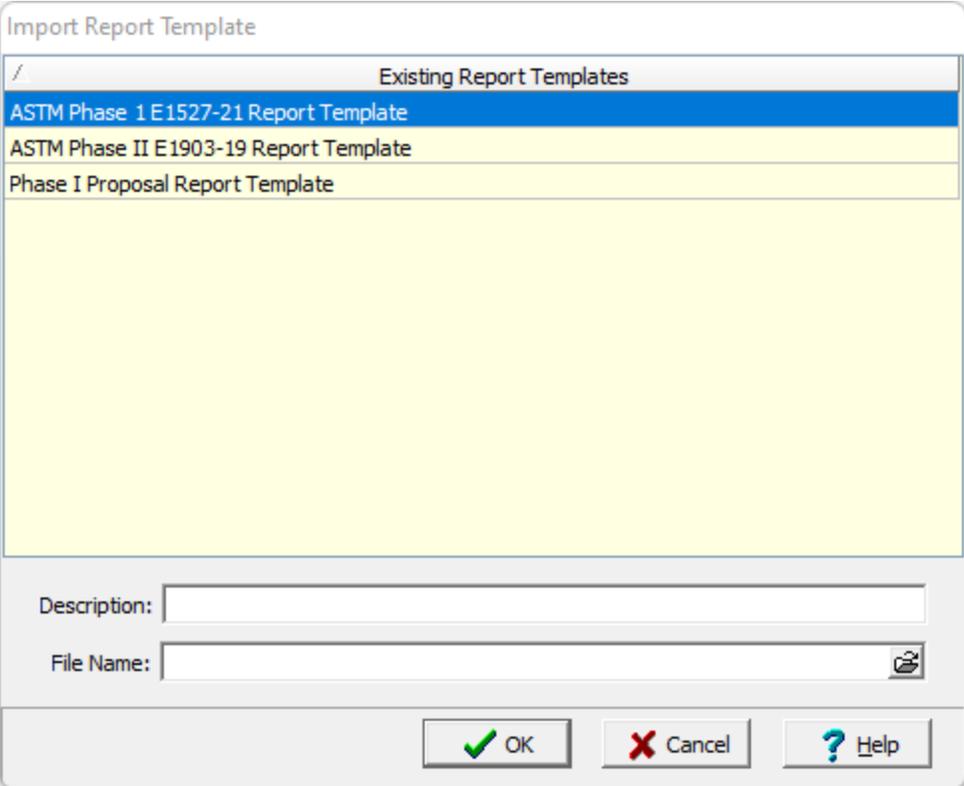
## 2.4 Deleting a Report Template

To delete a report template select *File > Delete > Report Template* when no project is open. The Delete Report Template form will be displayed showing the current report templates. Select the report template to delete and press the Delete button.



## 2.5 Importing a Report Template

To import a new report template select *File > Import > Report Template* when no project is open. The Import Report Template form will be displayed showing the current report templates.

## Chapter 3 Questionnaires

After the report template has been created the next step is to create a questionnaire that is used to collect the responses for a report. This questionnaire will assign a keyword specified in the report template to each question. The text associated with the answer to that question will then replace the keyword when the questionnaire and report template are merged to create a final report.

Questionnaires are divided into sections and subsections which can contain any number of questions. For every question a question type is selected. The question type determines the format of the question and allowable answers that are used to collect the response data. There are numerous question types that can be selected and additional question types can be created. After the question type has been selected and the question entered, the text associated with each allowable answer is entered. This is the text that will actually be merged into the final report.

## 3.1 Creating and Editing Question Types

Every question in a questionnaire has a question type that determines the format of the question and allowable answers that are used to collect the response data. The application comes with numerous predefined question types and additional ones can be created. Each question type consists of a form with several controls used for collecting data for the question.

Question types can be either template or non-template. Template question types can be used to create other question types and questionnaires. Whereas, non-template question types can only be used to create questionnaires. The question type can be set as a template or non-template when editing the question type.

### 3.1.1 Creating a Question Type

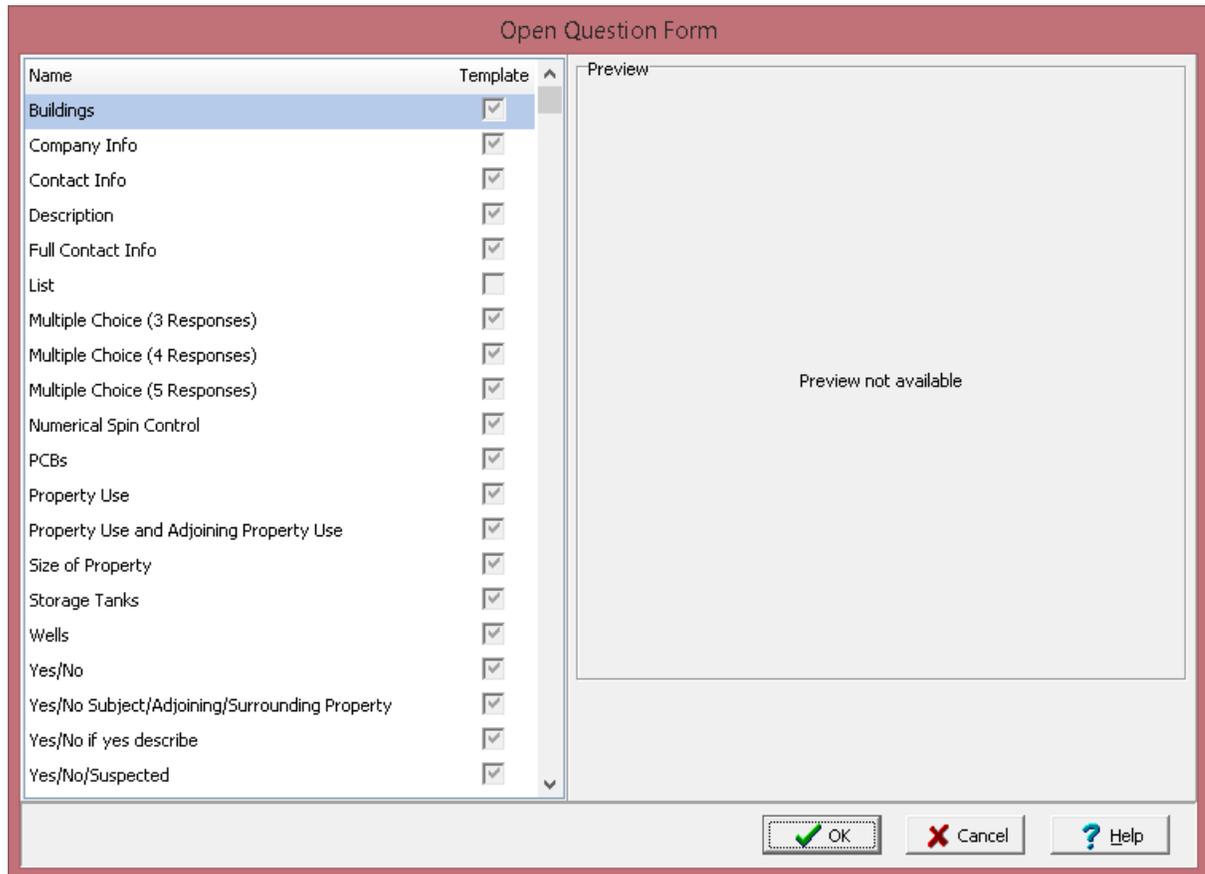
To create a new question type select *Tools > Question Types > New*. The New Question Type form will be displayed.

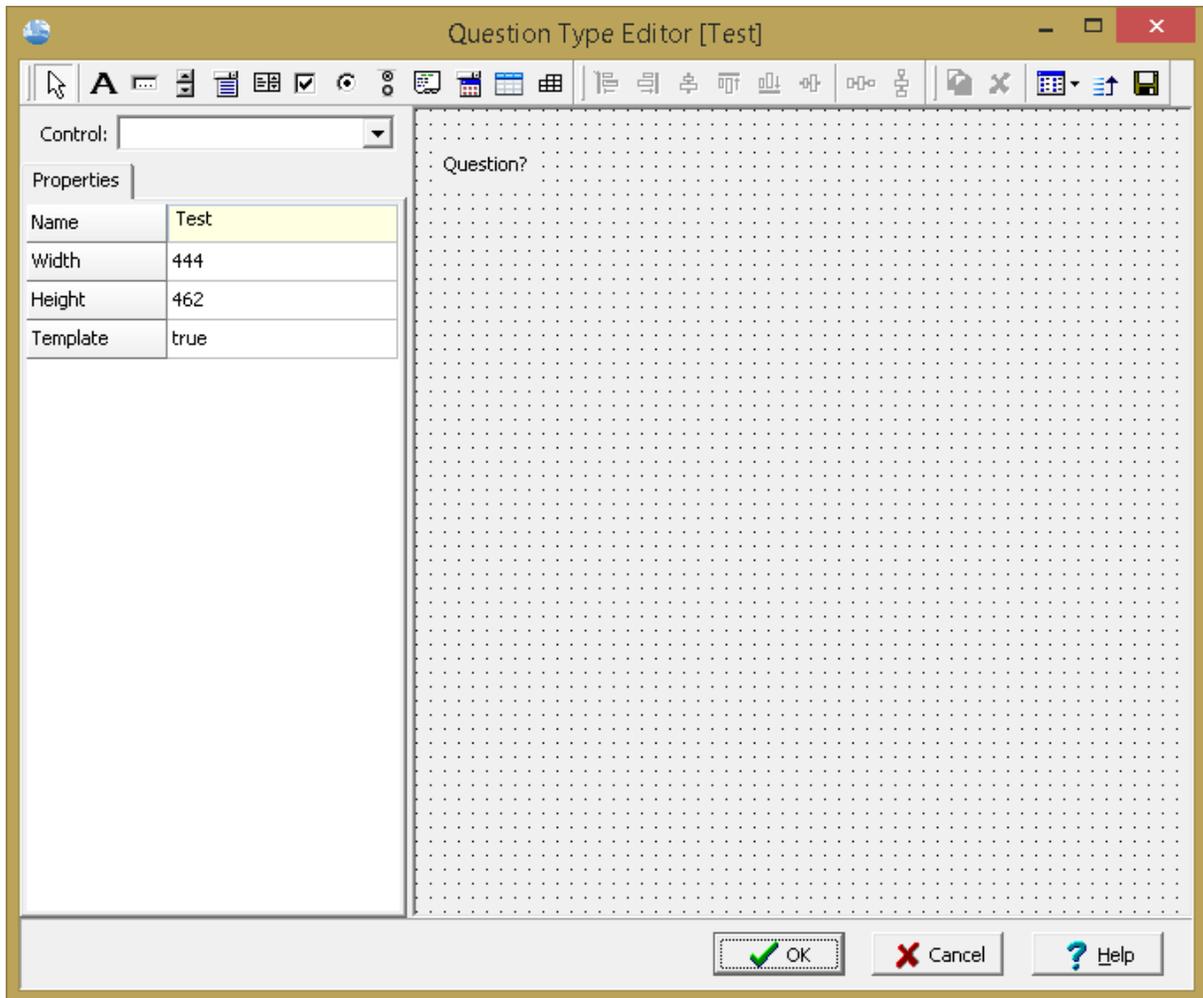

This form displays a list of template and non-template question types. Only question types that can be opened and edited will be displayed. Some question types are required to import Pocket ESA data and can not be edited.

When a question type is highlighted a preview of the form will be displayed on the right. After the question type has been selected it will be opened for editing as described [below](#) <sup>70</sup>.

### 3.1.3 Editing a Question Type

After a question type has been created or edited the Question Type Editor form will be displayed. This form has a sidebar on the left showing information on the currently selected control. If it is a new question type there will only be a question label on the preview. Every question type should have a question label that will be replaced by the question when creating a questionnaire. This question label must have the Name "Question".



At the top of the form there are toolbars for the adding, aligning, copying, and deleting controls, adjusting the view, setting the tab order, and saving the question type as described in the sections below.



If no control is selected the following form properties can be entered on the sidebar:

**Width:** This is the width of the form.

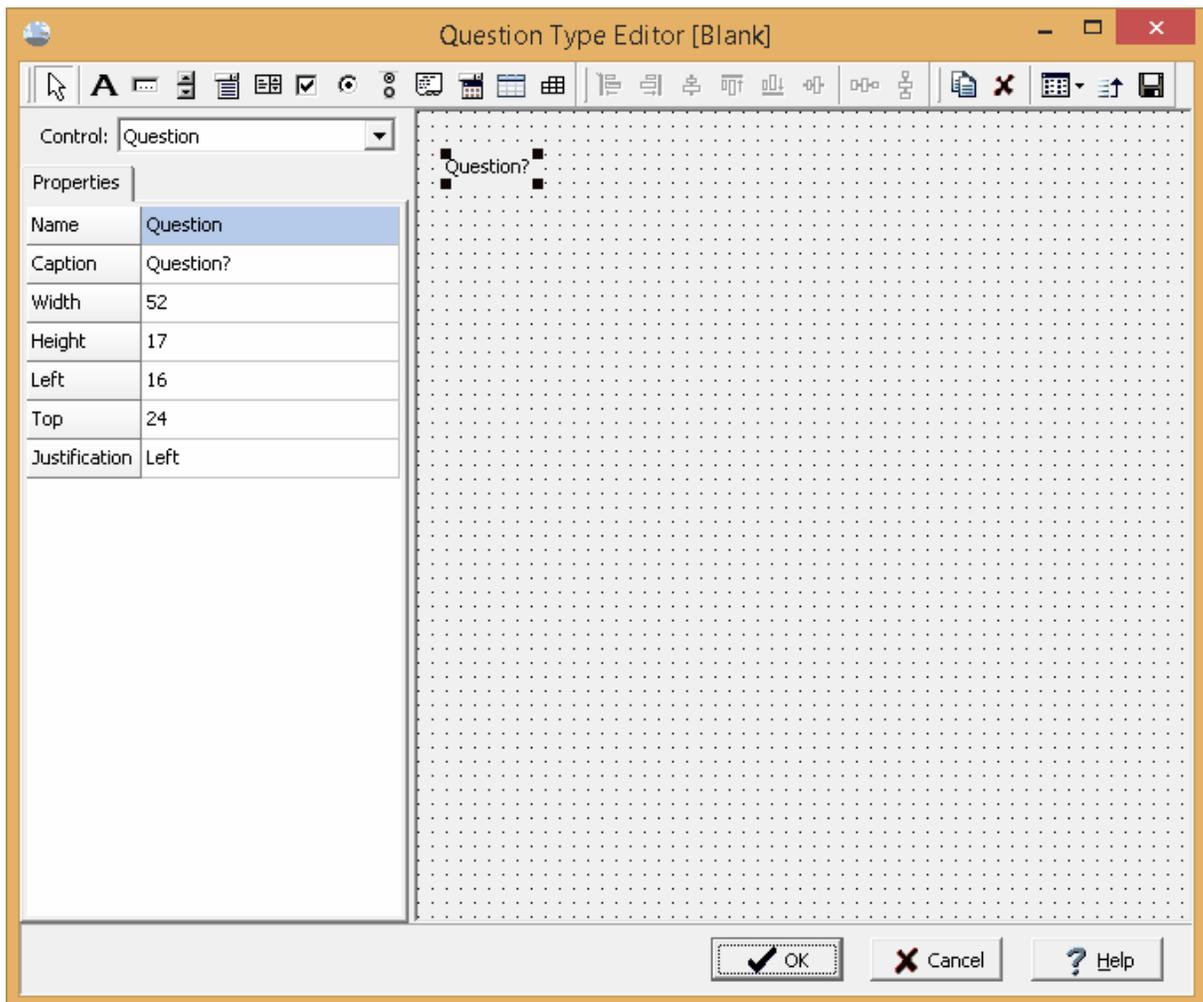
**Height:** This is the height of the form.

**Template:** If this is set to true, the question type can also be used as a template.

### 3.1.3.1 Adding and Editing Labels

#### A

Labels are used to show text information for the question and do not collect any data. To add a label, click on the Add Label button and then click on the preview where you want the label to be placed. Or to edit an existing control click on it.



After a label has been added or selected for editing, the control properties will be shown on the left sidebar. The following properties can be edited:

**Name:** This is the unique name of the control. The name cannot contain any spaces. If it is the question label, the name must be "Question".

**Caption:** This is the text to display for the label. If it is the question label, the question entered in the questionnaire will be substituted for the text.

**Width:** This is the width of the label in pixels.

**Height:** This is the height of the label in pixels.

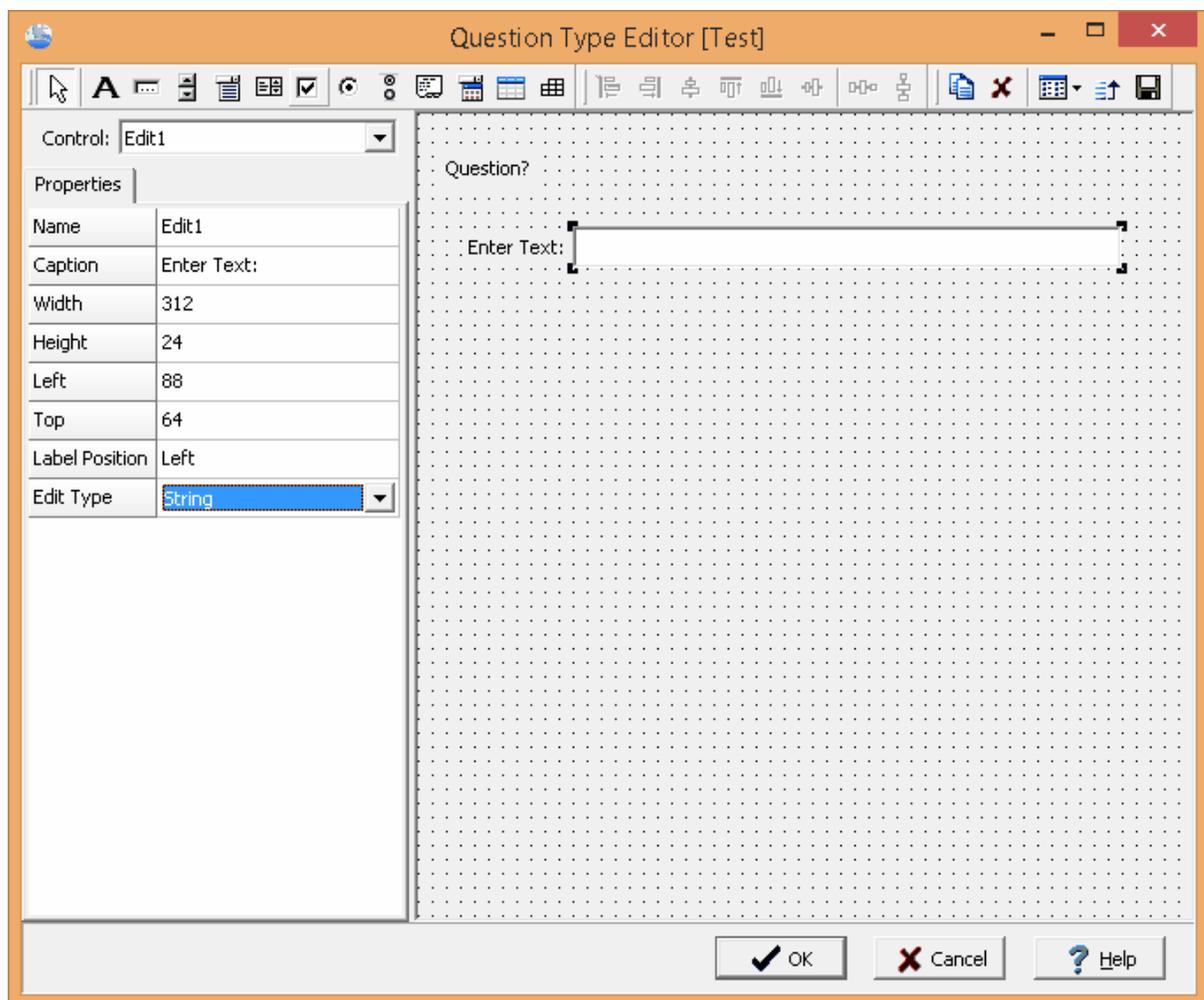
**Left:** This is the left position of the label in pixels from the left edge.

**Top:** This is the top position of the label in pixels from the top edge.

**Justification:** This is used to select the justification for the label.

### 3.1.3.2 Adding and Editing Edit Boxes

 This is used to add an edit box. Edit boxes are used to enter one line of text for the question type. To add an edit box, click on the Add Edit Box button and then click on the preview where you want the edit box to be placed. Or to edit an existing control click it.



After an edit box has been added or selected for editing, the control properties will be shown on the left sidebar. The following properties can be edited:

**Name:** This the unique name of the control. The name cannot contain any spaces.

**Caption:** This is the text to display for the caption of the edit box.

**Width:** This is the width of the control in pixels.

**Height:** This is the height of the control in pixels.

**Left:** This is the left position of the control in pixels from the left edge.

**Top:** The is the top position of the control in pixels from the top edge.

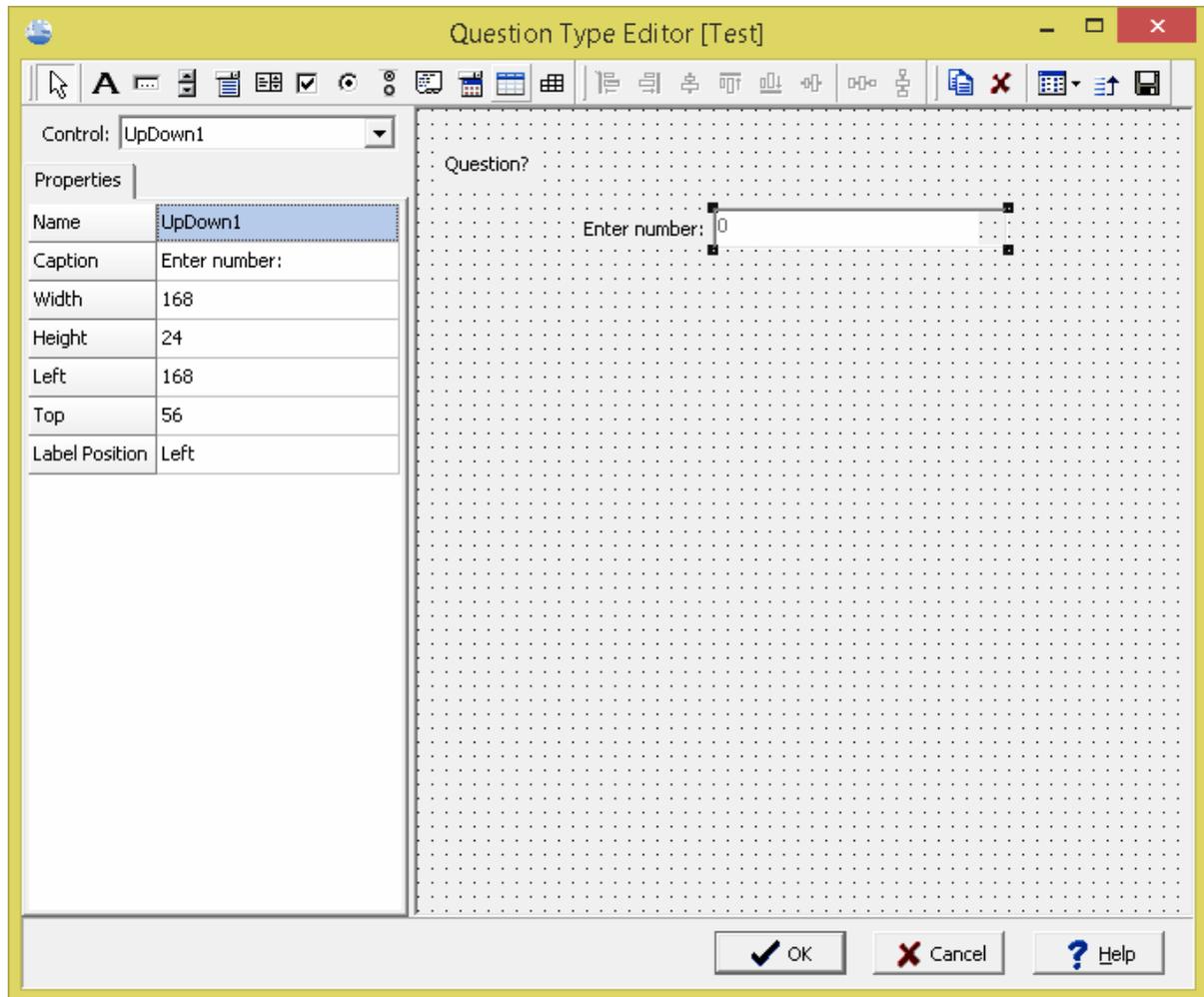
**Label Position:** This is used to select position of the caption relative to the edit box.

**Edit Type:** This is used to select the type of data that can be entered. It can either be a string, a floating point number, or an integer.

### 3.1.3.3 Adding and Editing Up-Down Edit Boxes



This is used to add an edit box with an up-down arrows. These edit boxes are used to enter numeric data and the up and down arrows are used to increment and decrement the numeric data. To add an up-down edit box, click on the Add Up-Down Edit Box button and then click on the preview where you want the control to be placed. Or to to edit an existing control click it.



After an up-down edit box has been added or selected for editing, the control properties will be shown on the left sidebar. The following properties can be edited:

**Name:** This is the unique name of the control. The name cannot contain any spaces.

**Caption:** This is the text to display for the caption of the up-down edit box.

**Width:** This is the width of the control in pixels.

**Height:** This is the height of the control in pixels.

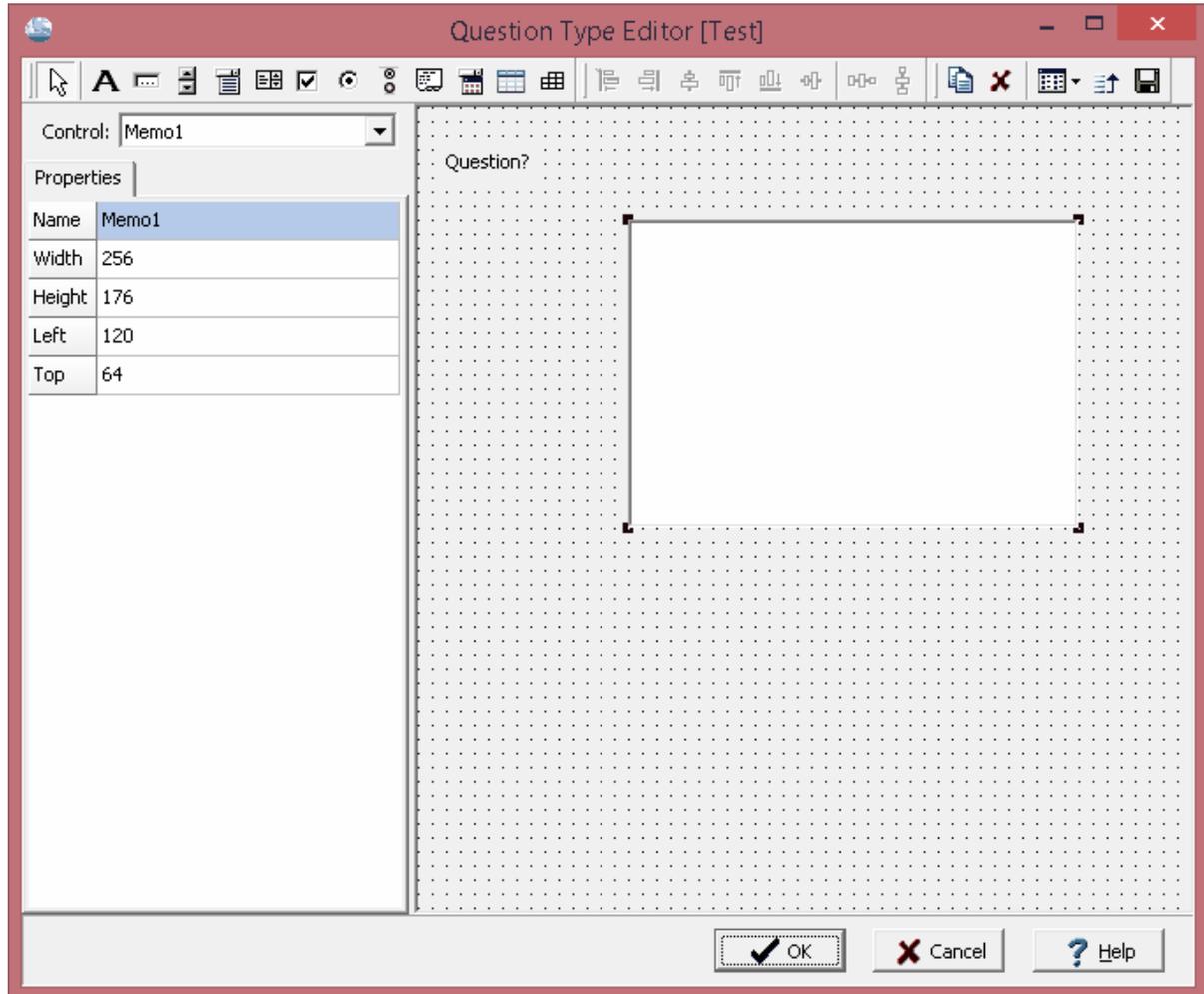

**Name:** This the unique name of the control. The name cannot contain any spaces.

**Width:** This is the width of the control in pixels.

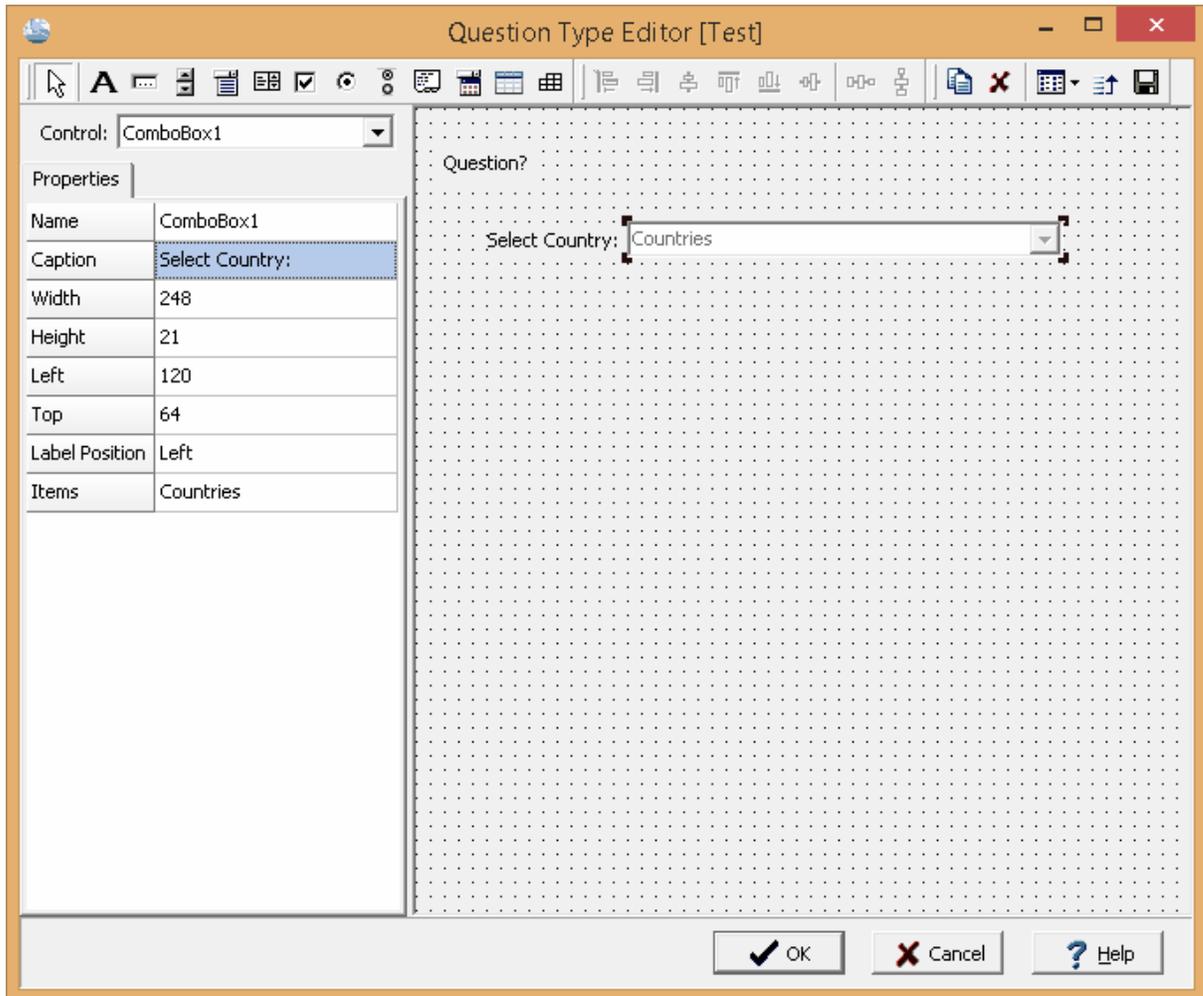

### 3.1.3.5 Adding and Editing a Combo Box

**Top:** The is the top position of the control in pixels from the top edge.

**Fixed Column:** This is used to select whether there is a fixed column at the top of the table.

For each column in the table the following can be specified:

**Header:** This is used to specify the text for the fixed row at the top of the column. If there is no fixed row in the table this field will not be shown.

**Width:** This is the relative width in pixels. The width of the first column will be automatically adjusted to take up the remaining table width based on the other column widths.

**Alignment:** This is used to select the horizontal alignment of text in the column.

**Right Line:** This is used to select the line style for the right side of the column. The column line for the table will be a solid single line in the response preview, but will be shown as selected in the merged Word report. The right line style for the last column can not be selected since it represents a border for the table.

**Edit Type:** This is used to select the type of information that can be entered in the column (String, Date, Time, Float, Integer, or Combo List).

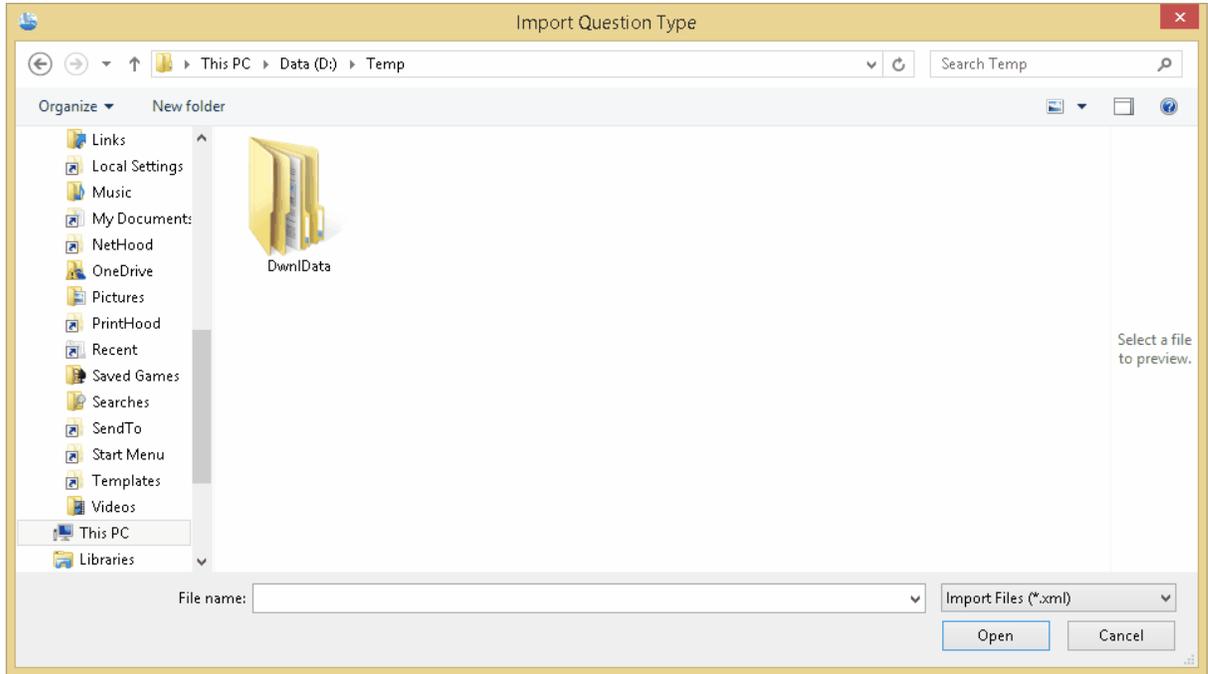
### 3.1.5 Exporting a Question Type

To import a question type from an XML exchange file, select *Tools > Question Types > Import*. The Import Question Type form will be displayed where the XML exchange file can be selected.

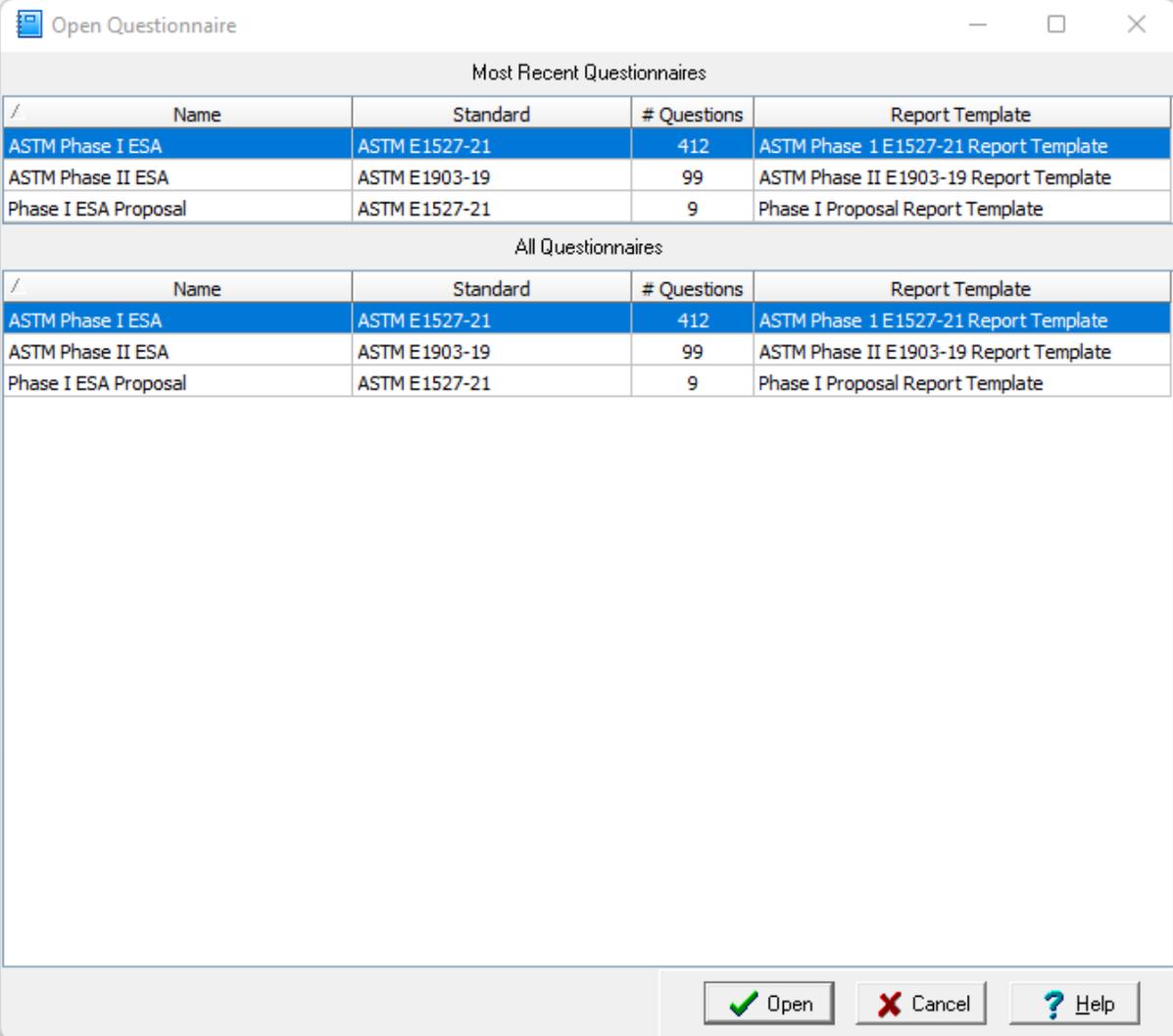


## 3.2 Creating and Editing Questionnaires

Typically, a questionnaire will adhere to a national standard such as the CSA or ASTM standards. However, abbreviated questionnaires may be created and used in some situations. After a questionnaire has been created it can be used to generate numerous reports.

### 3.2.1 Creating a Questionnaire

To create a new questionnaire either click on the New button then select Questionnaire or select [File > New > Questionnaire](#) when no project is opened. The New Questionnaire form below will be displayed.

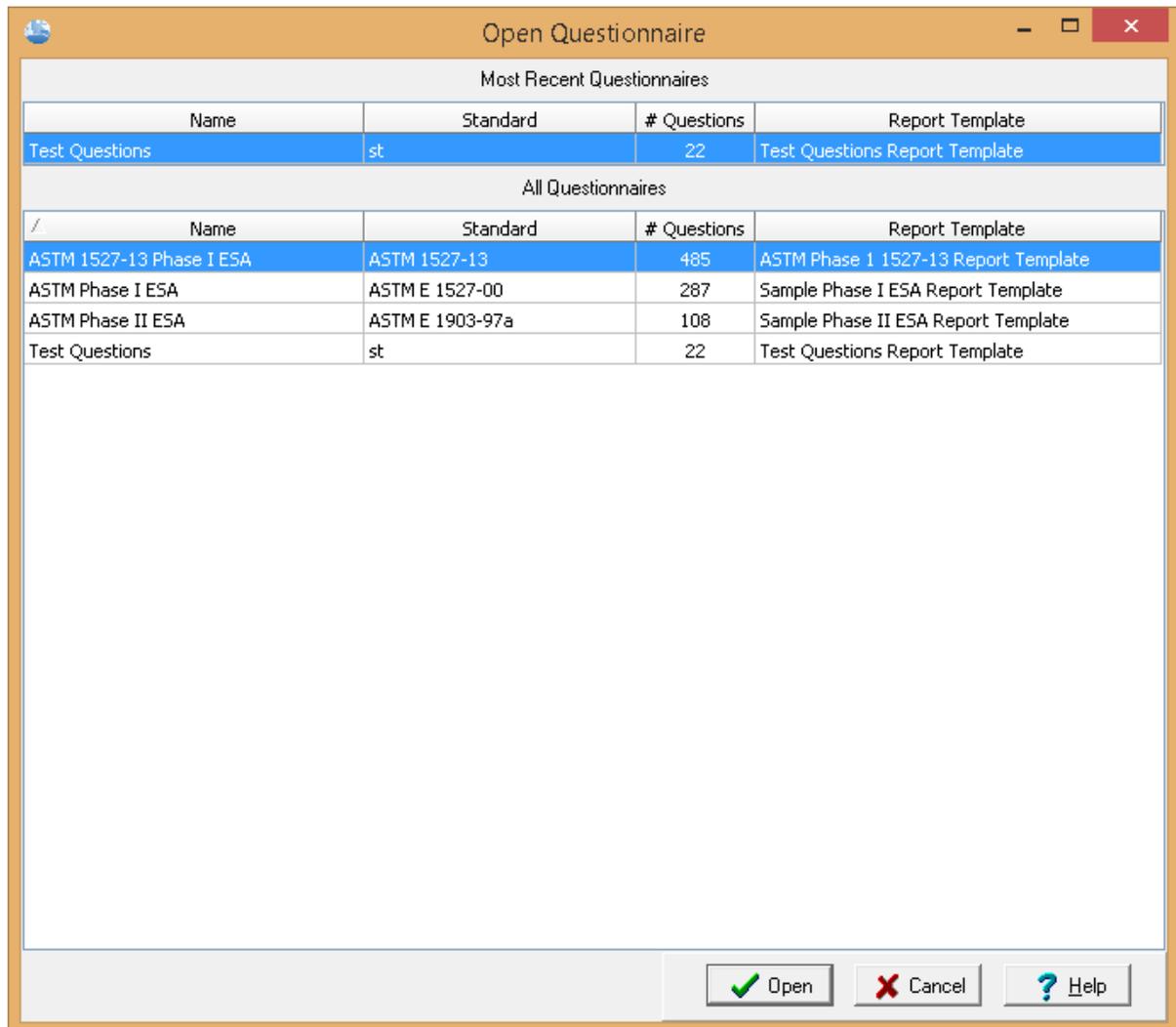

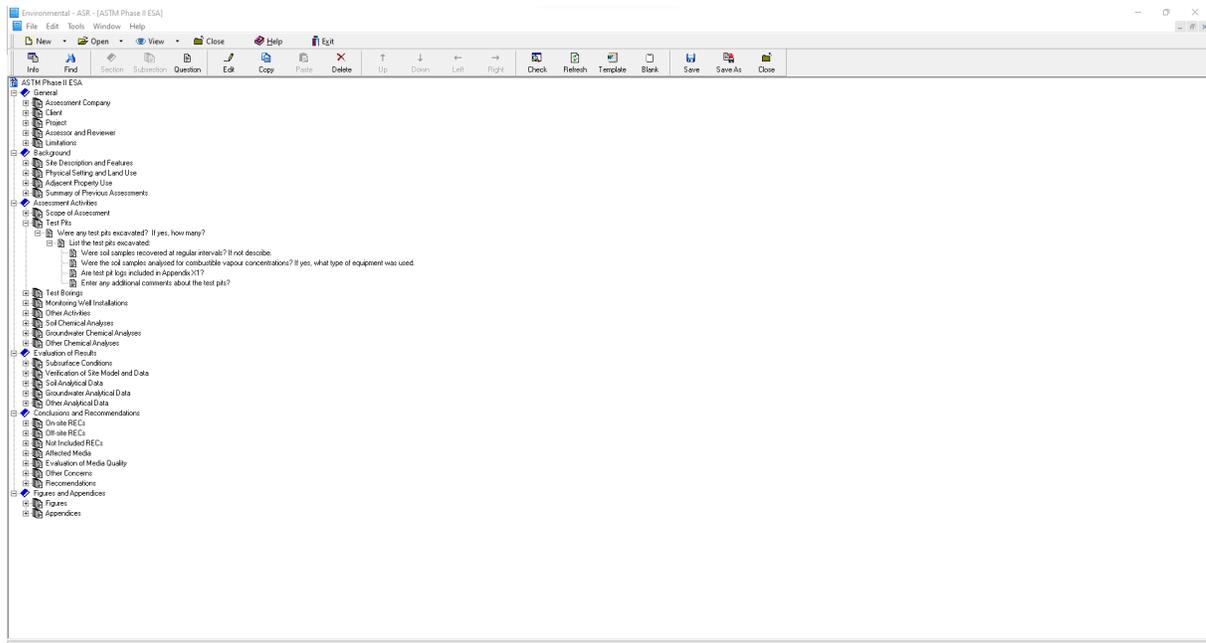

### 3.2.3 Editing a Questionnaire

After a questionnaire has been created or opened it will be displayed as shown below. A tree view will be displayed showing the sections, subsections, and questions specified in the questionnaire.



Sections in the tree view can be expanded and collapsed by double clicking on the section name. When the section is collapsed only the section is displayed and the subsections are hidden. When the section is expanded all of the subsections are displayed below the section. Subsections can contain one or more questions and can be expanded or collapsed by double clicking on the subsection name. When the subsection is collapsed only the subsection is displayed and the questions are hidden. When the subsection is expanded all of the questions are displayed below the subsection. The [sections](#)<sup>[101]</sup> and [subsections](#)<sup>[102]</sup> can be edited as described in the sections below.

Questions can also contain sub-questions that can be shown by clicking beside the question. A question can be edited by double-clicking on the question or highlighting the question then selecting Edit from the popup menu. The editing of a question is described in the [Editing Questions](#)<sup>[102]</sup> section below.

At the top of the questionnaire form there are buttons for the following:



This button is used to edit the [general information](#)<sup>[100]</sup> for the questionnaire.



This button is used to [find text](#)<sup>[108]</sup> within the questions.



This button is used to [add a section](#)<sup>[101]</sup>. The button will only be enabled when the top node showing the questionnaire name in the tree is selected. The section will be added at the bottom of the sections.



This button is used to [add a subsection](#)<sup>[102]</sup>. The button will only be enabled when a section is selected. The subsection will be added at the bottom of the section.



This button is used to [add a question](#)<sup>[102]</sup>. The button will only be enabled when a subsection or question is selected. If a subsection is selected the question will be added at the bottom of the subsection. If a question is selected the new question will be added as a sub-question.



This button is used to edit the selected [section](#)<sup>[101]</sup>, [subsection](#)<sup>[102]</sup>, or [question](#)<sup>[102]</sup>. The button is only enabled when a section, subsection, or question is selected.



This button is used to [copy a question](#)<sup>[102]</sup>. This button is only enabled when a question is selected.



This button is used to [paste a question](#)<sup>[102]</sup> that has been previously copied/ This button is only enabled when a question has been copied.



This button is used to delete a [section](#)<sup>[101]</sup>, [subsection](#)<sup>[102]</sup>, or [question](#)<sup>[102]</sup>.



This button is used to check the [keyword usage](#)<sup>[109]</sup>.



This button is used to refresh the keywords from the report template. This can be used after the report template has been edited and saved to refresh the list of keywords available to be assigned to the [report section](#)<sup>[103]</sup> of a question.



This button is used to open the report template in Microsoft Word.



This button is used to create a [blank questionnaire form](#)<sup>[110]</sup>.



This button is used to save the questionnaire.



This button is used to [save the questionnaire with a different name](#)<sup>[111]</sup>.



This button is used to close the questionnaire.

### 3.2.3.1 Editing General Information



The general information for the questionnaire can be edited using the Edit General Information button or selecting [Edit > General](#). The General Information form will then be displayed. This form is used to specify the standard and report template used for the questionnaire.

### 3.2.3.2 Editing Sections

The sections of a questionnaire contain all of the subsections and are indented once from the left. A questionnaire can have any number of sections. The sections can be edited as described below.



#### Adding a Section

To add a new section select the questionnaire name at the top of all the sections, then either click on the Add Section button on the toolbar or select *Edit > Add Section*. A new section will be created at the bottom of the questionnaire with the name New Section. The name of the section can be changed by entering it in the input box.



#### Renaming a Section

The name of a section can be changed by double-clicking on the section or by highlighting the section and then clicking on the edit button on the toolbar or selecting the *Edit > Edit*. The new name of the section can then be entered in the input box.



#### Moving a Section

Sections can be moved up or down by selecting the section and then clicking on the up or down arrows on the toolbar.



### Deleting a Section

To delete a section, select the section and then click on the Delete button on the toolbar or [Edit > Delete](#). When a section is deleted all of the subsections and questions within the section will also be deleted.

#### 3.2.3.3 Editing Subsections

Subsections of a questionnaire contain all of the questions and are members of a section. A section can have any number of subsections. The subsections can be edited as described below.



### Adding a Subsection

To add a new subsection select the section, then either click on the Add Subsection button on the toolbar or select [Edit > Add Subsection](#). A new subsection will be created at the bottom of the current section with the name New Subsection. The name of the subsection can be changed by entering it in the input box.



### Renaming a Subsection

The name of a subsection can be changed by double-clicking on the subsection or by highlighting the subsection and then clicking on the edit button on the toolbar or selecting the [Edit > Edit](#). The new name of the subsection can then be entered in the input box.



### Moving a Subsection

Subsections can be moved up or down by selecting the subsection and then clicking on the up or down arrows on the toolbar.



### Deleting a Subsection

To delete a subsection, select the subsection and then click on the Delete button on the toolbar or [Edit > Delete](#). When a subsection is deleted all of the questions within the subsection will also be deleted.

#### 3.2.3.4 Editing Questions

The questions of a questionnaire are grouped into subsections. A subsection can have any number of questions.



### Adding a Question

To add a new question select the subsection or question, then either click on the Add Question button on the toolbar or select [Edit > Add Question](#). The button will only be enabled when a subsection or question is selected. If a subsection is selected the question will be added at the bottom of the subsection. If a question is selected the new question will be added as a sub-question. A new question will be created with the name New Question. The name of the question is the text from the question itself

and will be changed when the new question is edited. After the question has been added it will be opened for [editing](#)<sup>[103]</sup>.



### Editing a Question

A question can be edited by clicking on the Edit button on the toolbar. The button is only enabled when a section, subsection, or question is selected. The editing of a question is described in the [section](#)<sup>[103]</sup> below.



### Copying a Question

A question can be copied by selecting it and clicking on the Copy button. It can then be pasted into the questionnaire using the Paste button. This button is only enabled when a question is selected.



### Pasting a Question

After a question has been copied, it can be pasted into the questionnaire using the Paste button. This button is only enabled when a question has been copied.



### Moving a Question

Questions can be moved up or down by selecting the question and then clicking on the up or down arrows on the toolbar. Questions can also be sub-questions of a question by moving them to the right using the right arrow on the toolbar. If a question is a sub-question it can be moved to the left using the left arrow and will no longer be a sub-question.



### Deleting a Question

To delete a question, select the question and then click on the Delete button on the toolbar or [Edit > Delete](#).

#### 3.2.3.4.1 Editing a Question

To edit a question double click on the question. The question can then be edited in the Question form shown below. This form has two tabs, one for the question and one for the report. The [question](#)<sup>[105]</sup> tab is used to specify the question type and question and the [report](#)<sup>[106]</sup> tab is used to specify the text that will be inserted into the report during the merging of the report responses and report template.

### Section Replacement

At the top of the form is a checkbox for Section Replacement. If the box is checked, during the merging of the report any instance of the section heading (keyword) will be replaced with the answer text. If the box is not checked, during the merging of the report the answer text will only be inserted below the first instance of the keyword and the section heading (keyword) will be left in place.

### Report Section

At the top of the form there is a combo box where you can select the keyword in the Report Section. When the arrow on the right is selected a list of keywords that have been entered in the report template will be displayed. A keyword from the list must be selected for the question. This keyword will determine where the text results of the question will be placed in the report when it is merged. If no keyword is selected the results of the question will not appear in the report.

### Question Selection

At the bottom of the form there are buttons that can be used for the following:

-  Moves to the first question (short cut key is Home)

- ◀ Moves to the previous question (short cut key is Page Up)
- ▶ Moves to the next question (short cut key is Page Down)
- ▶▶ Moves to the last question (short cut key is End)

**Question Type:** The question type determines the format of the question and the types of answers that are allowed. To select the question type click on the arrow to the right of the input box. The question

type can then be selected from the list of question types. The Preview button on the right can be used to display a preview of the question type. If the question type is multiple choice, input boxes will be added to the bottom of the tab for the possible choices. Enter the text for each of the choices in these input boxes.

**Preview:** Press the preview button to see a preview image of the question type.

**Question:** This is the text that is displayed on the Questionnaire form and on the Question form when entering report responses.

**Multiple Choice:** For multiple choice question types this is used to specify the choice names.

**Report Response:** This is used to select a response from a list of responses. The available responses will depend on the type of question. For example, for a Yes/No question there would be two available responses or for a Multiple Choice 3 Response question type there would be 3 responses.

**Next Question:** If the question type has radio buttons, a radio button group, or checkboxes and there are sub-questions to this question, this is used to select which sub-question to go next when this response is selected.

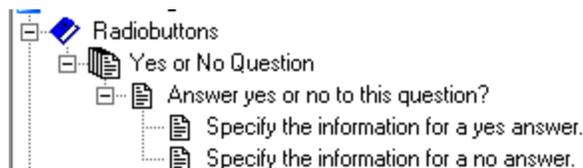
**Insert:** The Insert button allows for the insertion of text that was entered when the question was answered. For example, this text could be entered as the “Description” or as “Additional Information” for the question. When the Insert button is pressed a list will be displayed showing the types of text that could be entered with the question. This list will depend on the question type. To include the text entered for the associated text of the question, position the cursor in the text input box where you want the inserted text to appear and then click on the Insert button and select it from the list.

**Text Input Box:** Below the response selection is a Rich Text toolbar and input box, these are used to enter the text associated with the selected response. The text associated with the response can be as simple or as complicated as desired. There is no practical limit to the length of the text. When creating bulleted or numbered text at least one line of normal text must be inserted first.

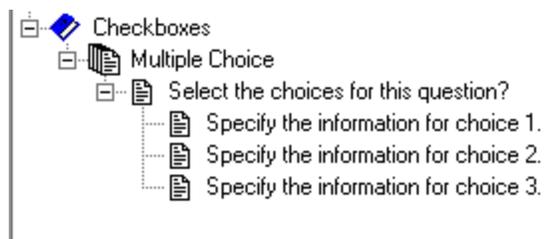
### 3.2.3.5 Organizing Questions

In addition to being organized under sections and subsections, questions can also be sub-questions of a question. Sub-questions can be used to select which question will follow the answer for a branched question. Branched questions include radio buttons or checkboxes. The number of branches depends on the number of radio buttons or checkboxes. The assignment for the next question in a branch is specified on the [Response](#) <sup>106</sup> tab.

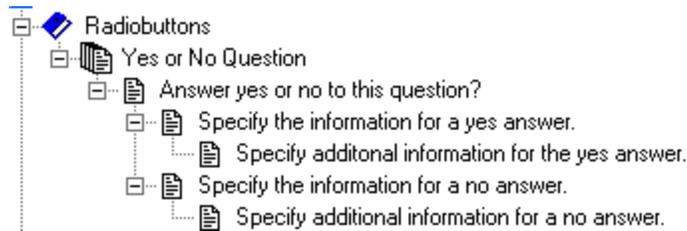
For example, if the question has a yes or no answer, one sub-question can be assigned for a yes answer and another sub-question can be assigned for the no answer.



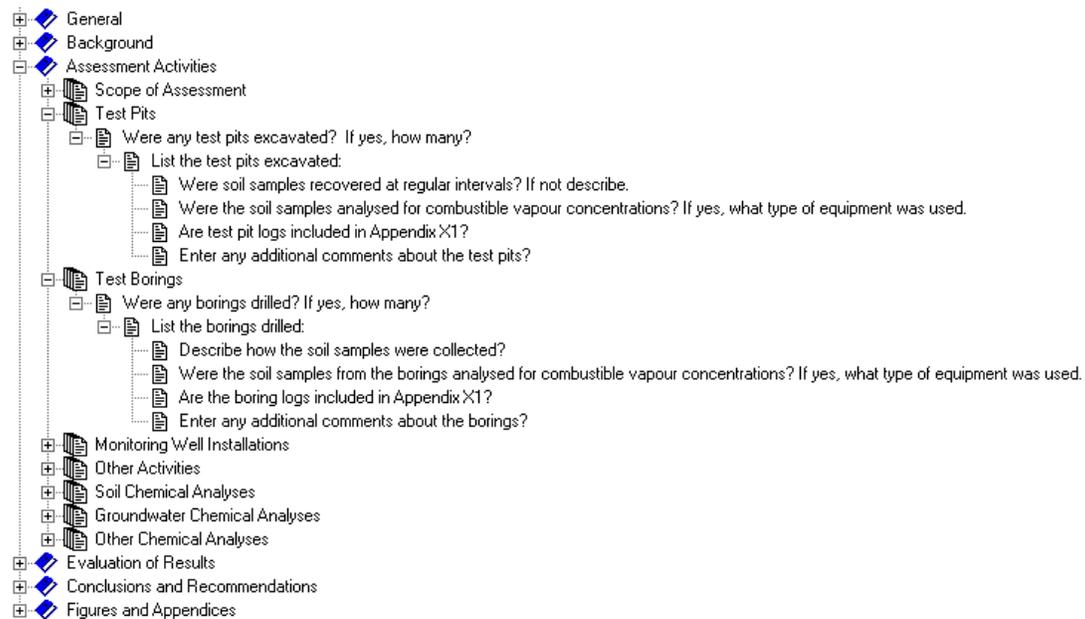
Another example would be a multiple choice question using checkboxes where each sub-question is used to specify the information for each selected checkbox.



Sub-questions can also have sub-questions, this can be used when there are multiple sub-questions for one branch.



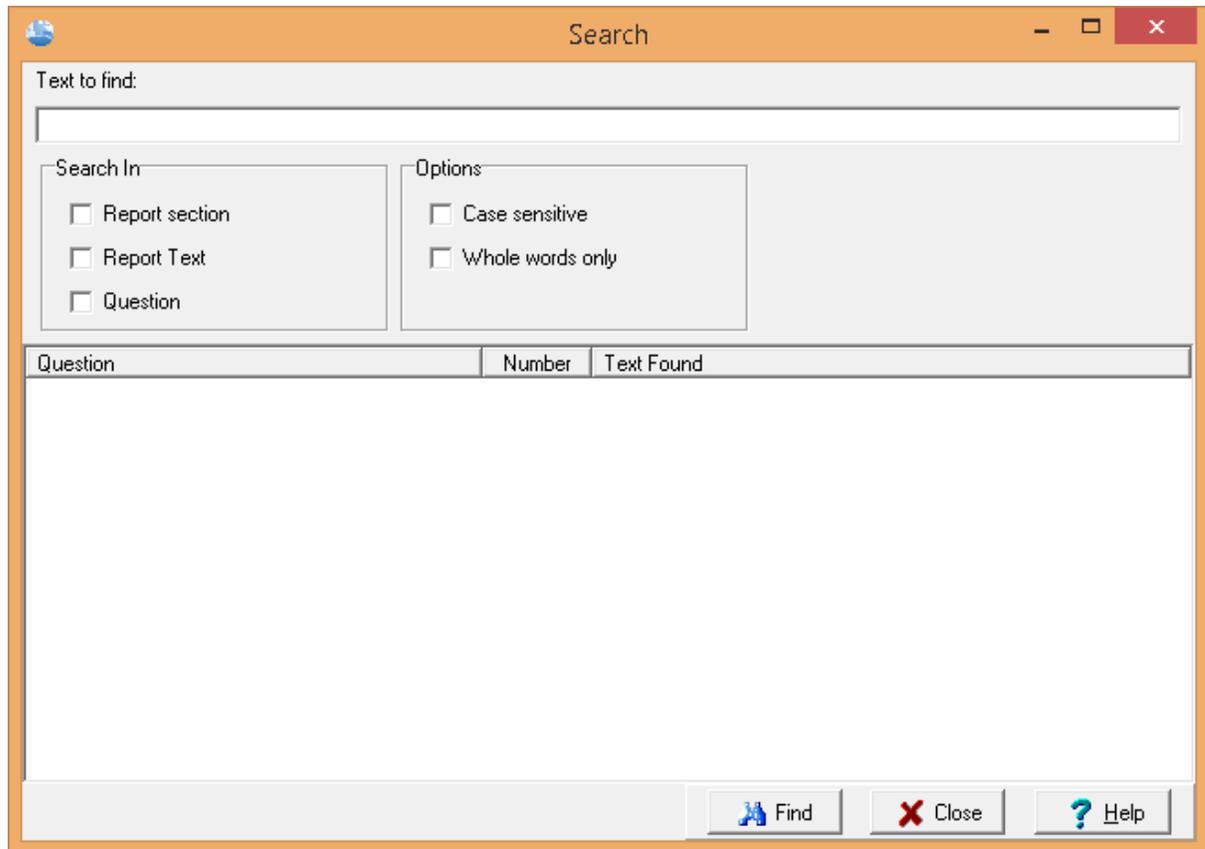
Below is an example used in the ASTM Phase II ESA questionnaire. In this example, if test pits were excavated a list of tests pits is specified and then additional questions are asked about the test pits.



### 3.2.3.6 Finding Text



Text within questions can be located using the Find button or selecting [Edit > Find](#). The Search form will then be displayed.

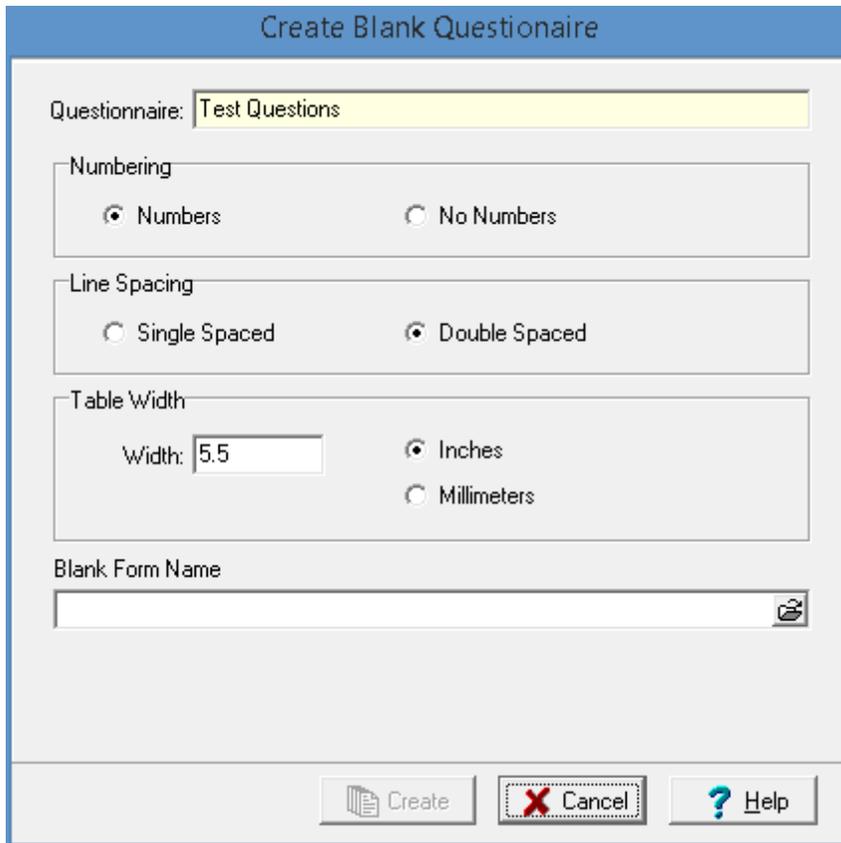

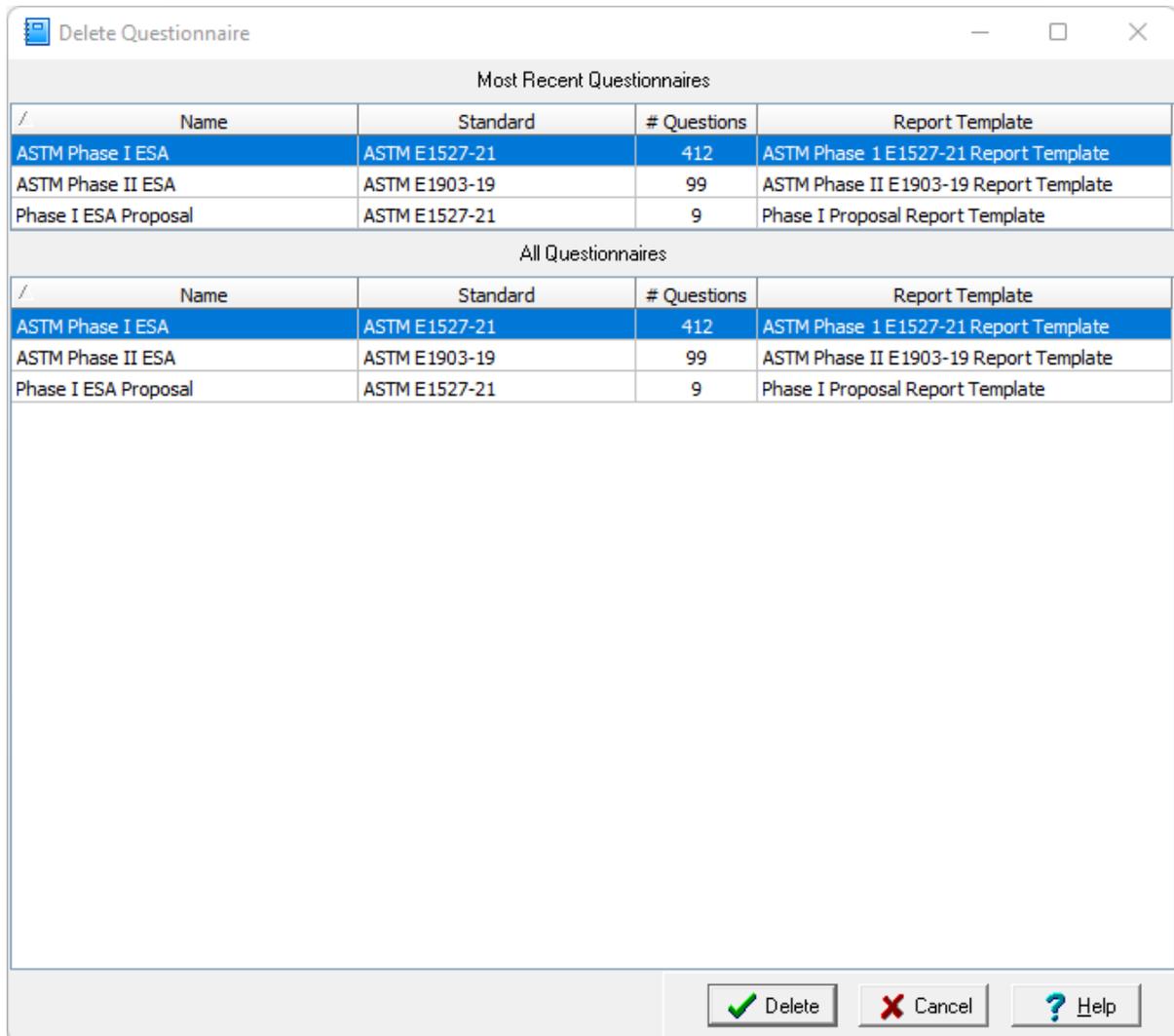

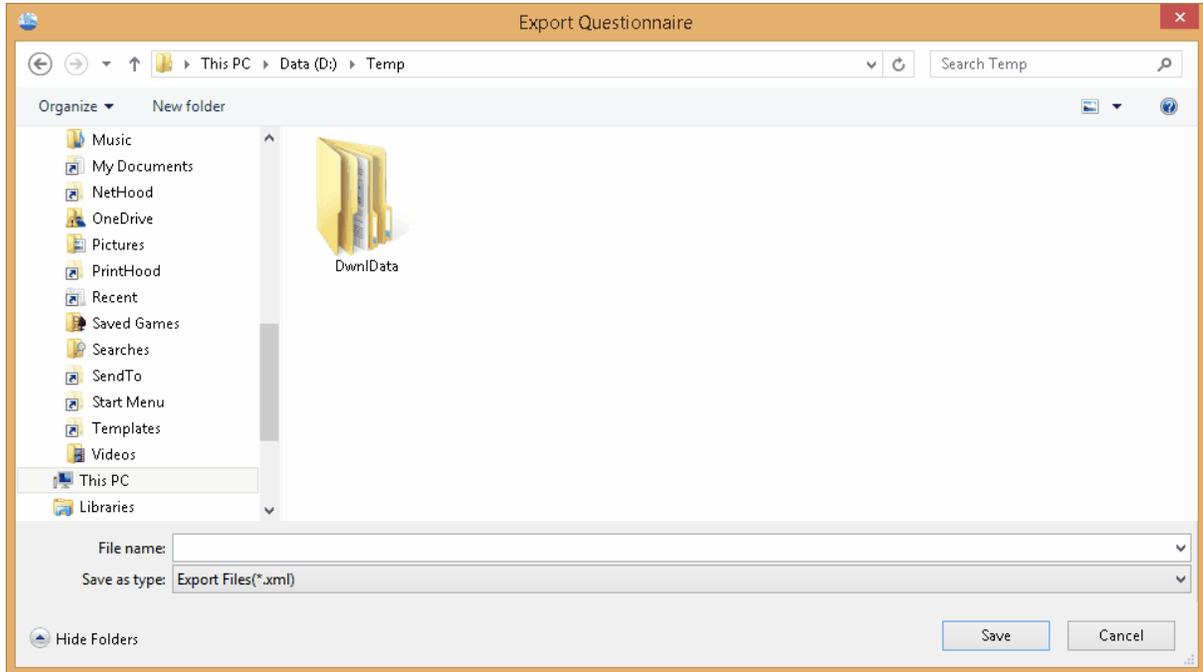
### 3.2.4 Deleting a Questionnaire

A questionnaire can be deleted by selecting *File > Delete > Questionnaire* when no questionnaire is open. The Delete Questionnaire form will be displayed where the questionnaire can be selected and then deleted by pressing the Delete button.



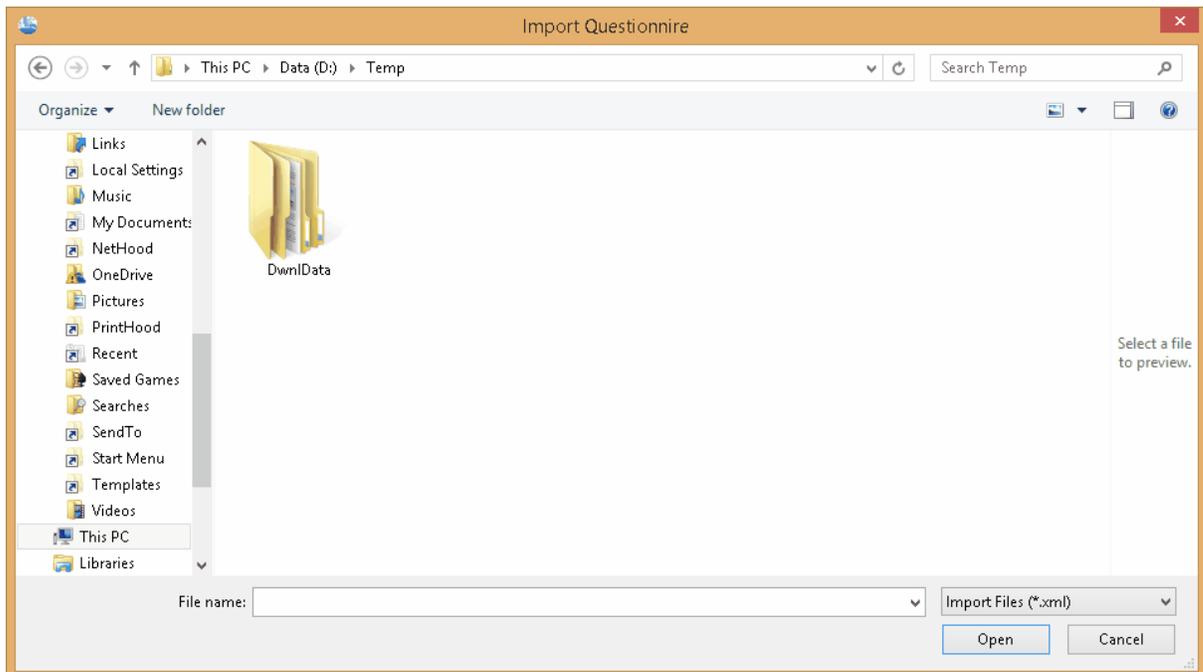
### 3.2.5 Exporting a Questionnaire

To export a questionnaire to an XML exchange file, open the questionnaire then select *File > Export > Questionnaire*. The Export Questionnaire form will be displayed and is used to specify the name of the export file.



### 3.2.6 Importing a Questionnaire

Questionnaires that have been previously exported to XML exchange files, can be imported by selecting *File > Import > Questionnaire* when no project is open. The Import Questionnaire form will be displayed and is used to select the XML exchange file.



### 3.2.7 Importing a Pocket ESA Questionnaire

Prior to importing any Pocket ESA projects, the Pocket ESA questionnaires used by the projects should be imported.

Questionnaires that have been exported from Pocket ESA can be imported by selecting *File > Import > Pocket ESA Questionnaire*. An Import Pocket ESA Questionnaire file dialog form will be displayed to select the questionnaire file to import. The exported Pocket ESA questionnaires are comprised of two files with the ".qtn" and ".rpt" extensions. Select the ".qtn" file in the dialog form.

## **Chapter 4 Projects**

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## Chapter 4 Projects

Projects are the primary building block of E-ASR and are used to encapsulate all the data in the application. The sections below describe how to manage projects, import data into projects, and export data from projects.

## 4.1 Project Management

The initial display of E-ASR will consist of a basemap (or project list) and sidebars on the left and right. The basemap shows your existing projects and any GIS data contained in the web map service. To the left of the basemap, the sidebar usually shows a list of your projects. And the right sidebar usually shows a list of layers in the basemap and an index map. Prior to use projects must either be created or imported. After this they can be selected from the basemap or sidebar and edited.

On the project tree sidebar, projects can be grouped into categories and subcategories. These groupings can be used to sort projects by things such as year, office, and client. The creation and editing of these categories and subcategories is described in the section on editing [project categories](#)<sup>[138]</sup> below. In addition, the most recently opened projects are grouped at the top of the project tree.

Projects can be assigned to a category or subcategory when they are [created](#)<sup>[118]</sup> or edited.

### 4.1.1 Creating a Project

There are two types of projects, georeferenced or local. Georeferenced projects have GIS based coordinates, normally in decimal degrees, and can be seen on basemaps. Whereas, local projects have coordinates in feet or meters and are not shown on basemaps.

#### Georeferenced Project

If the project is to be georeferenced, the area of the basemap where the project is located should be zoomed in on first before creating the project. To assign the project to a category or subcategory on the project tree, highlight the category or subcategory first and then create the project. To create a new georeferenced project either select *File > New > Project > Georeferenced* or click the New button on the main toolbar and select *Project > Georeferenced*.

After this you will need to specify the boundaries of the project on the basemap. To do this click the left mouse button at each of the points on the project boundary, then double click or right click when done. Projects can be square or polygonal. The New Project form will then be displayed. This form has five tabs for a georeferenced project as described in the sections below.

#### Local Project

To create a new local project either select *File > New > Project > Local* or click the New button on the main toolbar and select *Project > Local*. The New Project form will then be displayed. This form has four tabs for a local project as described in the sections below.

#### 4.1.1.1 Project Info Tab

The default coordinate system for georeferenced projects is the WGS 84 geographic system. Alternate geographic or projected coordinate systems can be selected; however, the coordinates stored in the database will be in the default system.

### Coordinate System

**Geographic System:** Select this to specify the boundary in geographic coordinates.

**Projected System:** Select this to specify the boundary in projected coordinates.

**Coordinate System:** This is used to select the geographic or projected coordinate system.

**Degrees Minutes Seconds:** If the selected coordinate system is geographic, select this to specify the coordinates as degrees, minutes, and seconds.

**Decimal Degrees:** If the selected coordinate system is geographic, select this to specify the coordinates in decimal degrees.

### Boundary Points

**Longitude:** If it is a geographic coordinate system, this is the longitude of the boundary point in either decimal degrees or degrees, minutes, and seconds.

**Latitude:** If it is a geographic coordinate system, this is the latitude of the boundary point in either decimal degrees or degrees, minutes, and seconds.

**X Coordinates:** If it is a projected coordinate system, this is the x coordinate of the boundary point.

**Y Coordinates:** If it is a projected coordinate system, this is the y coordinate of the boundary point.

**Add Point:** Press this button to add a point to the boundary.

**Delete Point:** Press this button to delete the selected boundary point.

#### 4.1.1.3 Local Coordinates Tab

The information on the local coordinates tab will depend on whether it is a local or georeferenced project.

##### 4.1.1.3.1 Georeferenced

If the project is a georeferenced project the map coordinates will be in decimal degrees. For display in 3D local coordinates in either feet or meters will need to be assigned. Changing the local coordinates for a project after it has been created is not advisable using this tab, since only project coordinates will be changed and not the borehole or well coordinates. If it is necessary to change the coordinates after boreholes or wells have been created the [Assign Local Coordinates](#)<sup>[137]</sup> function should be used.

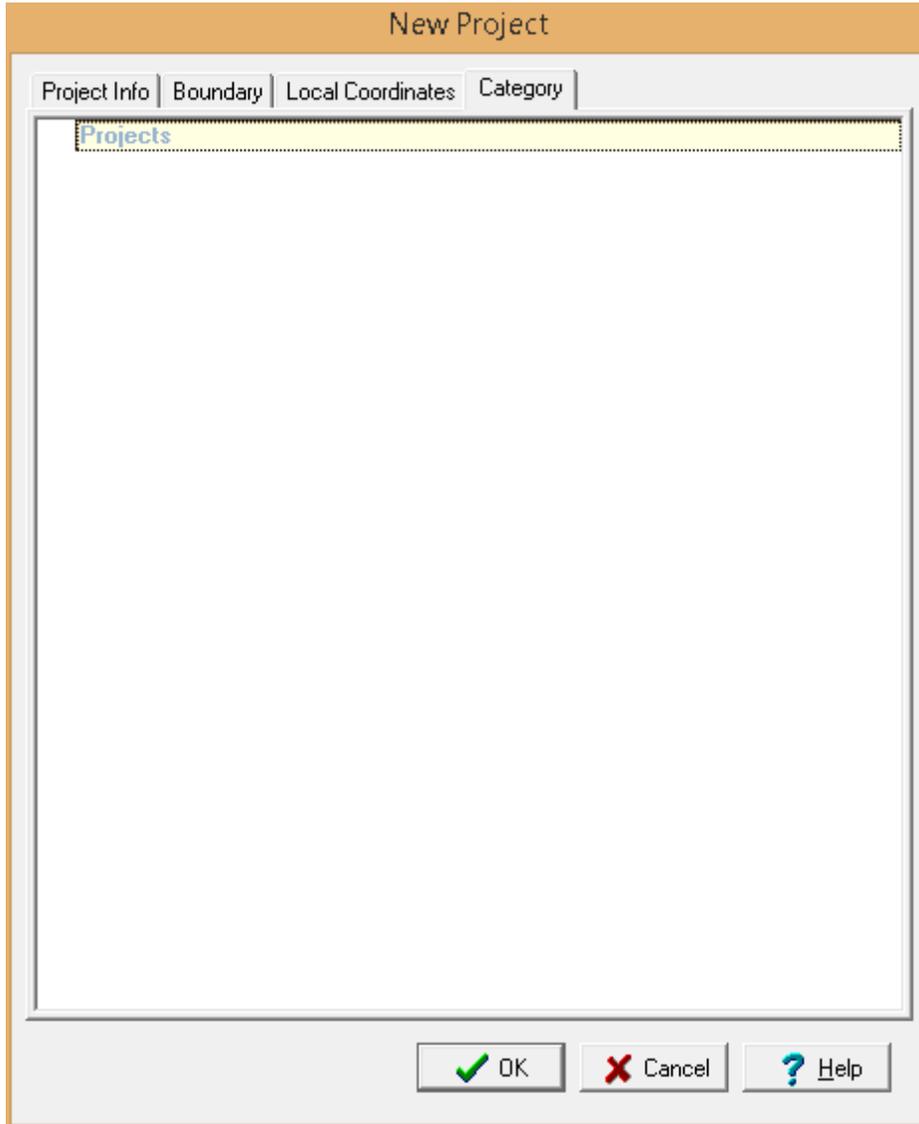

#### 4.1.2 Locating a Project

Georeferenced projects can be located on the basemap by clicking on the project in the sidebar and then selecting *Popup > Locate*. The basemap will then be zoomed in so that the project can easily be identified.

#### 4.1.3 Opening a Project

Projects can either be opened by selecting them from a list or selecting them on the sidebar.

## 4.1.4 Editing a Project

If the project is georeferenced the GIS will show the selected web map service and project boundary; otherwise, for local projects only the project boundary is shown. The project is also used to create and open report responses and reports.

The project information, local coordinates, category, and address can be edited by selecting [Edit > Project Information](#). The Project Information form will be displayed and can be edited as described in [Creating a Project](#) <sup>[118]</sup>.

### 4.1.4.1 Working with Annotation

In addition to GIS data a variety of annotation can be added, edited, and deleted using the Edit menu or Edit toolbar.



Rectangles, polygons, polylines, and points can be placed anywhere on the project and used to show and describe features of the project.

#### 4.1.4.1.1 Rectangles



#### Adding

Rectangles can be added to the project using either [Edit > Rectangles > Add](#) or clicking on the Add option of the Rectangle button menu. You will then need to draw the extents of the rectangle on the map by clicking on one corner and then while holding down the mouse button move the mouse to opposite corner and then release the button. 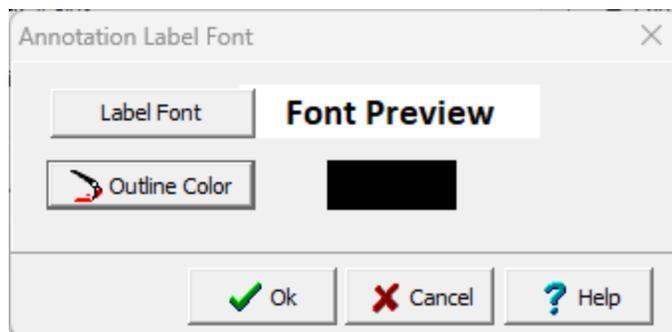

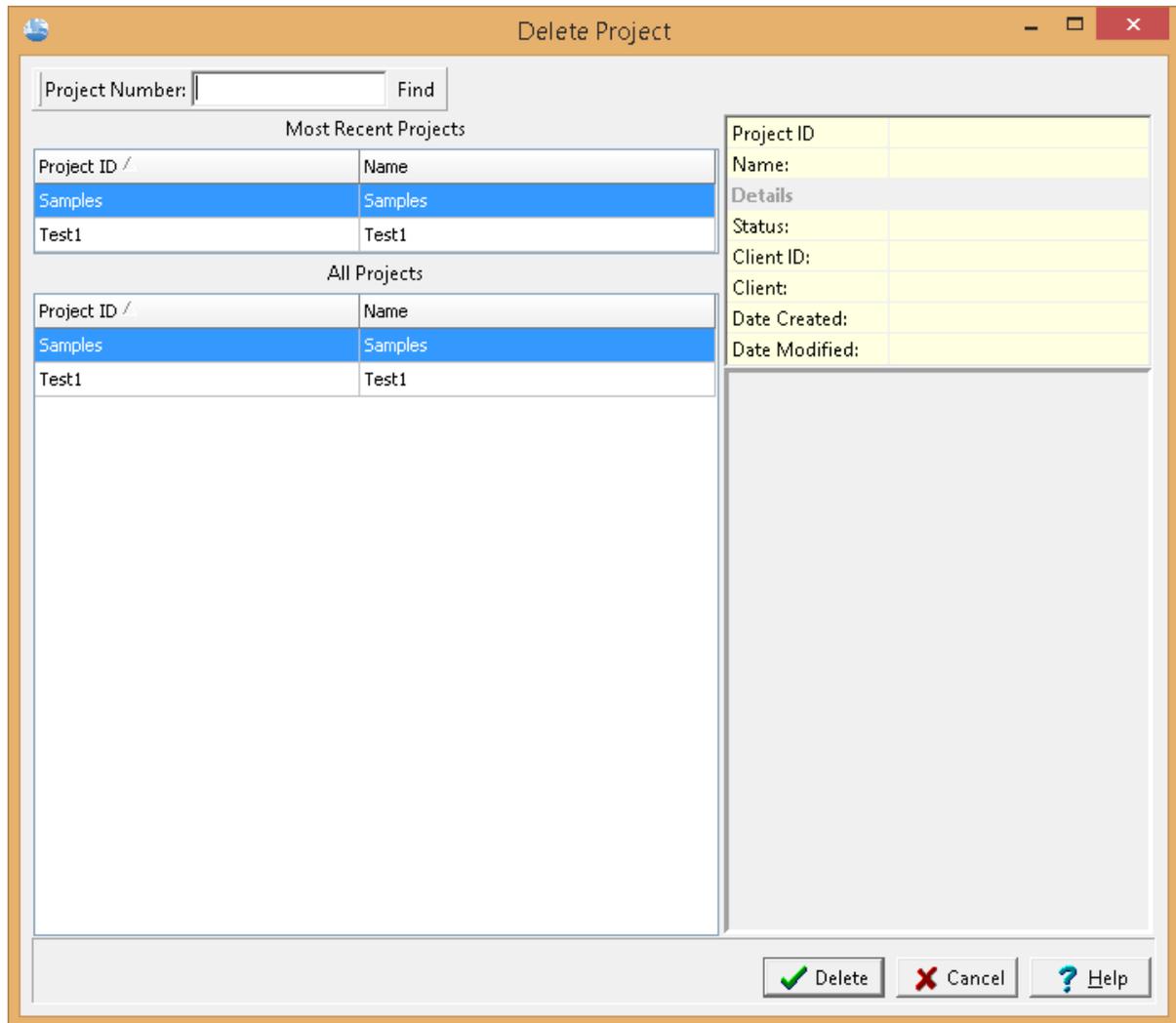

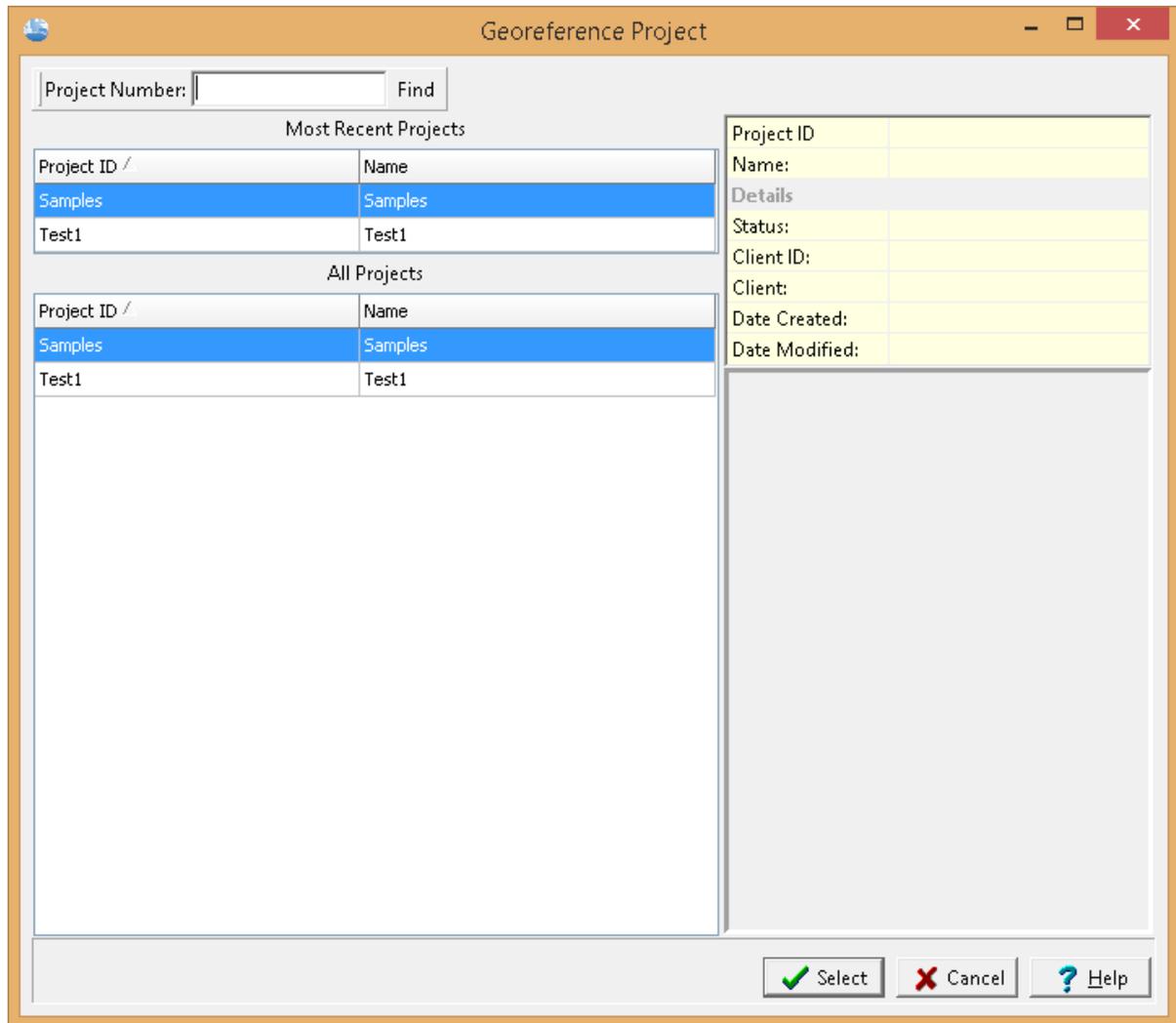

#### 4.1.6 Georeferencing a Project

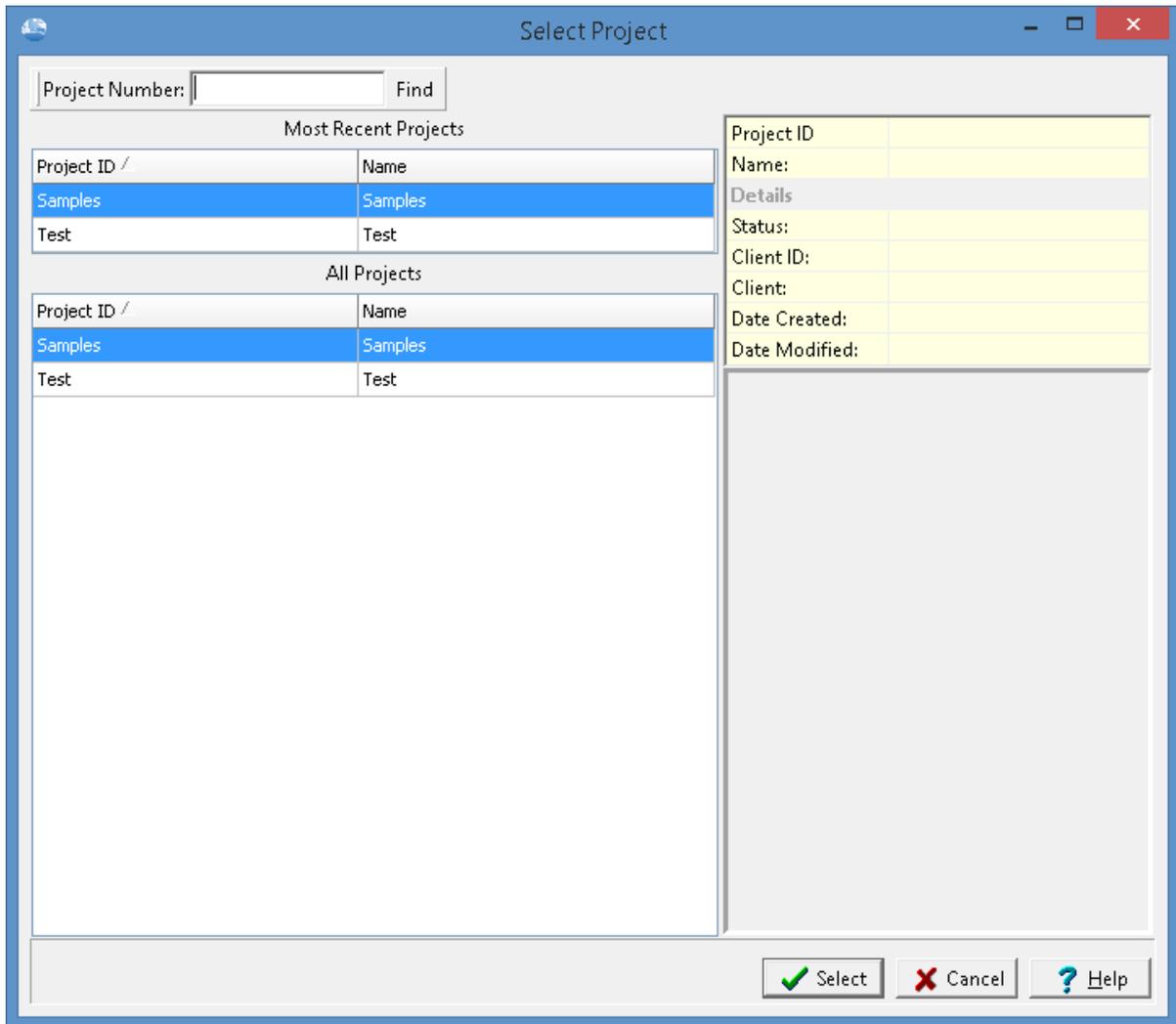

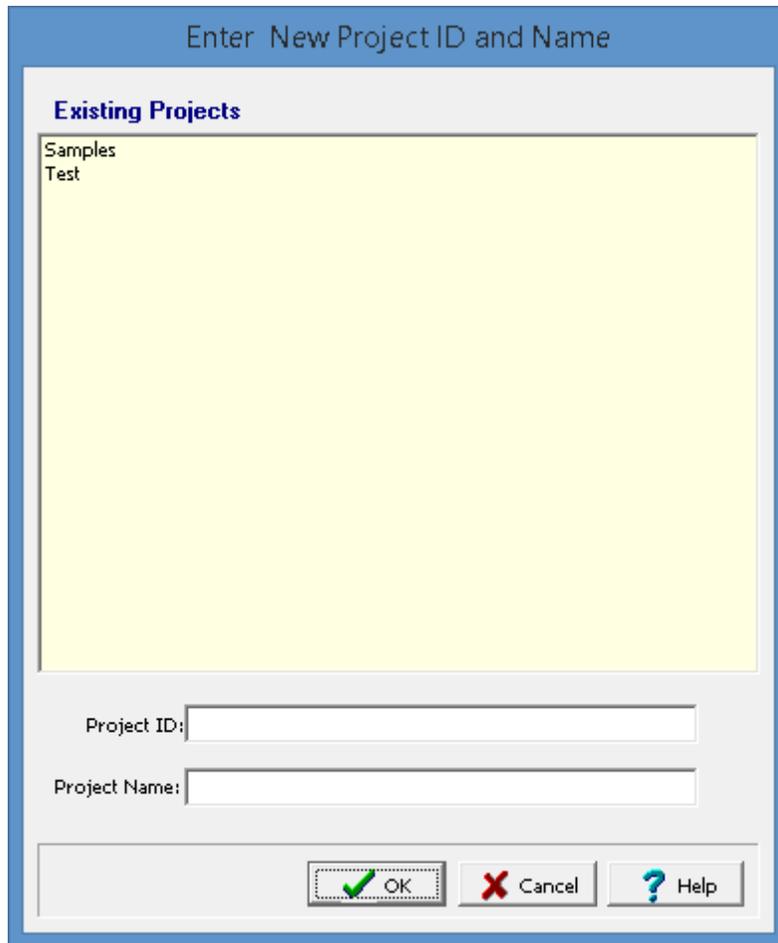

## 4.2 Project Views

Project views are used to display and print the various types of project data. These views can contain a single data element or a collection of data elements. Types of data elements that can be shown in a view include:

- images
- project maps
- title blocks
- scale bars
- graphic objects; such as, text, bitmaps, polygons, lines, etc.

### 4.2.1 Creating a Project View



The project view is based upon the Project Template that is selected when the view is created. To create a project view select *File > New > Project View*. The select Project Template form will be displayed. If a default template has been specified for the project it will be highlighted in the list.

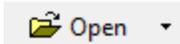

## 4.2.2 Opening a Project View



Project views can either be opened from a list or from the sidebar.

The editing of title blocks is described in the section below.

Annotation on the page document can be added, edited, and deleted the same as with a project template and is described in the section on [Editing a Project Template](#)<sup>152</sup>.

#### 4.2.4 Printing a Project View



The project view can be printed by selecting [File > Print](#) or pressing the Print button on the toolbar.

#### 4.2.5 Sending a Project View to PDF



The project view can be sent to a PDF file by either clicking on the PDF button on the toolbar or selecting [File > Send to PDF](#). The Export to PDF form below will be displayed.

The following can be entered on this form:

**Size:** This is the page size for the PDF file, it can be selected from the list. Both metric and Imperial page sizes can be selected as well as a custom page size specified.

**Inches or Millimeters:** For custom page sizes this is used to select the page units. When standard page sizes are selected the units are selected automatically.

**Width:** This is the width of the page.

**Height:** This is the height of the page.

**Orientation:** The long axis of the page can either be oriented vertically (Portrait) or horizontally (Landscape).

**File Name:** This is used to specify the name of the PDF file. The name and directory can be browsed to using the button on the right.

**Open PDF after creation:** If this is checked the PDF file will be opened after it has been created.

## 4.2.6 Saving a Project View

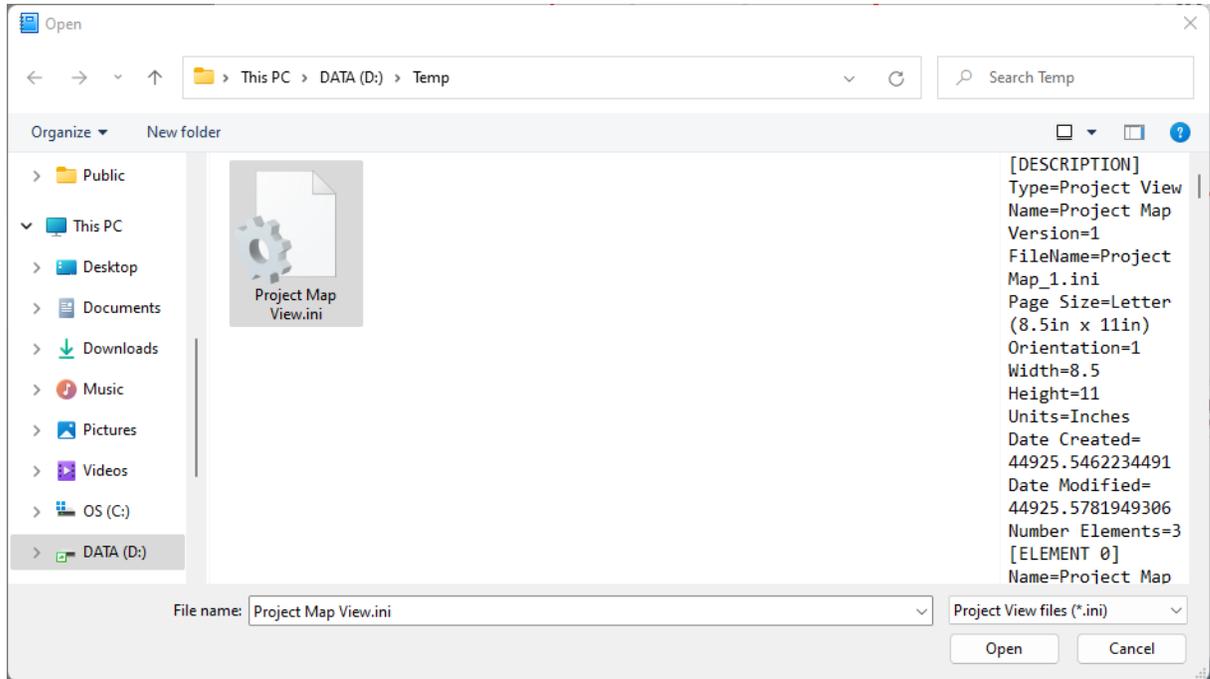


After you are done editing a project view it can be saved either by selecting *File > Save* or by clicking on the Save button.

## 4.3 Project Templates

Project Template are used to store common layouts for project views. These templates can be created and edited by the user. They specify the positions and display properties of data elements (objects) on the page. The templates do not show or store any of the actual data from the application. When a project view is created the data to be displayed will be determined by the template.

### 4.3.1 Creating a Project Template



To create a new template make sure no project is opened and either select [File > New > Project Template](#) or Project Template from the New button menu. After this the New Project Template form below will be displayed. This form has two tabs, on the first tab you can specify the information for the new template and the second tab lists the templates currently in the application.

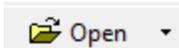

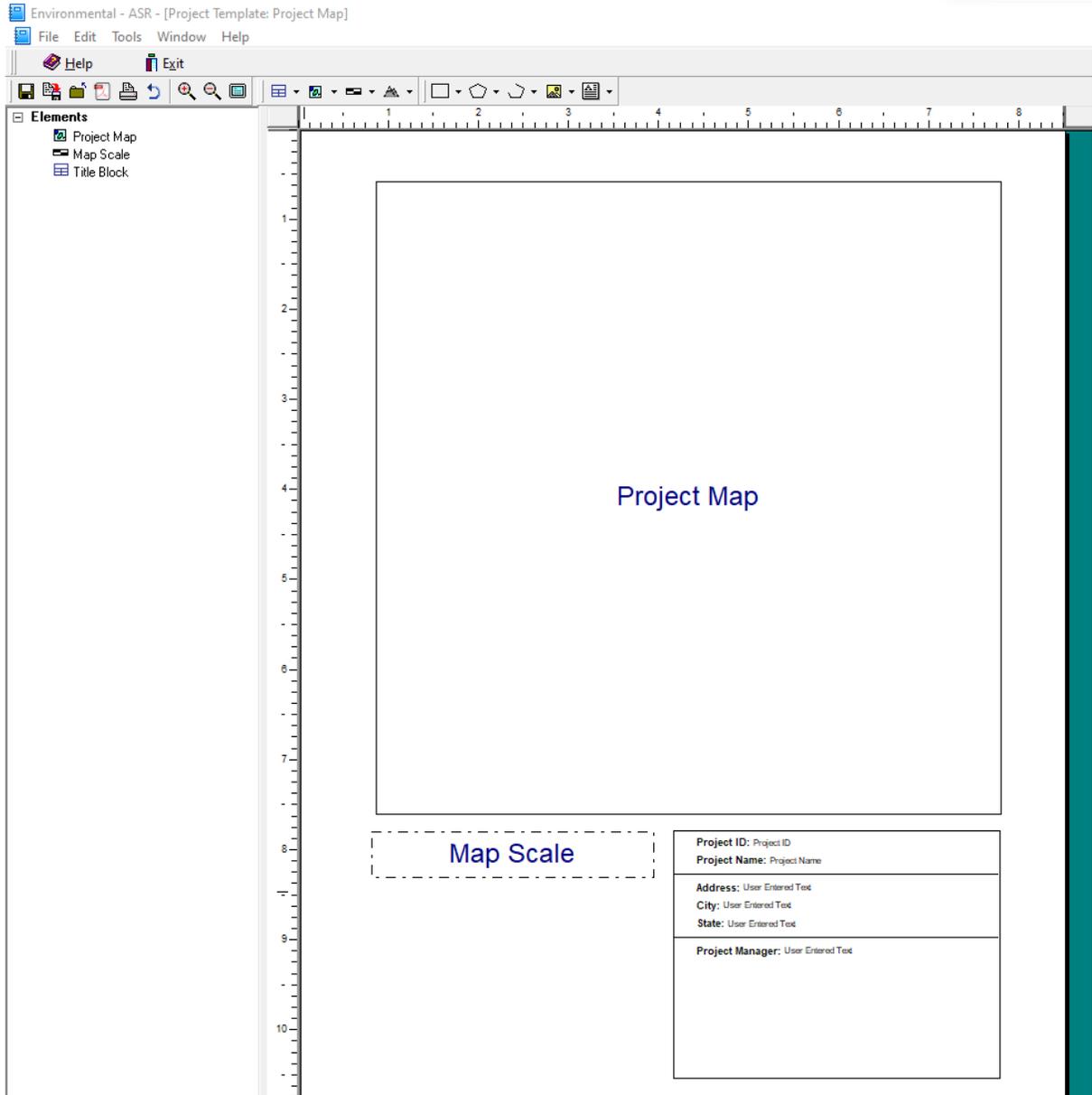

### 4.3.3 Editing a Project Template

After a project template has been created or opened it can be edited. The page layout screen will contain a sidebar, main display area and several toolbars. On the sidebar the existing data elements on the template are displayed. Additional data elements can be added using the data element toolbar.



#### 4.3.3.1 Adding Data Elements



Data elements can be added by clicking on the Add menu item of the data element button on the toolbar or selecting [Edit > Add > data element type](#) and then clicking on the position of the element on the template as described in the sections below.

#### 4.3.3.1.1 Title Blocks



Title blocks are used to show a block of text describing the map. To add a title block to the template click on the Add item of the Title Block button menu and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the Title Block can be edited as described in the [Edit Title Block](#)<sup>[144]</sup> section.

#### 4.3.3.1.2 Project Map



This element displays the project map in a rectangle. It will display the various layers contained in the project. To add a project map to the template click on the Add item of the Project Map button menu and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the Project Map can be edited as described in the [Project Map](#)<sup>[159]</sup> section.

#### 4.3.3.1.3 Map Scalebar



A scalebar is used to display the scale of the project map. To add a scalebar to the template click on the Add item of the Scalebar button menu and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the scalebar properties can be edited as described in the [Edit Scalebar](#)<sup>[159]</sup> section.

#### 4.3.3.1.4 Images



To add an image to the template click on the Add item of the Image button and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the Display Properties form will be displayed where the properties can be edited as described in the [Edit Display Properties](#)<sup>[159]</sup> section. The image to be displayed is selected when creating the actual project view.

#### 4.3.3.1.5 Rectangles



To add a rectangle to the template click on the Add item of the Rectangle button menu and then click on one corner of the rectangle on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After the rectangle has been added it can be edited by clicking on the Select

button and then double-clicking on the rectangle. For a full description on how to edit a rectangle see the section on [Editing Rectangles](#)<sup>[161]</sup>.

#### 4.3.3.1.6 Polygons



To add a polygon to the template click on the Add item of the Polygon button menu and then click on each vertex of the polygon on the template and on the last vertex double click the mouse button. After the polygon has been added, the Polygon form will be displayed where it can be edited as described in the [Edit Polygon](#)<sup>[162]</sup> section

#### 4.3.3.1.7 Polylines



Polylines are used to show a series of joined line segments on a template. To add a polyline to the template click on the Add item of the Polyline button menu and then click on each vertex of the polyline on the template and on the last vertex double click the mouse button. After the polyline has been added, the Polyline form will be displayed where it can be edited as described in the [Edit Polylines](#)<sup>[163]</sup> section.

#### 4.3.3.1.8 Circles



To add a circle to the template click on the Add item of the Circle button menu and then click on the center of the circle and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the outside of the circle. After the circle has been added it can be edited by clicking on the Select button and then double-clicking on the circle. For a full description on how to edit a circle see the section on [Editing Circles](#)<sup>[164]</sup>.

#### 4.3.3.1.9 Bitmaps



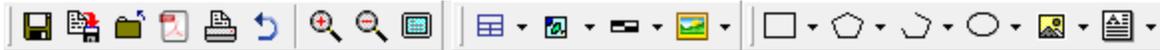
To add a bitmap to the template click on the Add item of the Bitmap button and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the Picture Properties form will be displayed and can be edited as described in the [Edit Bitmaps](#)<sup>[165]</sup> section.

#### 4.3.3.1.10 Text



Text elements are used to add annotation to the template. To add text to the template click on the Add item of the Text button menu and then click on one corner of the element on the template and while holding down the left mouse button drag the cursor to the opposite corner. After this the Text Properties form will be displayed where the text can be edited as described in the [Edit Text](#)<sup>[166]</sup> section.

### 4.3.3.2 Editing Data Elements



After an element has been added to the template, it can be edited by clicking on the Edit item of the button menu for the data element, double-clicking on it in the sidebar, or selecting *Edit > Edit > data element type* and then selecting the element on the page with the mouse. The sections below describe how to edit each element.

#### 4.3.3.2.1 Title Blocks



A title block is divided into a group of boxes containing titles and data. After the title block has been created or selected the Title Block form will be displayed. This form has three tabs for the Layout, Titles & Data, and Interior Lines.

The following information can be entered on this tab:

**Minimum X:** This is the lower boundary in page coordinates.

**Maximum X:** This is the upper boundary in page coordinates.

**Minimum Y:** This is the left boundary in page coordinates.

**Maximum Y:** This is the right boundary in page coordinates.

**Main Title Horizontal Alignment:** This is used to select the horizontal alignment of the main (first) title.

**Main Data Horizontal Alignment:** This is used to select the horizontal alignment of the main (first) data.

**Title Horizontal Alignment:** This is used to select the horizontal alignment of the titles.

**Data Horizontal Alignment:** This is used to select the horizontal alignment of the data.

**Title Vertical Alignment:** This is used to select the vertical alignment of the titles.

**Data Vertical Alignment:** This is used to select the vertical alignment of the data.

**Show Frame:** Check to draw a box around the title block.

**Frame Line Width:** This is the width of the line used to draw the frame.

**Frame Line Color:** This is the color of the line used to draw the frame.

**Frame Gap:** This is the gap between the frame and the drawing portion of the title block.

**Frame Rounding:** This is the percentage of rounding to use at the frame corners. Zero will draw a square corner.

This tab is used to specify the titles and data to display in the Title Block. Titles and data can be added and deleted using the buttons at the bottom of the tab. For each title and data the following can be specified:

**Title:** This is used to specify the text to use for the title.

**Title X:** This is used to specify the horizontal position of the title on the template in page units.

**Title Y:** This is used to specify the vertical position of the title on the template in page units.

**Show:** Check this box to display the title in the Title Block. There is the option to use the title only for prompting for information when the Title Block is filled in later.

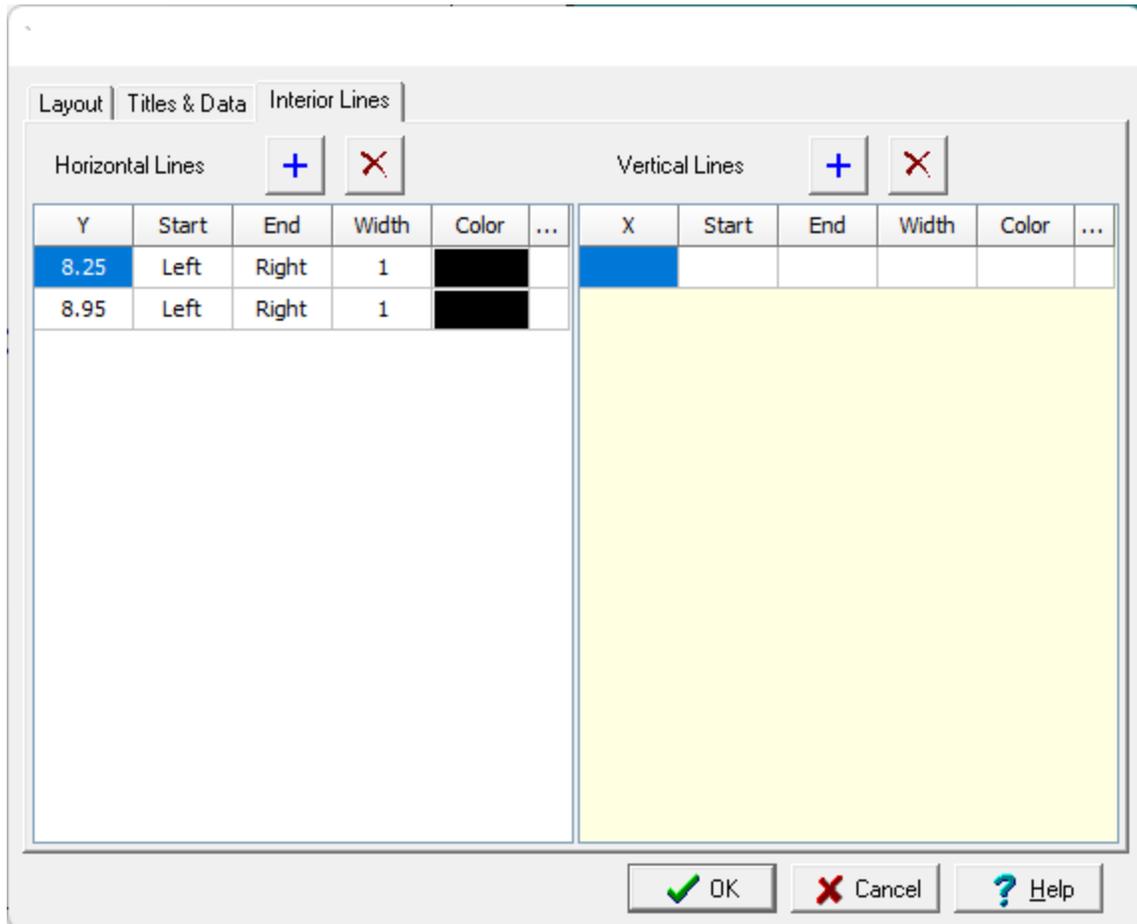
**Title Font:** When this column is clicked on a button will appear. Click this button to select the font for the title.

**Data:** This is used to select the type of data to display for this title. Several types of data can be automatically filled in when the template is used. Alternatively, the text can be filled in at the time the template is used by selecting "User Specified Text".

**Data X:** This is used to specify the horizontal position of the data on the template in page units.

**Data Y:** This is used to specify the vertical position of the data on the template in page units.

**Data Font:** When this column is clicked on a button will appear. Click this button to select the font for the data.



This tab is used to specify horizontal and vertical lines for the Title Block. The lines can be added and deleted using the buttons at the top of the tab. For each line the following can be specified:

**X:** For vertical lines this is used to specify the horizontal position of the line on the template.

**Y:** For horizontal lines this is used to specify the vertical position of the line on the template.

**Start:** This is used to specify the start of the line. For horizontal lines they can either be started on the left side of the Title Block or the position of the start can be specified numerically. And for vertical lines they can either be started on the top side of the Title Block or the position of the start can be specified numerically.

**End:** This is used to specify the end of the line. For horizontal lines they can either end at the right side of the Title Block or the position of the end can be specified numerically. And for vertical lines they can either end at the bottom side of the Title Block or the position of the end can be specified numerically.

**Width:** This is used to specify the width of the line.

**Color:** Click this button to select the color for the line.

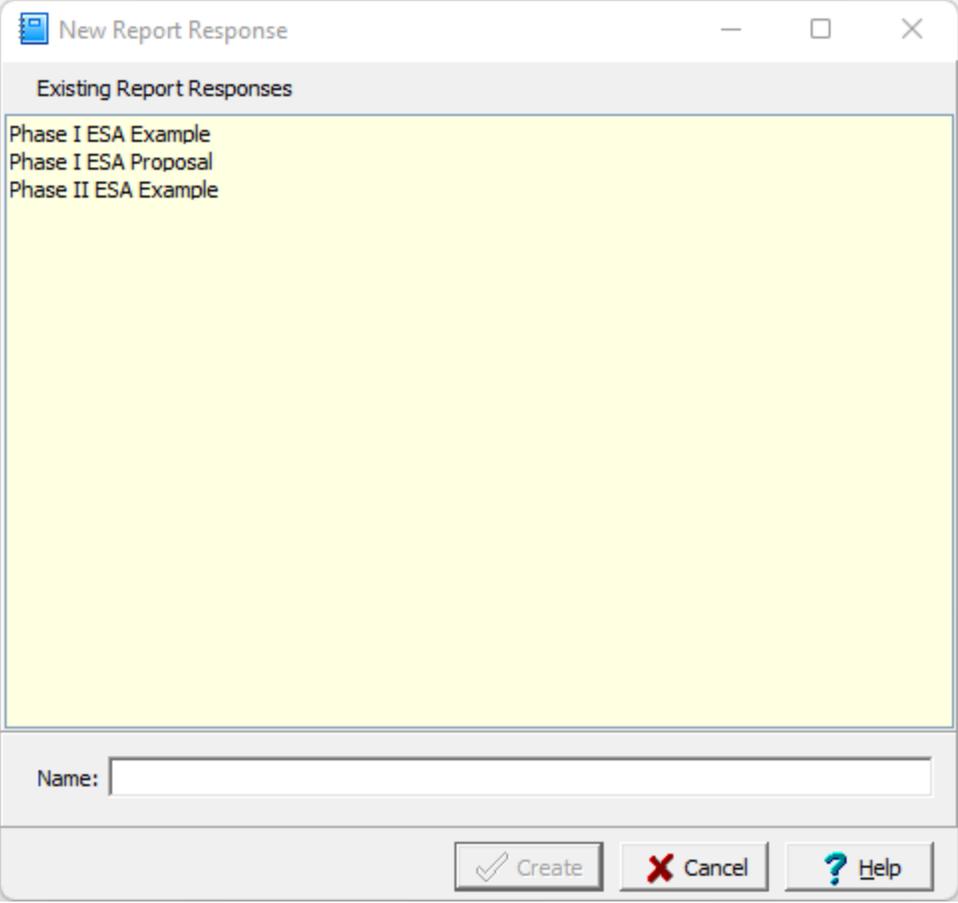
## Chapter 5 Report Responses

After a questionnaire has been created, report response data can be entered and reports generated. All report responses are organized into projects. You can have an unlimited number of projects and each project can contain an unlimited number of reports.

Before the data for a report can be entered, either a new project must be created or an existing project opened. The created or opened project is then referred to as the current project. After the project has been opened, a new report response can be created and existing report responses can be edited.

## 5.1 Creating a Report Response

To create a new report response make sure that a project has been opened and then select the [New > Report Response](#) from the toolbar or [File > New > Report Response](#). The New Report Response form will be displayed.

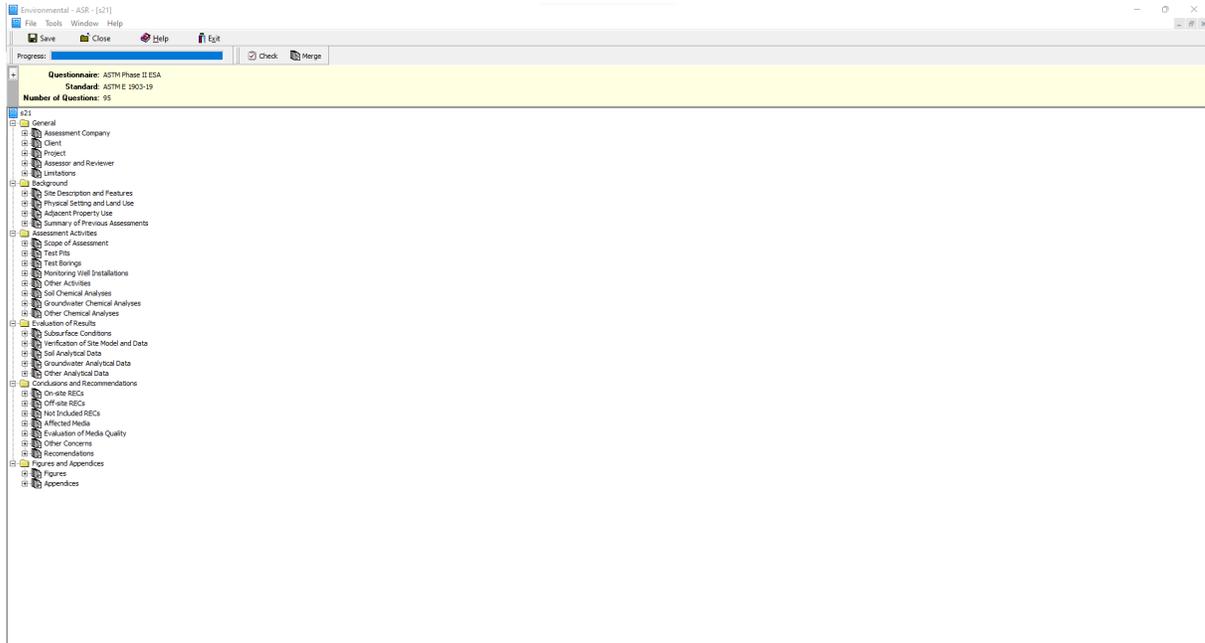

## 5.3 Editing a Report Response

After a report response has been created or opened, a tree view will be displayed showing the sections, subsections, and questions specified in the questionnaire.



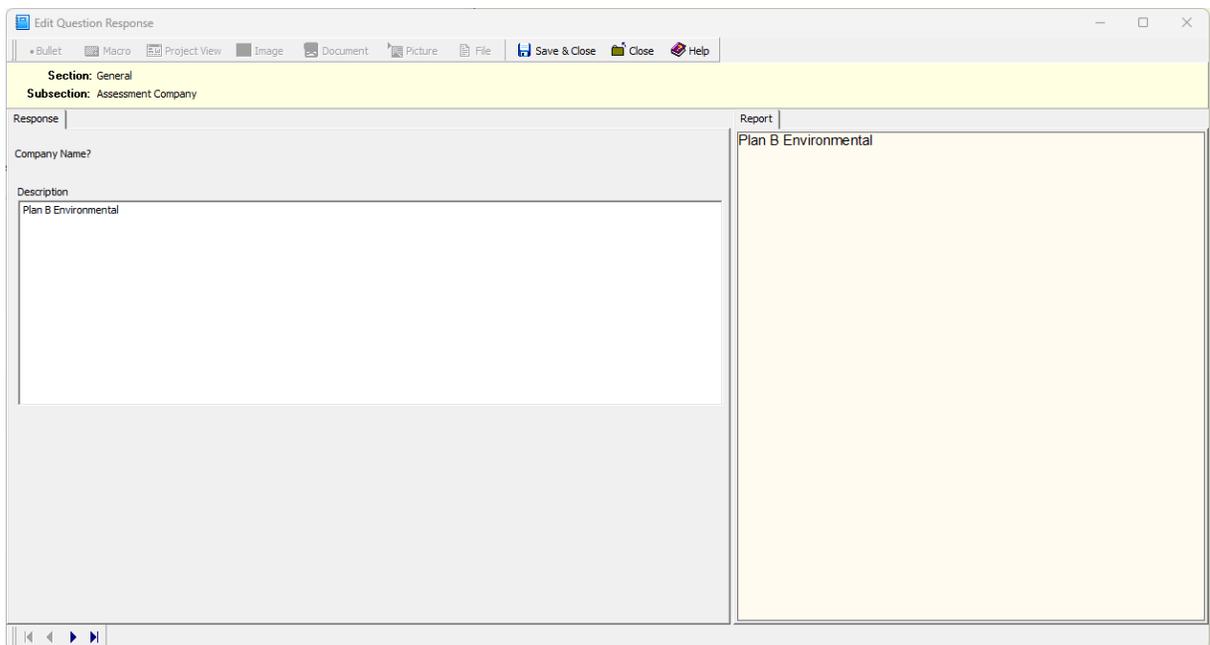
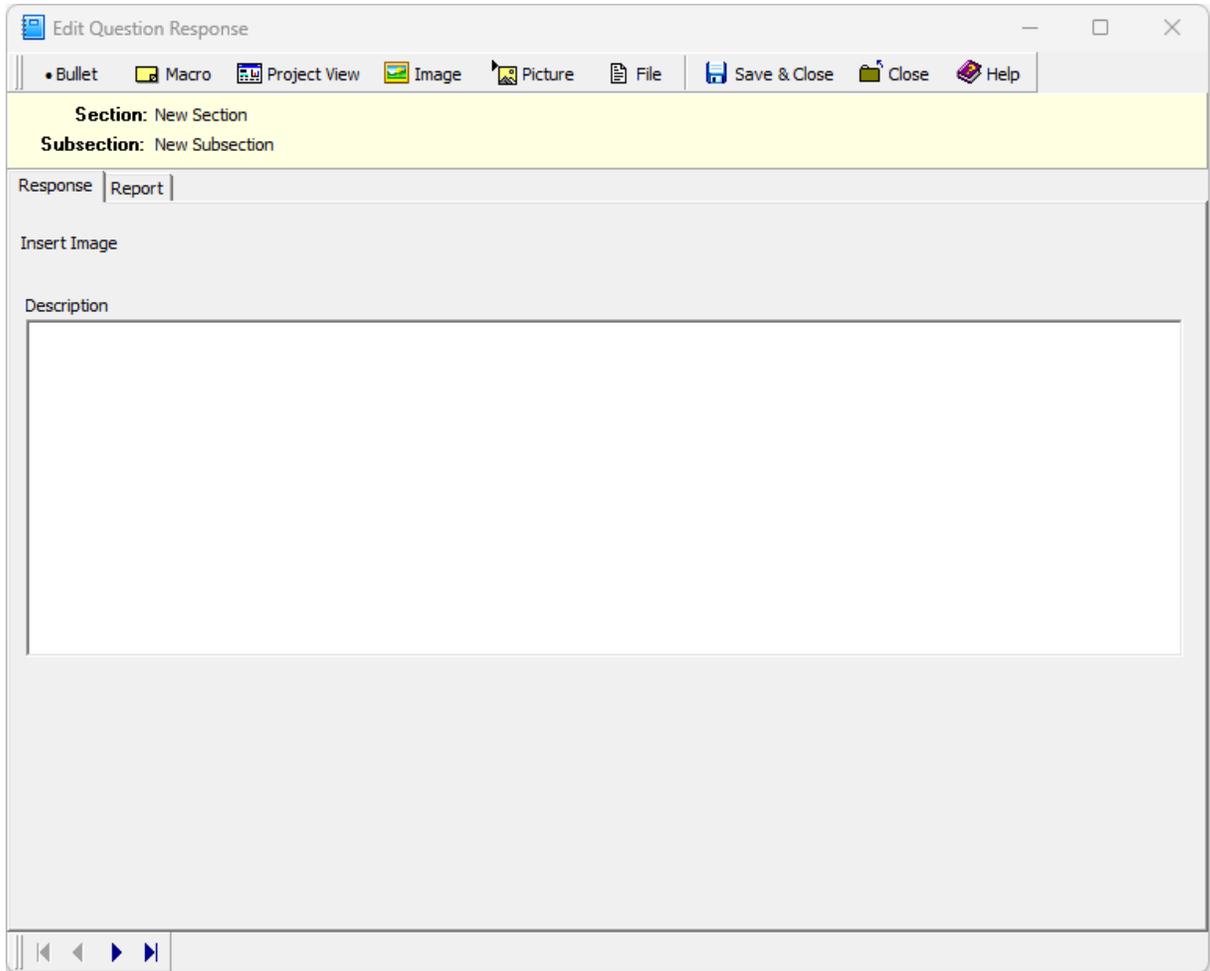
Sections in the tree view can be expanded and collapsed by double clicking on the section name. When the section is collapsed only the section is displayed and the subsections are hidden. When the section is expanded all of the subsections are displayed below the section. Subsections can contain one or more questions and can be expanded or collapsed by double clicking on the subsection name. When the subsection is collapsed only the subsection is displayed and the questions are hidden. When the subsection is expanded all of the questions are displayed below the subsection.

The response for a question can be entered by double-clicking on the question or highlighting the question then selecting Open from the popup menu. The editing of a question response is described in the [section 188](#) below.

At the top of the form the progress through the questionnaire is shown as well as buttons to [check the answers](#) [199](#) and to [merge the report response with the report template](#) [200](#) to create a Word report document.

### 5.3.1 Editing a Question Response

When a question response is selected for editing the Edit Question Response form will be displayed. This form will be displayed either with two tabs (one for the Response and one for the Report preview) or with the Response on the left and the Report preview on the right. The type of display is set in [Preferences](#) [41](#).



At the top of the form there are buttons for the following:

**Bullet:** This is used to insert a bullet into your answer. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box.

**Macro:** This is used to insert a text macro into the answer for a question. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box. When this button is pressed the Select Macros form will be displayed. A text macro can be inserted by selecting the Macro Section and then the Macro.

**Project View:** This is used to insert a previously saved project view into the answer for the question. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box. When this button is pressed you will be asked to select the project view to insert.

**Image:** This is used to insert an image from the project into the answer for the question. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box. When this button is pressed you will be asked to select the image to insert.

**Picture:** This is used to insert a picture into the answer for a question. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box. When this button is pressed a file dialog form will be displayed to select the picture file. Picture files can be "png", "jpg", "jpeg", "bmp", "emf", "wmf", "gif", or "tiff".

**File:** This is used to insert a file into the answer for a question. This button is only enabled if the answer field is an edit or memo box. When this button is pressed a file dialog form will be displayed to select the file. The files can be "txt", "xml", "html", "doc", "docx", or "pdf".

**Save & Close:** This is used to save the changes and close the form.

**Close:** This is used to close the form.

**Help:** This is used to display help on the form.

At the bottom of the form there are buttons that can be used for the following:

- ◀ Go to the first question (short cut key is Home)
- ◀ Go to the previous question (short cut key is Page Up)
- ▶ Go to the next question (short cut key is Page Down)
- ▶ Go to the last question (short cut key is End)

#### 5.3.1.1 Response

The Response portion of the form is used to enter the response to a question. The possible responses will depend on the question type for the question. Some examples are shown below.

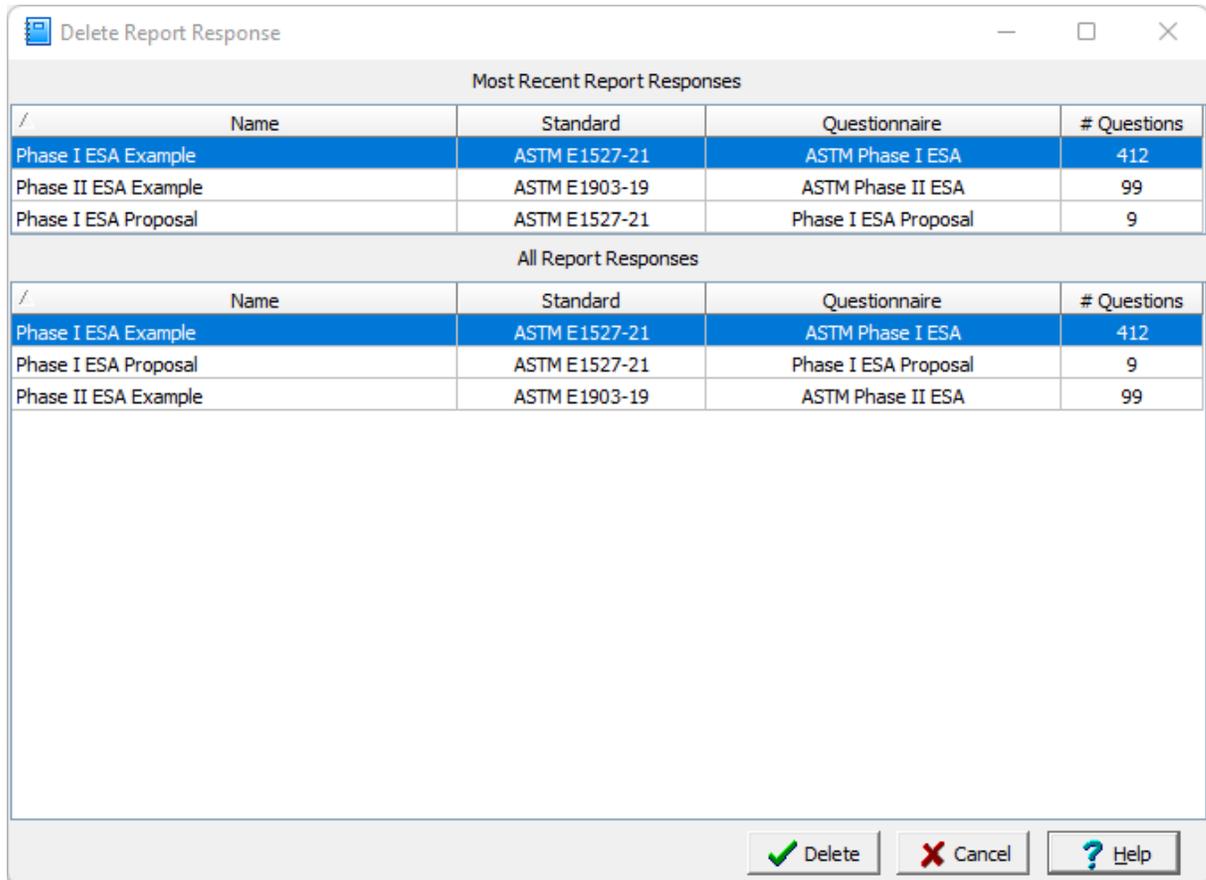

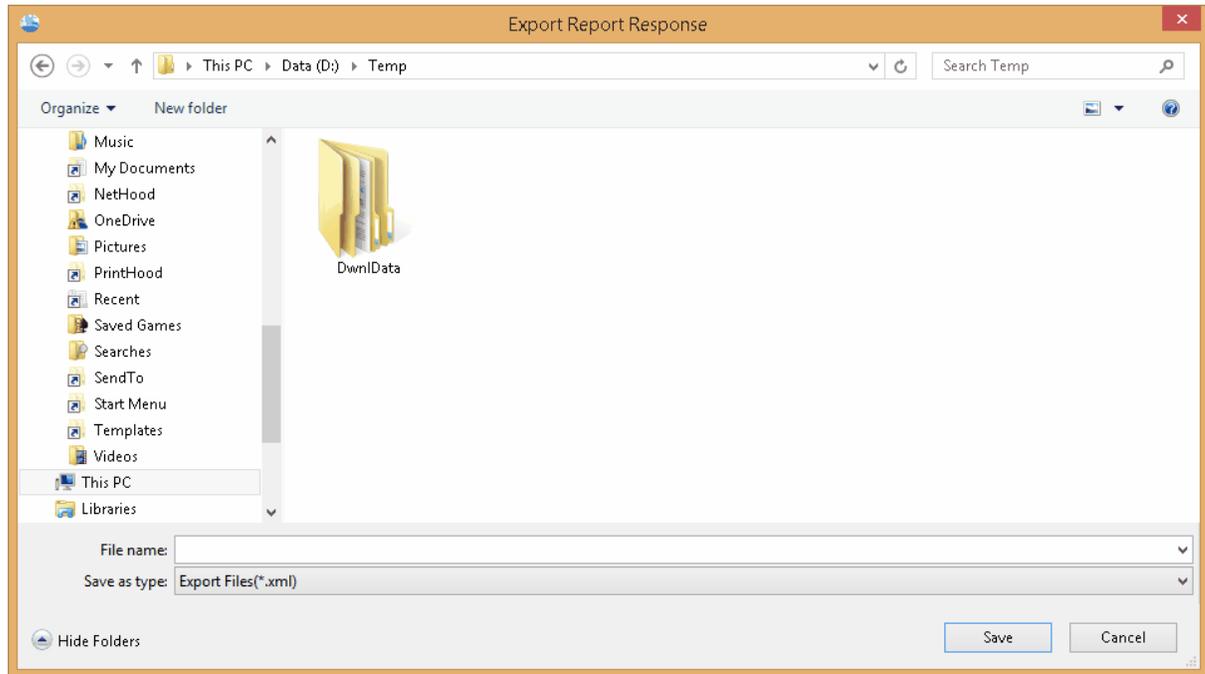

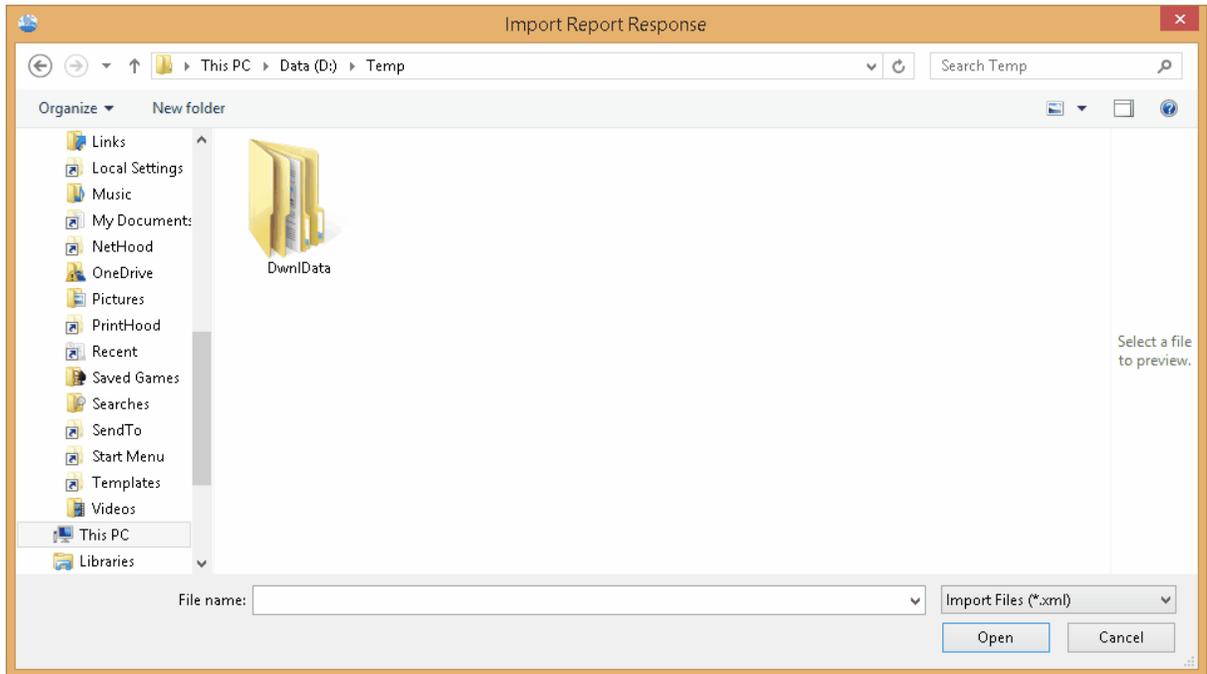

## Chapter 6 Merging Responses

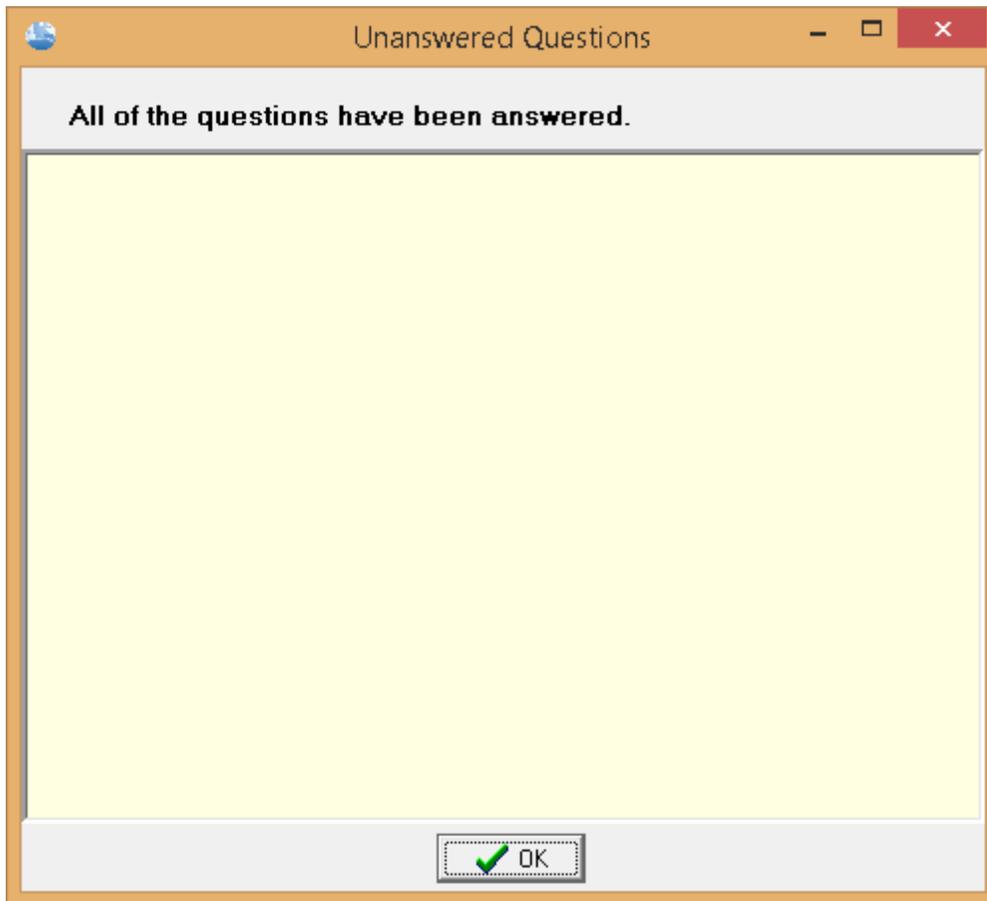
After the report response data has been entered it can be merged with the report template to create the final report. During the merging process the keywords in the report template are replaced by the text associated with each of the answers to the questionnaire questions.

When the merging is complete a final report will be created in Microsoft Word format. This report can then be edited in Word to include any additional information or formatting.

## 6.1 Checking Report Responses



Prior to merging the report responses, they should be checked to ensure that all of the questions in the questionnaire have been answered. To check the report responses click on the Check button on the toolbar. The Unanswered Questions form will be displayed showing any unanswered questions.



## 6.2 Merging Report Responses



To merge a report response and create a final report, open the report response then click on the Merge button on the toolbar. The Merge Report Responses form will be displayed. This form has two tabs, the second tab shows a list of existing reports in the project.

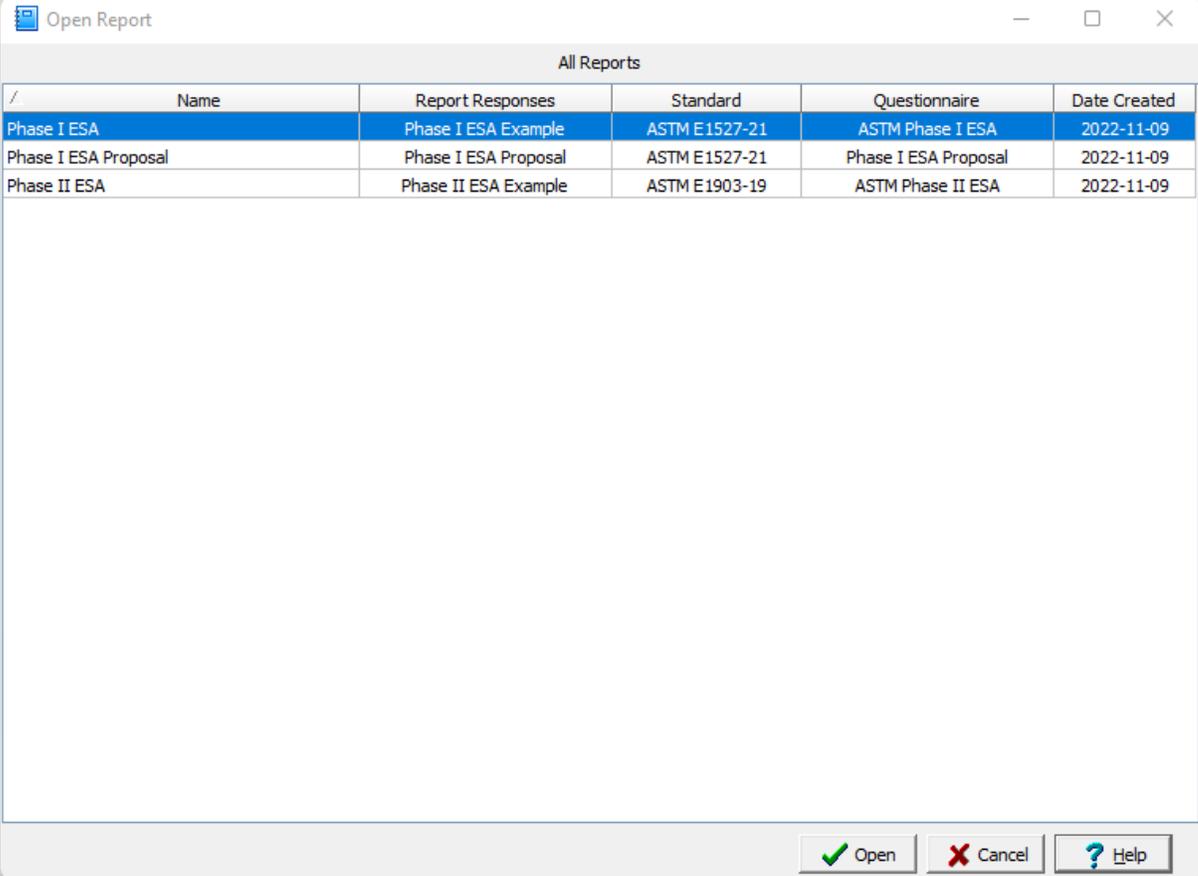

After the name has been specified, click on the Merge button to create the final report. When the merge process is complete the report will be opened in Word and will be added to the Reports section on the sidebar of the project.



## 6.3 Opening Reports

After a report response has been merged to create a report, the report will be added to the Reports section on the sidebar or the Project. To open one of these reports in Word double-click on it or highlight it and select *File > Open > Report*. The Open Report form will be displayed.

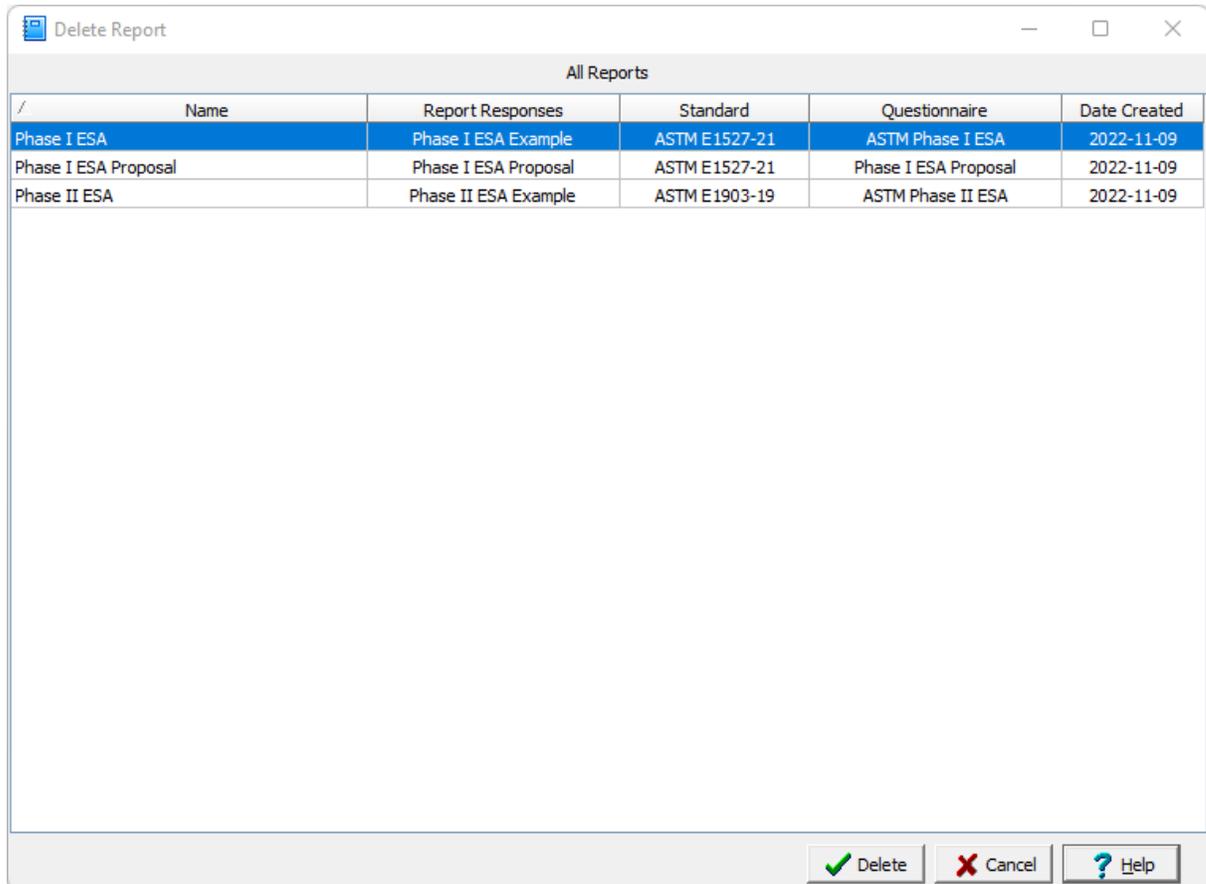

# **Chapter 7 Data and User Management**

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## Chapter 7 Data and User Management

This application provides functionality for both data and user management. In addition, it also provides for data security. The application can be used either as a standalone program or in a network configuration. When used in a network configuration, the network license manager handles the licensing and user administration.

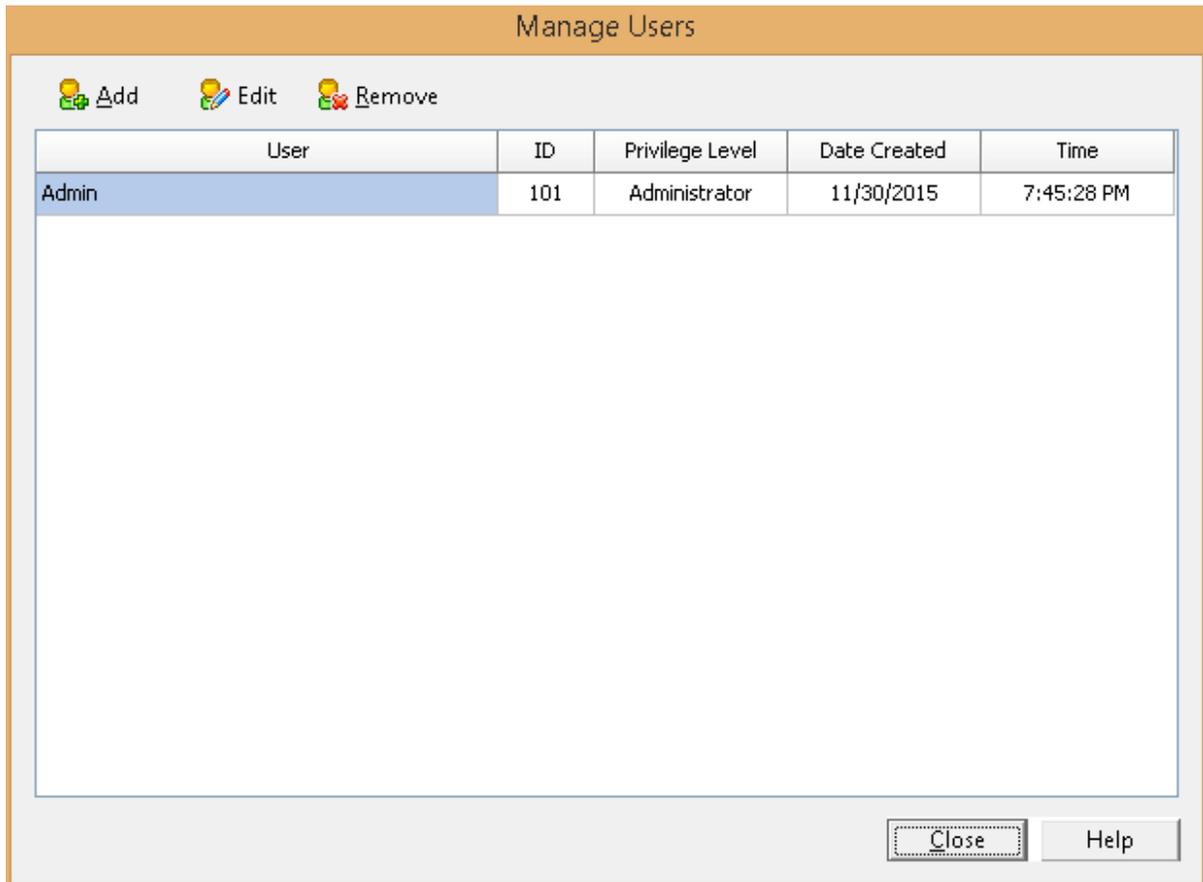
## 7.1 Security and User Administration

This application has several features to assist in the administration of users and to provide data security.

### 7.1.1 User Administration

When the application is started users (both local and network) must login to the application. When users are setup in the application they are assigned a username, password, and user type (privilege). Different privilege levels are used to control access to functions of the program and data. The different user types are administrator, power user, limited user, and guest. The functionality of different privilege levels is described in the [User Privilege Level Functionality](#)<sup>[208]</sup> section below.

If it is a network version, the user must login as a network user that is setup in the [Network License Manager program](#)<sup>[223]</sup>. If it is a local single user computer version of the application, local users can be setup by the administrator by going to *Tools > Manage Local Users*. The Manage Users form will be displayed showing the current local users

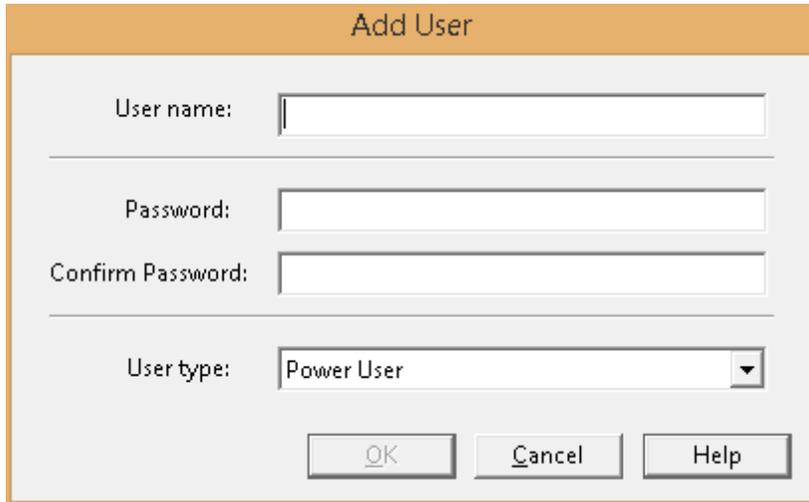

### 7.1.1.1 Adding a Local User

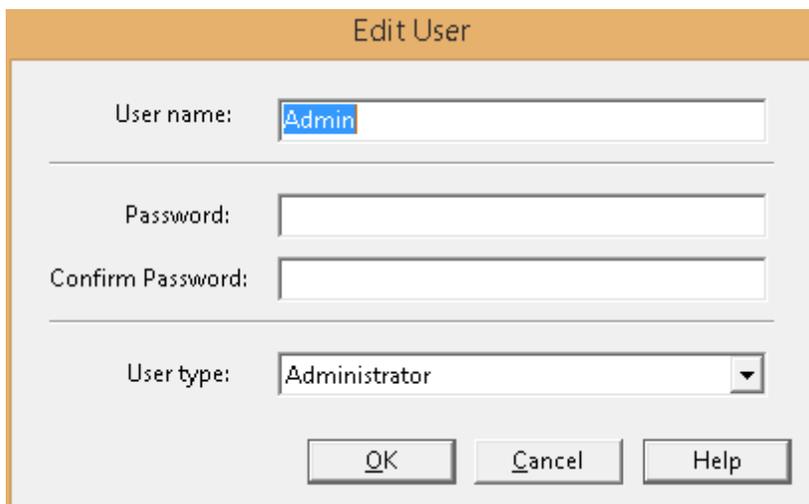
To add a local user click on the Add button at the top of the Manage Users form, the Add User form below will be displayed. This form is used to enter the user name, password, and user type for the account. The user name should be unique for each user.

## 7.2 Database Management

The data in this application is stored in a main database and project databases. These databases are backed up at regular intervals and if necessary can be restored from backup copies.

### 7.2.1 Backing up a database

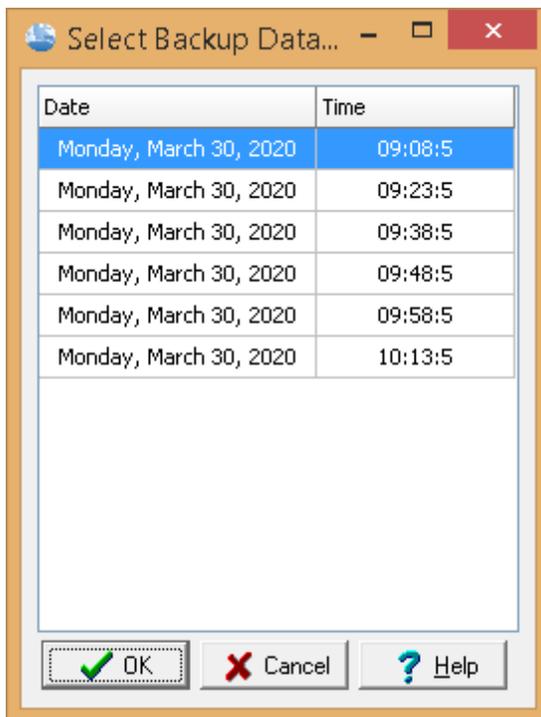
The main database and current project database are backed up at regular intervals. These intervals are set in the [preferences](#) for the program. A project database will only be backed up if the project is currently open.

### 7.2.2 Restoring a database

If necessary due to data corruption or some other problem, a database can be restored from a backup. The sections below describe how to restore the main database and project databases.

#### 7.2.2.1 Restoring the Main Database

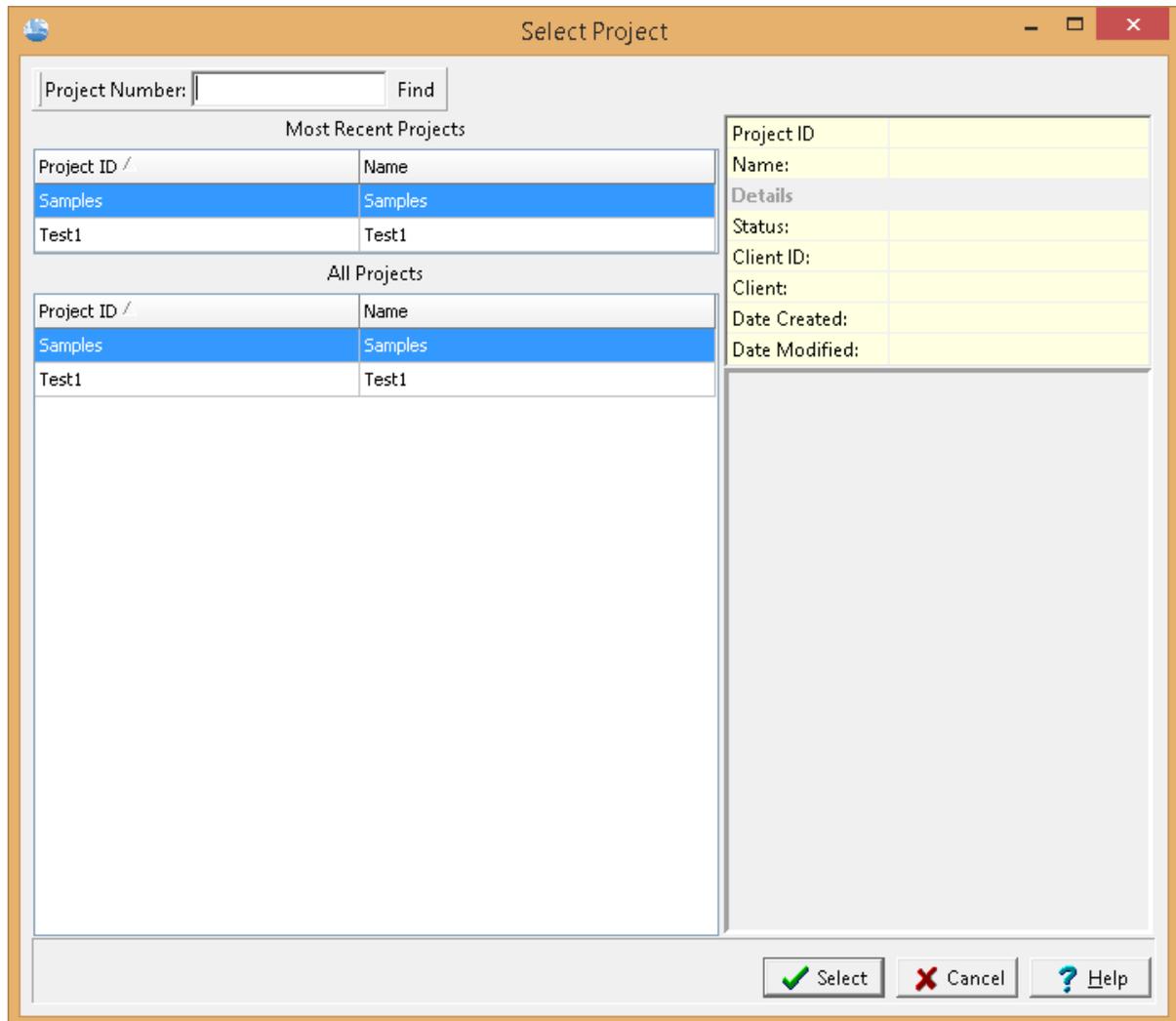
To restore the main database, select *Tools > Databases > Restore > Main Database* and the Select Backup Database form below will be displayed.



This form lists the backups by date and time. Select the database to restore from the list and then click on the Ok button. If you choose to proceed with the restoration, the main database will be replaced by the backup and the application will be restarted.

### 7.2.2.2 Restoring a project database

To restore a project database, select *Tools > Databases > Restore > Project Database* and the Select Project form below will be displayed. To backup a project database, no project can be currently open.



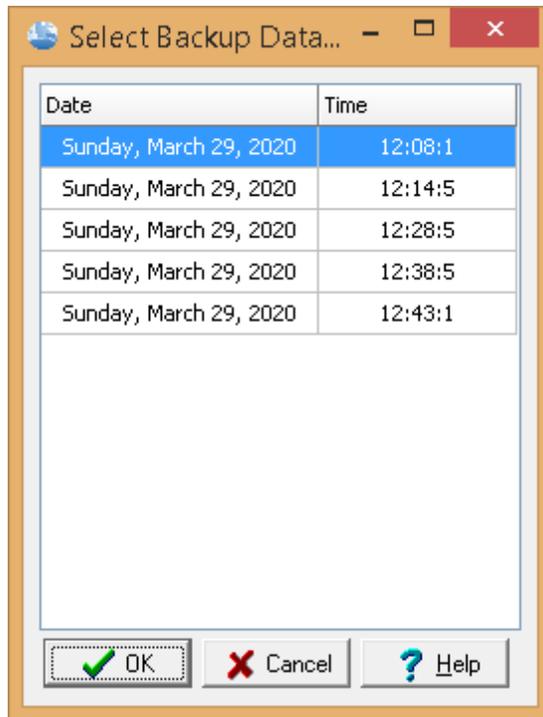

## 7.3 Network License Management

The application can be licensed on individual computers, a network, or a combination of both. When licensed on a network the licensing is based on concurrent usage, where the number of concurrent users must be less than or equal to the maximum number of users licensed. This means that the program can be installed on any number of computers in the office but only the licensed number of concurrent users can use it at the same time.

The sections below describe the installation for both the server and client computers and how to manage the network using the License Manager.

### 7.3.1 Installation

When the application is managed on a network the databases and datastore for the application are also normally stored on the network server. There are two ways to install the databases and datastore on the server. The easiest method is to install the application on the server and select the location of the database and datastore directories when the application is first run on the server. Alternatively, if you prefer not to have the application on the server you can install it on a client computer and set the database and datastore directories to the server when the application is first run on the client.

After the databases and datastore have been installed on the server it is important not to overwrite them each time the application is installed on a client computer. To do this make sure you answer "No" to the last question about installing the databases and datastore when the program is first run on a client computer. Instead database and datastore directories should be set to the server when the application is first run.

**It is important to make sure that the directories on the server where the databases and datastore are located are shared and have their file access permissions set to "Full Control" for all users.**

#### 7.3.1.1 Server Installation

To get the network up and running, the network license service and network license monitor program first need to be installed on the server. The program can be downloaded from GAEA's website at:

The following steps occur during the installation:

- The Network License Monitor program is installed on your computer
- The Network License Manager service is installed.
- Shortcuts are placed on your Programs menu

##### 7.3.1.1.1 Starting the Service

After the network service has been installed on the server it needs to be started before it can be used. This is done automatically when the server is restarted or it can be done manually through the Windows Services Manager. To do it manually open the Services list from Administrative tools in the Windows Control Panel. Select the E-ASR License Manager in the Services list and then select Start.

#### 7.3.1.1.2 Uninstalling the Service

To uninstall the network service automatically, select Uninstall Network License Service from the application shortcuts on the Programs menu. The service will then be uninstalled the next time the server is restarted. To uninstall the service immediately, it needs to be stopped first and then uninstalled.

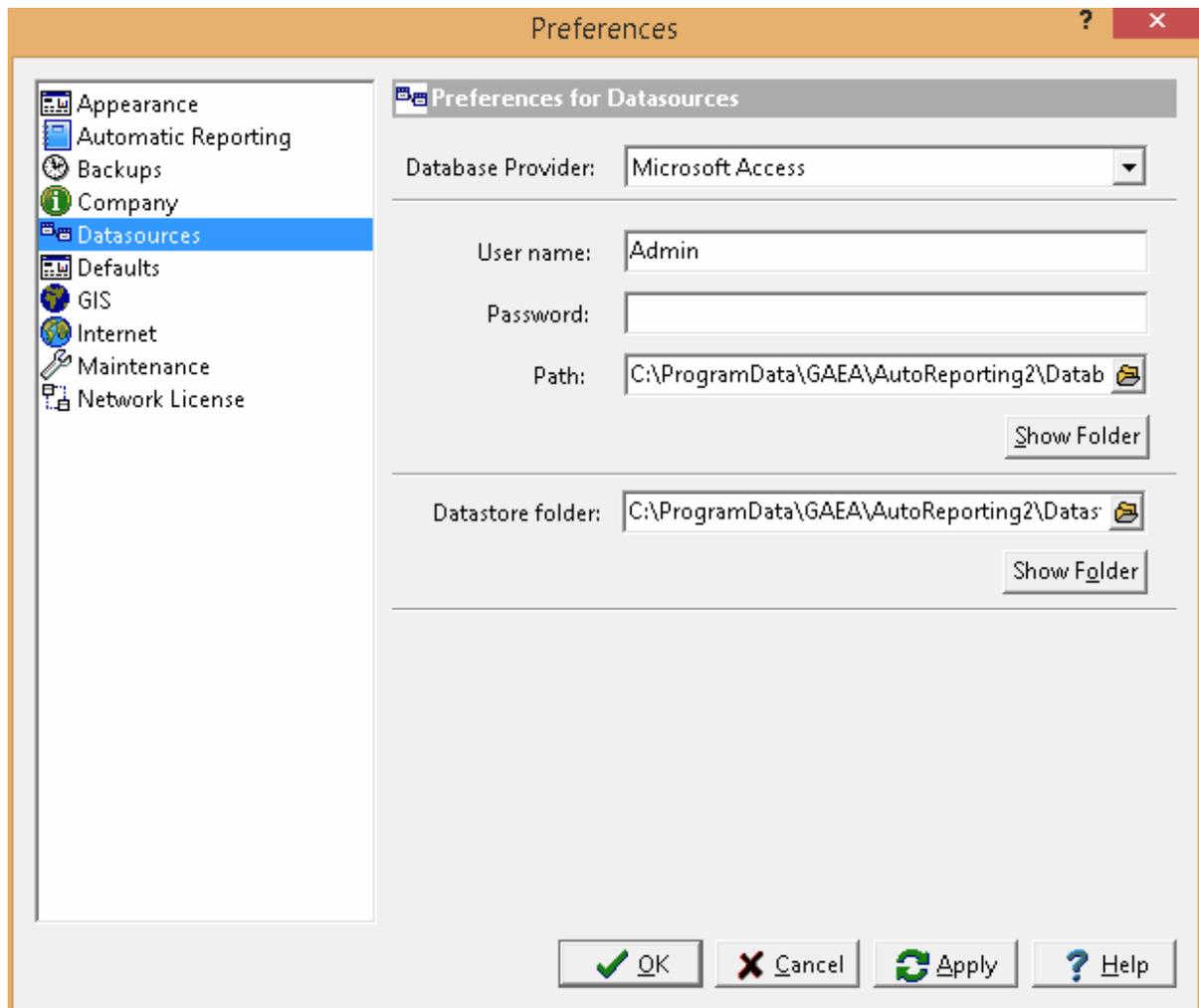
To stop the service, open the Services list from Administrative tools in the Windows Control Panel. Select the E-ASR License Manager in the Services list and then select Stop. Then uninstall the network service as described above.

#### 7.3.1.2 Client Installation

The installation of the application on a client is the same as the single user installation. The only difference from the single user installation is that the network option should be selected during the first-run setup stage of the program. In addition, after the databases and datastore have been installed on the server it is important not to overwrite them each time the application is installed on a client computer. To do this make sure you use the default database and datastore directories (on the local C drive) during program installation.

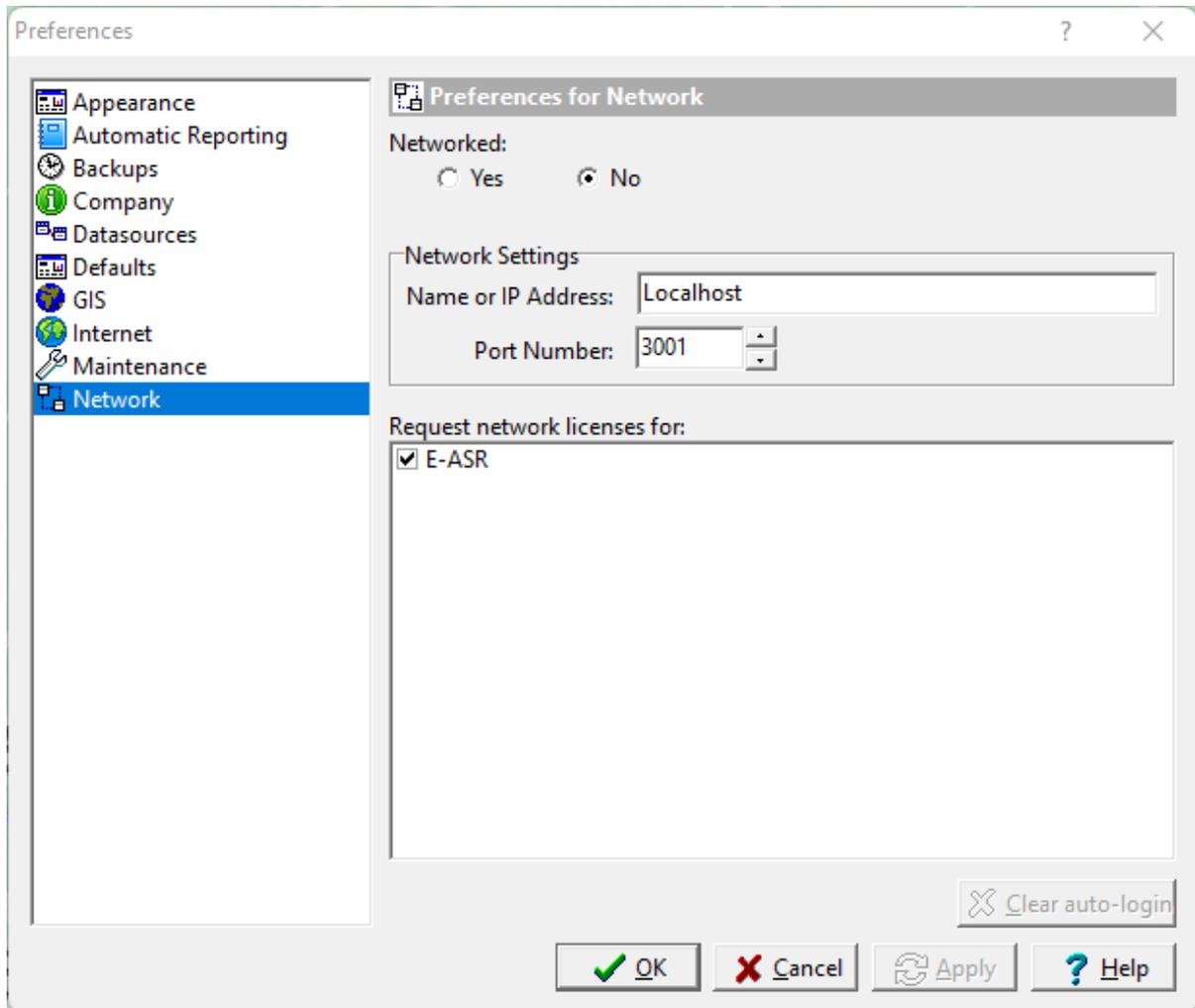
##### 7.3.1.2.1 Setting the Database and Datastore Folders

After the program has been installed on the client, the database and datastore folders need to be set to the server. To do this run the program and log in as an administrator (this option is not available to non-administrator users). Select *File > Preferences* and go to the Datasources tab. On this tab set the folder paths for the database and datastore to the ones on the server.



#### 7.3.1.2.2 Setting Network Options

If the network option was not selected during the installation on the client computer, then it can be set in the preferences for the application. Select *File > Preferences*, and select the Network License tab on the left.



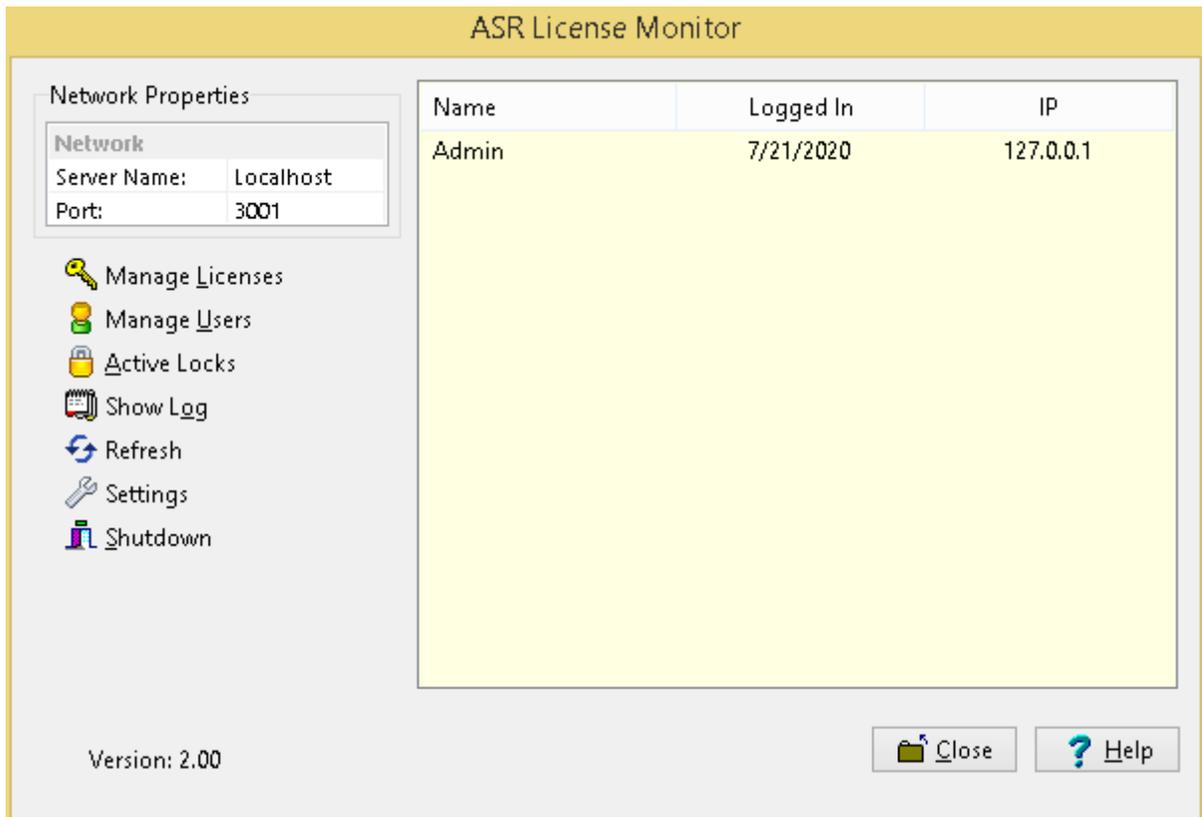
To get the licenses from the network, set Networked to yes and enter the network name or IP address. The port number should always be 3001 for the network. This information is displayed on the [Network Monitor](#) <sup>214</sup> form on the network. In the box below the network settings select the licenses to request from the network.

### 7.3.2 License Manager

The licensing of the application on a network is handled through a service called ASR License Manager and an application called ASR License Monitor. The service handles the logging in of users and grants license requests and has no user interface. The network monitor provides a user interface for adding/removing users and managing licenses.

When the ASR License Monitor is being run as a process the program icon will be displayed in the system tray. A popup menu can be displayed by right clicking on the program icon in the system tray. This menu can be used to display the network monitor form, manage licenses, manage users, show the network log, and shutdown the network monitor. Shutting down the network license manager will stop the network license manager process but will not stop the network service.

To display the network license monitor form double-click on the icon or select it from the popup menu.



On the right side of the Network License Monitor form a list of users that are currently logged into the program is displayed. And on the left side is a box displaying the network server name and port. These network properties are the ones required to be entered into the preferences of the application on client computers, as described in the section on [setting client network options](#)<sup>[51]</sup>. The port should always be 3001.

Below the Network Properties box are buttons for managing licenses, managing users, showing the network log, and adjusting settings. These buttons are described in the sections below. The close button will hide the monitor and put an icon in the system tray and the shutdown button will shutdown the monitor.

### 7.3.2.1 Manage Licenses

To use the application on client computers it must be licensed on the network. The application will run in demo mode on the client computers until the network is licensed. To manage the licenses for the application click on the Manage Licenses button on the License Monitor form, the License Manager form will be displayed.

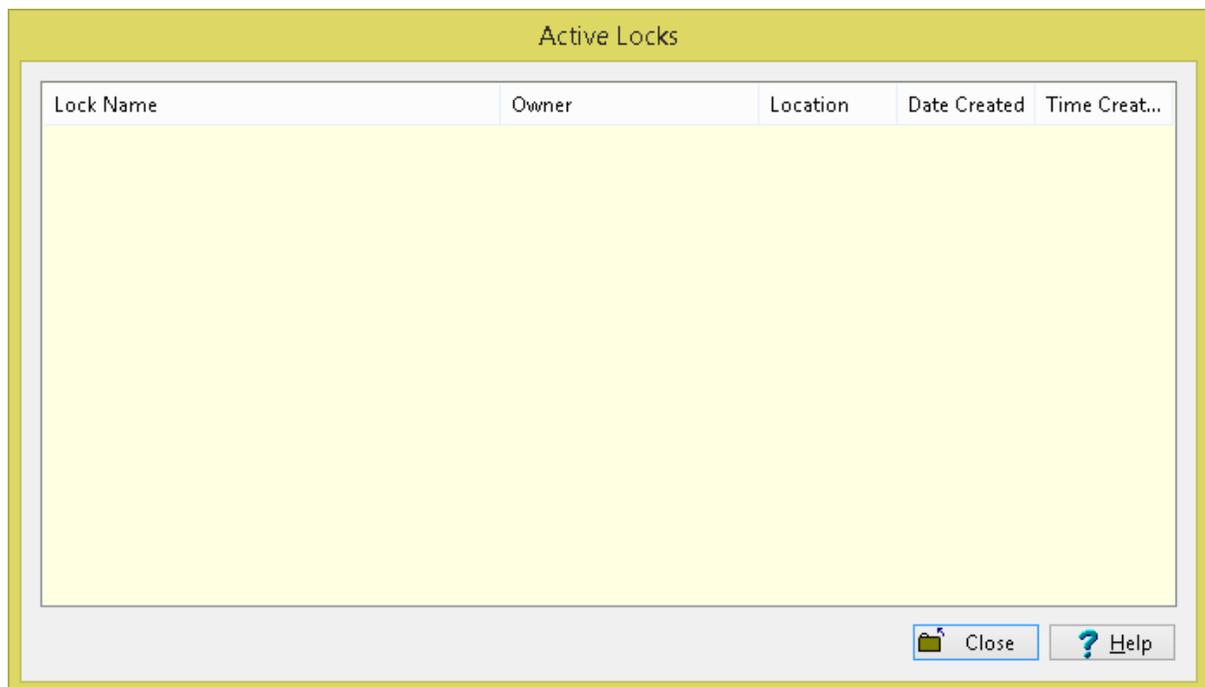

After the user accounts have been exported to a user data file, this file can be imported on the new server by clicking on the Import button at the top of the Manage Users form.

### 7.3.2.3 Active Locks

The licenses that are currently being used can be shown by clicking on the Active Locks button on the License Monitor form. The Active Locks form will display the license (lock name), owner (user), location (IP address) and the date and time the license was granted.

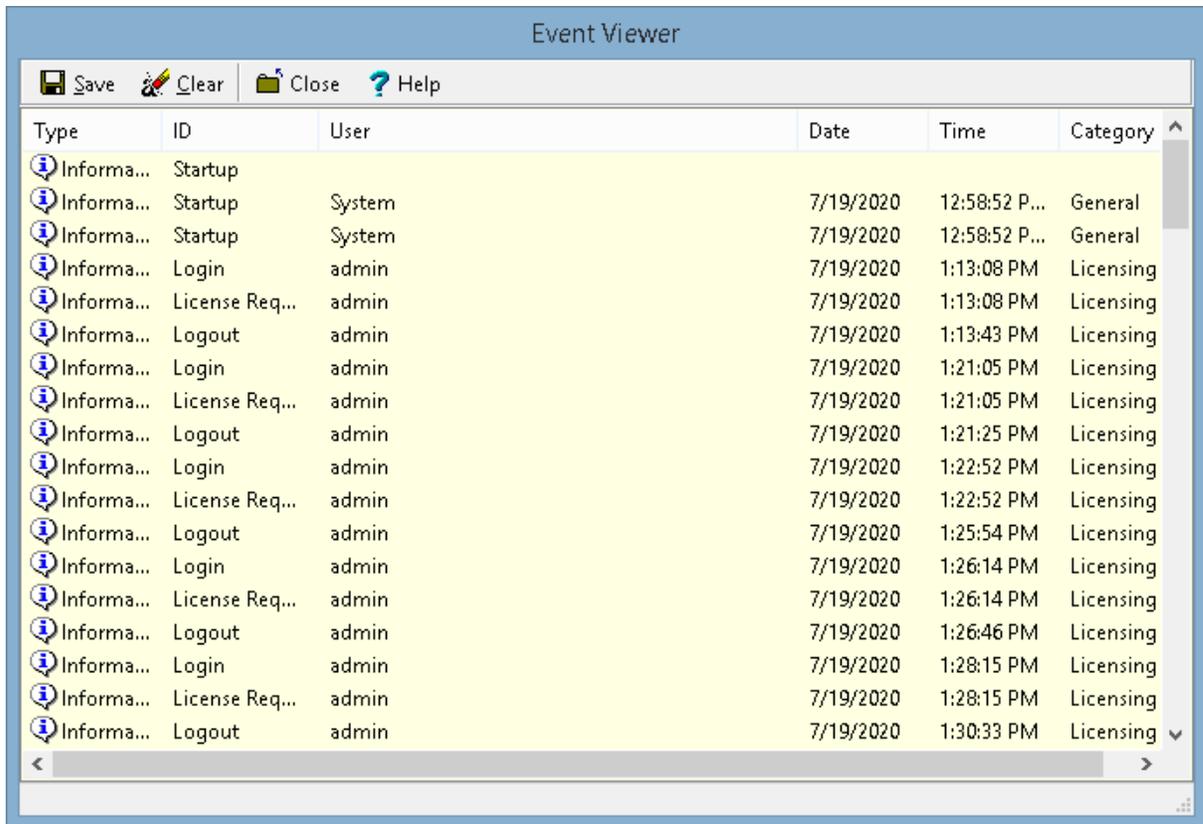

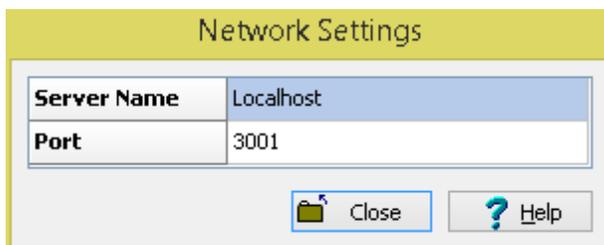
